

After retiring, Gentry moved to Charlevoix where he purchased the wellknown Lake Charlevoix Farm on Lake Charlevoix. His hard work ethic paid off again as he spent many hours fixing up the neglected property.

On November 29, 1997, Gentry and his wife, Amy-Lou "Roxie" were married. Their meeting was chance and destiny, as they met when her car broke down on the road in front of the farm. They were able to enjoy more than 25 years together, several of which were spent at the Lake Charlevoix Farm in the summer months and in Scottsdale in the winter.

Gentry and Roxie enjoyed many good times together, making memories while entertaining friends at the farm. He was an excellent cook and entertainer, and they enjoyed sharing that with others. They were particularly known for their corn parties at the lake and time around the beach house

He became well known in the Lake Charlevoix area for his annual entries in the Horton Bay parade, where he once ran for "Horton Bay King". Gentry enjoyed collecting

antiques, Farmall tractors, boating and spending time at the lake. His custom paddlewheel pontoon complete with a grill and a diving board was always a source of enjoyment. Women's Resource Center hires Counseling Director

Drader said she began her professional career by caring for women and children as a physician. She returned to school to obtain a Masters in Counseling and has gained considerable experience working at a nonprofit agency, in private practice and in the school setting

"Having lived in Petoskey for more than 20 years, I have admired the work of Women's Resource Center of Northern Michigan and its far-reaching and positive impact on our community," Drader said.

Drader said the Counseling and Advocacy Program

WRCNM has served northern Michigan communities since 1977 and is committed to equality, justice and the well-being of women. The organization provides programs and services to individuals impacted by domestic abuse, sexual assault, child abuse or child sexual assault, and offers education and employment, counseling, advocacy and children's educational services.



Appreciation and **Positive Energy Lead To Success**

Appreciation is both energy and a source of power, good power! It increases success and well-being. Appreciation is transformative!

The Power Of Appreciation, a book by Dr. Noelle Nelson and Jeannine LeMare Calaba is a source of important and helpful information.

I also recommend *The* No Complaining Rule by Jon Gordon. It's a simple, short, easy read, presented almost as a modern-day fable. The book presents trouble in a business, many employees talking behind backs, an atmosphere with negative energy, a lack of confidence and trust in the leadership, and management out of sync due to their own doubts and internal competition.

The business owner/CEO realizes the negativity, hears the behind the scenes complaining, and acknowledges that this is not a culture that will lead to long term suc-

The business owner places his trust in the head of Human Resources (HR). He asks her to quickly develop a plan to change the company's working environment. He gives her a tight deadline of the following Monday. The message is clear: this is urgent.

After great thought, Hope, the head of HR, outlines her ideas for solution and presents them to her business owner, who immediately gives his approval for implementation of her

Some of Hope's key principles are: A positive environment

and culture are everything; Positive leadership is essential;

We must relentlessly make our culture and our people a priority at all lev-

els; our people deliver our



results, we must focus on our people – asking, listening, helping; our employees and customers want to know that they can trust us and

that we

care about them;

We need positive communications, interactions, and conversations;

We need to listen to our people and we need to empower them;

And we need to become solution and innovation based.

Hope and her business owner implemented a No Complaining Rule. Yes, there are times when complaints are legitimate. So, the rule was complain only if you also offer a solution.

The book additionally offers an implementation action plan, explaining the cost of negativity and complaining, shows that there can be justified complaints accompanied by a possible solution, a complaint/solution process, a process for celebrating successes and suggests a kick off with the designation of a No Complaining Week.

In the book, the business transformed into a positive, high energy, solution-based culture, thanks to the new enthusiasm of their people and leadership.

Can one "turn on a switch" to increase her/his people's sense of appreciation and enthusiasm immediately? No, not instantly.

Can you "turn on a switch" to increase your own sense of appreciation, your own enthusiasm, become a spark plug, immediately? Yes, you sure can! You can make a positive difference for your business, starting today!

Rep. Borton takes aim at burdensome new deer reporting requirement

State Rep. Ken Borton and the Michigan House of Representatives today approved a plan to block a state order requiring hunters to report harvested deer to the Department of Natural Resources within 72 hours.

House Bill 6354, which Borton co-sponsored, would prevent the Natural Resources Commission from requiring hunters to report harvested deer.

