Leadership Charlevoix County (LCC) and Top of Michigan Trails Council (TOMTC) are rolling out a safe new way for bikers and outdoor recreation enthusiasts to connect our communities.

Tasked with completing a community service project that will better Charlevoix County while developing leadership skills, LCC class participants decided to hit the trails - the Boyne Valley Trail and Boyne City to Charlevoix Trail that is. Over the next few months, LCC participants will be working with Top of Michigan Trails Council to develop a trail connector route linking these fantastic trails together to provide users a safe route through downtown Boyne City.

"We really wanted to make a tangible impact in our community and were really excited when Top of Michigan Trails Council reached out to us with this project idea" said LCC participant Erin Miedema of EJ. # Camp Grayling's Excellence Doesn't **Necessitate Such Drastic Expansion**

As someone who has served both in the military and in Congress, I've taken an oath to uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States. As part of that oath, I've sworn to provide for the common defense and promote the general welfare. It is easy to walk the line when those two policy areas coincide but when they conflict, it's a political minefield.

The proposed expansion of Camp Grayling has preaictably lea to concerns by local community groups, government officials, and constituents. The concerns are completely understandable and must be tackled with a measured and nonpartisan approach to ensure that neither component national security nor public welfare — is jeopardized.

I'm proud that Michigan's First District is home to our country's largest National Guard training facility, contributing to the overall readiness and effectiveness of our military. Let's be totally clear: I fully understand the importance of training for agility, adaptability, and lethality — it's a passion that I bring to Congress every day. That's why I've fought and successfully secured funding and other resources for Camp Grayling. These efforts have helped foster critical components in our military training and readiness and are necessary to provide for the common defense.

During a time of heightened threats to our homeland, nobody in good faith would call for scaling back Camp Grayling's current footprint or make any efforts to prevent them from training properly.

However, that's not the question at hand.

On more than one occasion we've seen government entities — federal, state and even local — overstep the bounds of realistic needs. We don't have to look very far to see government entities, many with good intentions, that have expanded beyond their intended scope of operation. In Northern Michigan, we are seeing this play out before our eyes as the State of Michigan seeks to more than double the size of Camp Grayling with a proposed lease of 162,000 additional acres of state-owned land across several counties. Nearly every township and county impacted by this proposed expansion has formally come out against the proposal, clearly articulating their rationale for opposing the lease. It should be noted

that this level of agreement

is nearly impossible to find

today among elected officials.

Camp Grayling is woven into the fabric of the Northern Michigan community — and for generations it has enjoyed broad support while providing jobs to residents and being an economic driver for the region. However, the current widespread opposition to the proposed expansion will strain the relationship between Grayling and the surrounding communities.

Meanwhile it's my belief, and the belief of many First District constituents, that the proposal has yet to be adequately justified, and at a minimum should be rightsized to reflect reality. Given the existing acreage and airspace — particularly the underutilized components - this massive expansion effort has left constituents with more questions than answers.

## DNR tips for 'stress free' snowy owl viewing

Each winter, Michiganders get a chance to glimpse the large, magnificent snowy owl - and this species' appearance across the state attracts a lot of attention. However, it's important to remember that winter tends to be a stressful time for birds like the snowy owl.

Snowy owls spend most of their year in the Arctic tundra, far away from humans and urban landscapes. When they travel to populated areas in the winter, these new places present unfamiliar threats like curious humans, rodent poison, and vehicle and power line collisions.

Moreover, they often do not display signs of fear toward humans. This can sometimes get them into harmful situations.

Keep the best interests of these majestic creatures in mind. Here are a few quick tips for viewing snowy owls to keep them stress-free and safe:

Give snowy owls space. A

good rule of thumb is to view wildlife from a distance, using binoculars or a scope, rather than approaching. If you "flush" an owl, or cause it to move to a new area, you are too close and need to back away or leave. Even if the bird doesn't seem to display signs of fear, it can still be scared

and stressed by your pres-

Don't lure owls with audio recordings. While it might be tempting to use audio recordings to attract snowy owls closer to you. hearing another owl's call — even a recorded one can be stressful for the bird. Snowy owls are solitary and

territorial, and the call of another bird can put them on high alert.

Leave &quot:live baiting" to the pros. Scientists and wildlife rehabbers use live bait like mice to entice owls for banding, relocation and rehabilitation. However, this practice can be dangerous

for owls when it's done by photographers, birders, or others. Baited owls learn to associate people with food, and may be drawn to dangerous places - like roads or airports - to find humans.

Submit your eBird observations to scientists but keep them hidden from the public. To prevent large gatherings of people and limit disturbing snowy owls, keep your observations private.

By keeping these tips in mind, you can help snowy owls safely enjoy their wintering grounds here in Michigan.

