Northern Michigan winters are a challenge for everyone but especially our aging adults.

Slippery sidewalks and driveways in addition to the cold weather can cause a wide range of injuries and illnesses. Here are some tips to get you through the next few months.

Falls are a daily challenge for some of our aging adults and in the winter time these fall chances increase dramatically. Avoid slipping on the ice by making sure you wear shoes with good traction and non-skid soles if you have to go out. Be sure to replace a worn cane tip and walker pads too. Remember to take your snowy shoes off as soon as you go inside because as the snow melts it can leave water that becomes a slippery condition inside.

As cold temperatures can lead to frostbite and hypothermia dress warmly and in layers. Be sure to cover exposed skin with hats, gloves and scarves. You can even use your scarf to cover your mouth and protect your lungs from extreme cold.

Wintertime depression is also a concern as we all tend to go out less often, especially our aging adults. This can breed feelings of loneliness and isolation. Though family members can check on their aging family members, aging adults can also arrange a check in system with neighbors and friends where each person looks in on one another daily either in person or by phone.

If you have to go out and are considering driving, understand that your car needs to be as ready as you are. Be sure to get your care serviced before wintertime hits making

sure the oil, tires, battery and wipers are in good shape for the winter roads. Also, make sure you have antifreeze in your washer fluid and check the weather report beforehand to avoid driving in the worst winter conditions. Our aging adults may not drive as regularly as when they were younger and their reflexes may not be as quick as they once were so be sure to let someone know where you are going and when you will be back if you need to go out and avoid driving when possible by taking public transportation.

As a reminder, you don't have to go out to get meals from the Senior Centers each day. We have Meals that can purchased in advance and they include a hot meal and 6 frozens a week. These like our other meals are available for a \$3.00 donation for all Charlevoix County Aging Adults 60 years old and older.

The COA is also partnering with Transit to help you order your groceries and get them delivered to your door set. Call Charlevoix County Transit for more information on this great new service. Transit will also pick up your prescriptions for you too!

# 2022-23 SENIOR RESIDENTIAL SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM IS STILL OPEN FOR **ENROLLMENT!**

This program provides limited support for Snow Removal though an income gualifying voucher system only for seniors, 60 years of age and older, who are full-time Charlevoix County residents/homeowners.

VOUCHERS: Each Voucher holds a value of \$40.00. The number of vouchers issued to the household is dependent upon the 2022 Federal Poverty Guidelines (See Boxed Information Below). Proof (i.e. latest Income Tax Reporting Form 1040 or 1040A) of total household income is required. Once the COA receives a completed Snow Removal Self Declaration Form, proof of residency, and proof of income, vouchers will be mailed to the qualified participating senior household.

ENROLLMENT: Enrollment begins Monday, October 17, 2022 & ends on Friday, December 30, 2022 or until the budget has been expended.

Program Rules: Program starts November 1, 2022 and ends March 31, 2023. Participating contractors will be required to complete a W9 before payment of services unless the County already has one on file.\*

Seniors 60 years or older who are full-time Charlevoix County residents/homeowners must complete the Snow Removal Self Declaration Form, return it to the Charlevoix County COA along with the latest Income Tax Reporting Form 1040 or 1040A as proof of total household income and proof of residency in the form of a copy of property taxes or rental agreement. Verbal agreements are not valid. Number of vouchers awarded will be dependent upon the 2022 Federal Poverty Guidelines and the Commission on Aging's Sliding Voucher Scale outlined below.

Any lost, stolen or misplaced vouchers are the sole responsibility of the participating senior household and there will NOT be any replacement vouchers issued by the Charlevoix County Commission on Aging.

Persons knowingly providing false information related to total household income or residency will have services discontinued and will be requested to repay COA for monies spent on their services.

Vouchers can be used towards snow removal (Shoveling, Snow blowing or Snowplowing) costs between 11/1/22 – /31/23 by any contractor the senior chooses and towards any bill for services that the senior chooses within that time period.

The participating senior must include the vouchers with the contractor's bill and submit it to the Charlevoix County COA for payment directly to the contractor for the amount of the Vouchers included. Any snow removal cost above and beyond the voucher amount is the responsibility of the senior.

The COA will not be responsible for any liability or property damage associated with snow removal or any costs above and beyond the provided vouchers value that is accrued by the participating senior.

# Serving Up Safe Buffets - by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration

Entertaining is one of the mainstays of the holiday season and helps commemorate milestone events throughout the year, too. With proper preparation, you can be creative and tempt your party guests with an array of fun platters while still keeping food safety in mind!

## **Size Matters**

If you're planning a buffet at home and are not sure how quickly the food will be eaten, keep buffet serving portions small.

Prepare a number of small platters and dishes ahead of time, and replace the serving dishes with the fresh ones throughout the party.

Store cold back-up dishes in the refrigerator and keep hot dishes in the oven set at 200 °F to 250 °F prior to serving. This way, your late arriving guests can safely enjoy the same appetizing arrangements as the early arrivals.

## **Take Temperatures**

Hot foods should be kept at an internal temperature of 140 °F or warmer. Use a food thermometer to check. Serve or keep food hot in chafing dishes, slow cookers, and warming trays. Be aware that some warmers only hold food at 110 °F to 120 °F, so check the product label to make sure your warmer has the capability to hold foods at 140 °F or warmer. This is the temperature that's required to keep bacteria at bay! Eggs and egg dishes, such as quiches or soufflés, may be refrigerated for serving later but

should be thoroughly reheated to 165 °F before serving.

# **Chill Out**

Cold foods should be kept at 40 °F or colder. Keep cold foods refrigerated until serving time. If food is going to stay out on the buffet table longer than 2 hours, place plates of cold food on ice to retain

the chill.