'The unelected Natural Resources Commission has again issued ridiculous new burdens on Michigan hunters," said Borton, R-Gaylord. "Numerous Michiganders take to the woods every year to try to bag a deer, and new online reporting requirements with criminal penalties are unreasonable. Our plan will get rid of these unnec-

essary reporting requirements and relieve the burden on deer hunters in Northern Michigan and around the state."

Michigan's Natural Resources Commission in June adopted an order to require hunters to report deer kills within 72 hours of retrieval or before transferring the deer to another person. Through the DNR's online system, hunters must report the date of the kill, exact harvest location, antler points, type of deer, kill tag license number. and hunter's date of birth. Violations of wildlife conservation orders are misdemeanors and may be punished by up to 90 days imprisonment and a \$500 fine.

The plan now advances to the Senate for consideration.

Join LTC staff and others who simply love and appreciate old, native forests as we celebrate the Oden Island Nature Preserve becoming the fifth Michigan forest to join the Old-Growth Forest Network. Oden Island Nature Preserve is in the homelands of the Anishinaabe peoples and is located 9 miles east of the city of Petoskey. This 50-acre forested natural area protects nearly a mile of frontage on Crooked Lake. The forests on the preserve are mature and contain many large trees, especially eastern hemlocks, white pine, and some large sugar maples. There have not been any timber harvests since the 1950's, according to aerial imagery, and it has likely been much longer since any logging has occurred, and some trees might even predate the logging boom of the late 1800's. Portions of the forest in the Oden Island Nature Preserve approach old-growth forest characteristics. A successful fundraising effort in 2000 resulted in the Conservancy's purchase of this large, undeveloped waterfront property, closing the door on development proposed for the site. The preserve protects a valuable shoreline forest that helps keep the water clean for swimming, boating, and fishing on Crooked Lake. Four Months Post Tornado Housing Shortage Worsens

The Refuge, Otsego County's solution to homelessness is gearing up for their traditional fall and winter season, October thru May. However, nothing has been traditional about their services over the past few years considering the pandemic and tornado. The Refuge houses homeless individuals in local hotels when they are in a crisis. Regarding tornado relief: 34 households have received services from The Refuge, 92 people-70 adults and 22 children under 18 and 29 of those households received financial help with temporary housing. Chris Czajkowski, the Refuge Case Manager noted they usually help an average of 55-60 persons over the eight months they are open.

'There are six tornado families living in campers," said Erin Mann, Disaster Recovery Coordinator. "This is heartbreaking after all the suffering these individuals have been through. But I want to remind our community that our solution to homelessness during the months of June thru September is giving people tents and telling them where they can camp. We were in dire

straits before, and the happenings of May 20 intensified this already

horrendous situation." Almost four months after the tornado there are still families displaced by the disaster living in hotels, campers, with friends or family, or homes still in need of repairs. However, The Refuge has transitioned their clients out of local hotels. There is hope on the horizon as Otsego Antrim Habitat for Humanity (OAHH) wraps up their work in Nottingham Forest, the manufactured home hit by the tornado.

"Healing is happening. At Nottingham, individuals are relieved that their trailers are leveled and tied down thanks to Habitat. Many are still experiencing trauma from the event, there's a long road ahead, but there are still moments of joy as people recover in some ways," said Czajkowski.

Since the Gaylord tornado did not qualify as a Federal Emergency Management Agency disaster there were no options for temporary housing provided by the government. The only solution was hotels or people finding their own housing. With support of local hotels, Czajkowski was successful in getting disaster survivors into hotels, despite the challenges of high rates during the summer tourist months but there needs to be a more permanent solution to the lack of affordable housing. "Nights and mornings are getting cold, and it is only September. There are eight families or individuals camping or sleeping in their car that are not tornado survivors. When the Refuge reopens October 1, those people will be knocking on my door and I am nervous on how we are going to house them plus the survivors beyond hotels," said Czaikowski.

The destruction has only compounded the lack of housing. At least three rental units in Gaylord, not including Nottingham Forest were demolished or suffered damages by the tornado. One of those landlords is not rebuilding. Waiting lists at low-income apartments are long and rental prices are increasingly unaffordable. Because of this the Otsego County Economic Alliance (OCEA) is completing a housing assessment.

"Otsego County Eco-

nomic Alliance has been working proactively to address our community's housing needs and has hired an independent housing consultant to conduct an extensive housing assessment for Otsego County that will be completed by mid-October 2022. With this detailed data we will be able to effectively proceed with new housing developments that are successfully addressing Otsego County's housing challenges," said Lisa McComb, OCEA Executive Director.