They had had an enthusiastic conversation just after Annemarie was elected to the Charlevoix County Board of Commissioners this past November. I had heard a lot of very favorable reports about her and now I understand just how important her leadership and drive will be to our area.

We met over coffee at Harwood Gold and nearly everyone who came in smiled and had a warm "hi" for Annemarie. Clearly, they like and respect her (with good reason).

As background, Annemarie grew up in Kalamazoo, attended high school and college there, and obtained her teaching degree. Her husband, Pat, is also a teacher. Both are at Charlevoix High School and have been for 28 years now.

of Michigan graduate and another who will graduate from there in 2024.

Annemarie feels strongly that we are in a beautiful and loving community and she is devoted to help our area in every way she can, and especially with our affordable housing needs, which was the basis of her campaign for election to the County Board of Commissioners.

The need for affordable housing has been talked about and talked about for at least 20 years now, and little action has taken place, at least in Charlevoix. We must move forward addressing this - with action, not just words. It is critically important for our businesses and schools. We all should understand this and be willing to make sacrifices - for the good of our Charlevoix community! Nearly half our students are on subsidized lunch programs as their families have limited income, and

many more are just one unfortunate event such as loss of a job from homelessness.

Annemarie has a passion for our community. She is a doer, very positive, and is always thinking. I am excited that she is a Commissioner. I believe she will make a difference and I do expect positive results!

How is this for being a doer – a great interest of Annemarie is politics, here in the U.S. and elsewhere. She has led trips for our students to Lansing, and to numerous presidential inaugurations in D.C. as well as trips to London, Cuba, Scotland, and Greece is next, in 2024.

A goal of Annemarie is to stay informed and also to be sure to keep us informed as well, believing that our residents will support what is best for our community and be ready to take action.

Kev issues under consideration currently are whether county departments be moved to the

Shirley Roloff Center on the north side of Charlevoix, which could free up space to help with our housing needs, as well as how to best use the K Mart parking area on M-66.

Annemarie cares deeply, and I mean very deeply, about our students and their future and is an active advocate for dual enrollment, e.g., college credit courses during their high school years, helping make college more affordable for those wanting to continue advancing in their education. She also seeks to establish local internship and apprenticeship opportunities to link students with area businesses.

Without a doubt, Charlevoix County is a better community because of Annemarie Conway, and good things will continue to happen for our students and very likely for our affordable and obtainable housing needs.



# Jim White donates life-saving Defibrillators to area churches

Jim White of Boyne City Hardware purchased 12 Automatic External Defibrillators so that every church in Boyne City, Boyne Falls, Walloon Lake and Horton Bay would have one by Sunday.

Boyne City Hardware and the American Legion will also get one. Only five churches previously had an AED. At the same time. they helped Bay Township purchase an AED for their hall with an outdoor cabinet so they can make their AED available to the Horton Bay Church next door and eventually be available to anyone on the proposed bike trail next to their hall.

The AED recipients came to the Eagles Lodge Friday to pick up their AEDs and wall cabinets.

Boyne City EMS Director Brenda Willson and paramedic Amanda Mathers gave everyone an AED demonstration.

Jim said "I hope this will encourage more AEDs to be purchased so no one dies of a cardiac arrest at church or shopping or working at or near Boyne City Hardware or the American Legion. They might never get used, but that would be the good news to me. After seeing (NFL player) Damar Hamlin on the news every day, I started thinking we should have one at our store. We have over 100,000 shoppers in our store every year and over 17,000 employee work hours. The Eagles already had one, so I thought of the American Legion then all the churches. I think it will make our city safer and could encourage our major employers to get one if they don't have one already."

## The Veteran of the month of March 2023 is William S. "Bill" Frykberg

Born March 8, 1921 in West Hoboken New Jersey to parents William Samuel and Kathrine Anderson Frykberg. He grew up in Hackensack New Jersey with five siblings. Following high school graduation, Bill worked as a journeyman toolmaker and die setter for the Bendix Aviation Corporation in Bendix New Jersey. On March 16, 1944 he enlisted into the United States Army Air Force, and after basic training he received instruction as a gunner in a P61 aircraft known as the Black Widow. After the war he returned home to work in the family bakery business in New Jersey, and would later marry Virginia Walker. They would be blessed with two children. Virginia died in 1959. Bill would continue working at the bakery until his retirement in 1983. In 1965 Bill would meet and marry Jeanne Moberg in Passaic, New Jersey. Together they enjoyed traveling and eventually moving to

San Diego, California, the area Bill fell in love with during his Military Service. He was an avid golfer and played many courses throughout the United States. He loved music and the Big Band sound and with dancing lessons Bill honed his dancing skills. Upon the death of his wife Jeanne in 2002. Bill moved to Boyne City to live with his son Randy and daughter-in-law Diane. Here he became active in the Boyne Valley Garden Club, becoming a Master Gardener. He was often seen riding his beloved John Deere tractor around the city deadheading flowers, or doing vard work at home or at the Greenhouse. Enjoying friends at the Boyne Area Senior Center, being gentlemanly as he was, he had a smile and a kiss for each lady, along with a dance whenever there was music. Bill was an avid reader and enjoyed being a part of the Boyne Area Senior Steppers getting exercise line dancing. On May 7, 2011, William S. "Bill" Frykberg answered the final call and is being honored by his son Randy, daughter-in-law Diane, and family.



