Both members have a vast knowledge in boater safety and open water survival techniques with a passion to teach. I could not think of a better duo. We look forward to continuing our support in any future activities."

Ms. Ashley Potter, parent and chaperone for Charlevoix St. Mary's second graders, enthusiastically commented, "This is an amazing program that builds kids' confidence in the water. I see improvements right away; those who were nervous about getting into the water or putting their faces in the water, built up their confidence quickly. Knowing how to swim is an essential

skill, especially since we live on the Great Lakes."

This past year, the CACP served nearly 4,000 pool users during 15,109 pool visits, and over 450 children benefitted from swim lessons and water safety classes. The Chicago Club has donated funds to provide free Learn to Swim classes for students who attend Charlevoix schools.

Members of the Pool Board are unpaid community volunteers. They and their full-time Pool Facility Manager, Kathy Klimas, work with part-time lifeguards, desk staff, and dozens of volunteers to serve Charlevoix and nearby townships and cities. The annual pool budget is comprised of revenues from user swim fees, local taxes, individual donations, grants from community and private foundations, and fund-raising events.

2022, the victim of a sexual assault contacted law enforcement requesting an investigation be re-opened. The Michigan Children's Protective Services initiated the investigation in 2012 after a mandated reporter notified them of the alleged sexual assaults. The suspect, now 44-year-old Sean Michael Russell from East Jordan, was interviewed by state troopers and subsequently arrested later that year. The Charlevoix County Prosecutor at the time ultimately moved for nolle prosequi of the charges and the

case was dismissed. A trooper from the Michigan State Police (MSP) Gaylord Post re-opened the complaint in September 2022 at the victim's request. The investigation led to charges being issued by the current prosecutor in Charlevoix County. Russell was arrested at his residence on February 28, 2023, and numerous electronic devices were seized during the arrest. Russell was lodged in the Charlevoix County Jail.

Russell was arraigned today in the 90th District Court in Charlevoix County on one count Criminal Sexual Conduct First Degree (Victim Under 13), and one count Criminal Sexual Conduct First Degree, and one Criminal Sexual Conduct Second Degree. He was given a \$25,000 PR bond. His next scheduled court appearance is on April 4, 2023.

Nonprofits encouraged to apply for \$35M fund to help more Michiganders make ends meet

Michigan's nonprofits who are struggling with the negative impacts and hardships of the COVID-19 pandemic can now take the first step to receive much needed funding from the \$35 million MI Nonprofit Relief Fund for serving their hard-hit communities.

The Michigan Nonprofit Association (MNA) and the Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity (LEO) today announced the launch of the "intent to apply" phase for the relief fund, which is focused on assisting small charitable nonprofit organizations. Nonprofits can fill out the intent to apply at MiNonprofitRelief.org. MNA membership is not required to apply.

The bipartisan relief program was signed by Gov. Gretchen Whitmer as part of FY23 budget and program funding comes from the federal Coronavirus Relief Funds awarded to the State of Michigan as part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The relief fund, designed for small nonprofits, is part of a twopart grant program. An ad-

ditional \$15 million in grants will be available to larger nonprofits later this year.

MNA and LEO have partnered to design the grant program and select grantees as well as manage the application portal and award payments. To be eligible for this funding, organizations must be a Michigan-based, 501(c)(3) nonprofit or a fiscally sponsored project by a 501(c)(3).

The \$35 million MI Nonprofit Relief Fund, which is being administered by MNA, is designed to provide aid and recovery to nonprofits with annual revenues of less than \$1 million that can demonstrate necessary expenditures and/or losses incurred after March 3, 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Small nonprofits could receive one-time grant funds from \$5,000 to \$25,000 in Spring/Summer 2023 to continue or expand their services to areas hit the hardest by COVID-19 and to populations that are underserved and underrepre-

sented. The impact of the

ongoing pandemic has been

particularly hard on nonprofits located in rural areas and those led by, and serving, Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) communities.

The initial "intent to apply" short online form is estimated to take no more than 10 minutes to complete and includes basic yes-orno questions to assess the nonprofit's needs. The second phase of the application process for small nonprofits, estimated to launch March 22, will be a more detailed application.

An additional \$15 million MI Nonprofit Impact Grant program will be administered by LEO and is designed for larger nonprofits to support programs that lift people out of poverty and above the ALICE (Asset Limited Income Constrained, Employed) threshold. This program is expected to launch in Spring 2023.

Ramblers season comes to a close against Stags

While no team wants an off night, it's especially unwanted during tournament play and that's what ended up happening to Boyne City as the Ramblers saw their six game winning streak halted, falling to Kingsley

in the Division 2 district championship contest 44-29.

The Stags outscored the Ramblers 31-18 over the final 16 minutes of action, finding their rhythm in the third quarter and turning a 13-11 halftime lead into the victory.

It was slow going from the opening tip for both teams, as both Boyne and Kingsley found it difficult to put the ball in the hoop. Each team had multiple looks at the basket early on, but could not get the shots to drop as they struggled to a 7-6 Stag advantage at the end of one quarter of play.

The second quarter wouldn't get much better for either squad, as the inability to get shots to fall continued, Kingsley would outscore the Ramblers 6-5 to end the half.

Third quarter action would see the Stags start to create some breathing room as Boyne went nearly three minutes before finding the bottom of the net on an Elly Wilcox three pointer with just over five minutes to play.

Kingsley would score 21 points in the quarter for a 36-24 lead, taking control of the game, and forcing the Ramblers to play catch-up.





Charlevoix wrestling places three at state finals