The National Low Housing Coalition reports that across Michigan, there is a shortage of rental homes affordable and available to extremely low-income households (ELI), whose incomes are at or below the poverty guideline or 30% of their area median income (AMI). Many of these households are severely cost burdened, spending more than half of their income on housing. Severely cost burdened poor households are more likely than other renters to sacrifice other necessities like healthy food and healthcare to pay the rent, and to experience unstable hous-

ing situations like evic-

tions. ALICE (asset limited, income constrained, employed) data put out by the Michigan Association of United Ways, in 2019 reported the average monthly cost of housing in Otsego County for a family of four was \$766. Three years later, Czajkowski is now seeing housing for a family of four around \$ 1,500 a month. The Refuge has been

able to house tornado survivors via the Otsego Community Foundation Tornado Relief Fund and the Muzyl Fund, the Otsego County United Way, local organizations and individuals and monies previously fundraised by The Refuge. The projected total cost The Refuge has spent assisting survivors is \$128,000. If you would like to donate to the Refuge, please visit www.otsegorefuge.org/donate.

Boswell Field in East Jordan celebrates 30 years

The original side of Boswell field was at the current community park. This large tract of land had originally been used as the Charlevoix County fairgrounds. In the late 19th century, county residents frequented the area each fall to celebrate a bountiful

By the late 1940s the local high school team, the Red Devils, had established themselves as a force on the gridiron under the leadership of future college and NFL coach Dan Divine. East Jordan went undefeated in 1948 and 1949. Coach Divine left East Jordan in 1950, But by 1955 , the East Jordan board of education purchased the fairground property from Charlevoix County for athletic purposes. It then became the home to East Jordan Red Devil football and track.

It was in the fall of 1962 that the field was given its iconic name Boswell field. The board of education named the field after Greg Boswell, who's personal interest, and effort for East Jordan sports ,stood out and the board wanted to recognize his outstanding service, by naming the field after him.

Some years later, a tornado took off the original covered portion of the grand stands. The community rallied together to rebuild the structure to its new found glory. Fast forward to the 1980s and the facility had become worn down and it was clear a new stadium would be needed.

A location behind the high school was chosen and with a gift from the city of East Jordan of additional property. The East Jordan Schools superintendent, Chip Hanson was tasked with and completed at a construction pace never seen before on such a scale. The complex was entirely constructed with funds from the Malpass

foundation.
On October 2nd 1992
Over 2000 people attended
the inaugural event. With
the fall colors in full bloom
surrounding the complex,
it is regarded as one of
Michigan's finest facilities,
designed by MC Smith Associates architectural

group.
Remarkably, two of East
Jordan's legendary
coaches have been enshrined into football halls
of fame. After leaving East
Jordan in 1950 for Michigan State University, coach
Divine eventually became
the head coach at Arizona
State and later University



of Missouri, before embarking on a 4 year stint as head coach of the NFL's Green Bay Packers. He returned to the college ranks at Notre Dame where his 1977 team won the national championship. He retired in 1980 and was elected to the college football Hall of

Fame in 1985.
East Jordan is also proud to have had semi pro hall-of-famer Frank Holes lead the Red Devils. Coach Holes led the Red Devils in East Jordan during the 1970s and eighties. He was inducted into the semi- pro minor league Hall of Fame as a player, on June 7th

2022 in Canton, Ohio.

The evening was special for so very many reasons.
This evening gave the community a chance to thank, not only not only those responsible for creating such an incredible place, a place for the students and community to participate in such a myriad of events and activities, but those that began this process, came back to cele-

brate it. All of them.



Closing Checklist Tip #1: Retain Executed Seller Disclosures, Purchase Contract and Addendums

Ordinance No. 3 of 2022

AN ORDINANCE TO DESIGNATE AN ENFORCING AGENCY TO DISCHARGE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF NORWOOD TOWNSHIP. CHARLEVOIX COUNTY, MICHIGAN AND TO DESIGNATE REGULATED FLOOD HAZARD AREAS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE CON-STRUCTION CODE ACT, ACT NO. 230 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1972, AS AMENDED.

THE TOWNSHIP OF NORWOOD, CHARLEVOIX COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:

Section 1. Agency Designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of the state construction code, in accordance with Section 8b(6) of Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, the Charlevoix County Building Official is hereby designated as the enforcing agency to discharge the responsibility of Norwood Township, Charlevoix County, Michigan under Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended.