# Local High School Aviation Program Helping to Tackle the Nationwide Aviation Industry Pilot Shortage

PELLSTON – Airline delays and cancellations have become increasingly common recently as a nationwide and global pilot shortage continues to strain the airline industry. It's projected that 14,500 pilots will be needed every year through 2030, along with tens of thousands of other personnel like technicians and airline crew, according to the U.S. Bureau of

Labor Statistics.
A program hosted by Alanson
Public Schools and housed at Pellston Regional Airport is teaching
students the skills they need to become pilots and aircraft technicians, sending them skyward with
piloting credentials and the ability
to jet into the workforce in these
high-demand careers.

The Aviation Science and Technology, a Career and Technical Education program through Char-Em Intermediate School District, has been exposing students to varied aviation careers for the past 7 years. Started under former Alanson superintendent and private pilot Dean Paul in 2016, the program began with 13 students, four of whom are currently pursuing aviation careers. Current Alanson superintendent Rachelle Cook has the program firing on all cylinders this year under new teacher Duane Enos, a retired Marine heli-

copter pilot.

Aviation Science and Technology is a two-year high school program (for juniors and seniors) that explores various career opportunities in the field of aviation, including pilot. It also emphasizes the many different applications of STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) in the field.

Instructor Enos said: "We use flight simulators, textbooks, magazine articles, real world situations, guest speakers and other appropriate information. Our primary book is the FAA's 'Pilot's Handbook of Aeronautical Knowledge.' We also have numerous handouts, videos and other applicable re-

The class curriculum standards are generated from the FAA and the Michigan Department of Education, Office of Career and Technological Education. With classes held at Pellston, a real working airport, students also get firsthand experience in fast-moving aviation career fields. Six of the 11 current students are pursuing piloting, while five others are exploring other technical careers. Anna VarnHagen, current aviation class student and Civil Air Patrol cadet, recently flew solo in an aircraft, flying by herself only months after entering the program. Five other students are waiting in the wings to repeat the same feat soon.

to repeat the same feat soon.
According to industry and U.S. government statistics, through 2030 commercial airline pilot hiring should grow 13%, with mechanics at 6% and flight attendants at 21%. Collectively, that totals close to 50,000 well-pay-

ing jobs in the next 8-10 years.

The local aviation community is rallying its support for the program, said Gus Serra, chairman of the Char-Em ISD Aviation Advisory Committee. "We have a number of programs and community aviation groups that play important roles in developing our young people's interest in aviation, which can ultimately lead to helping solve the airline worker shortage," Serra said.

He pointed to the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) and the Civil Air Patrol in particular as piquing children's interest in flight. Through the EAA, 200 local children receive free airplane

rides every year in Pellston, Boyne City, Harbor Springs and Mackinac Island. "For many, this is their first flight ever," Serra noted, "and it might even be the spark that launches a career."

Students interested in flying who cannot fit the aviation program into their high school schedules can find mentors with the Civil Air Patrol who teach leadership, character development and aerospace education to young adults. Serra added.

The CAP is a United States Air Force auxiliary program that trains pilots to respond to local and national emergencies, conducts search and rescue missions, offers a youth (12-18 years old) leadership program, and is also tasked by Congress to manage and assist with aerospace education. The MI-031 Squadron currently consists of one airplane, 12 cadets, and 12 adult members. CAP members are available to speak to groups or classrooms about aviation topics. Interested educators can also learn more through the CAP AEM (Aerospace Education Member for K-12) and ACE (Aerospace Connections in Education for K-6). We must realize that we are responsible for helping our people. This is leadership. We need to prioritize responding to our team members. Our promptness enables them to do better work, including serving our customers.

appreciated and valued. that they are heard, and that their ideas matter. If we do not get right back to our people, they feel we are disrespecting them.

If we receive an email, call or request and we're swamped, we can respond ASAP, briefly explain, and ask if we can get back this afternoon, tomorrow or whenever is our first chance. Our timely response is important - and appropriate!

The Boyne City men's basketball team played against Traverse City on Tuesday, February 28.




## EAST JORDAN
