



May 25, 2023 News Michigan Spark Grant applications now open; nearly \$23 million available

Additional pathway to Spark Grants funding will be open to 'opportunity communities' through new partnership with Michigan's philanthropy network

After record interest in first-round Michigan Spark Grants funding, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources will reopen grant applications starting May 1 with up to \$23 million available for public recreation improvement projects in areas most affected by COVID-19. To boost grant

access for those in greatest need, the DNR also announced a partnership that will connect identified "opportunity communities" with funding and the support of Michigan's philanthropic network.

"Every Michigander deserves equitable access to the outdoors that's close to home no matter where they live, and that includes having quality local park and trail resources at the neighborhood and community levels," said Gov. Gretchen Whitmer. "Under the bipartisan Building Michigan Together Plan I signed last year, we made history with

the largest one-time investment ever in our state and local parks. Michigan Spark Grants are unique because they align support directly with each community's diverse recreational needs. We're excited that these grants will help deliver critical funding to 'spark' more opportunities for residents to enjoy nature and connect with family and friends.'

Earlier this year, the DNR awarded \$14.2 million in first-round funding to 21 communities. A great start, but interest in the Michigan Spark Grants program far exceeded the department's expectations.

'We were astounded by the response to the first round," said Dan Lord, assistant chief of the DNR's Finance and **Operations** Division. "In a normal year, our top three recreation grant programs - the Land and Water Conservation Fund, the **Recreation Passport** and the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund - on average receive around 150 applications seeking between \$50 million and \$60 million."

"For the Michigan Spark Grants, we accepted over 460 applications requesting more than \$280 million," Lord added. "It was clear we had tapped into a tremendous need. We also knew there was more work to do in supporting some communities and ensuring they have the capacity and resources to prepare, apply for and administer a grant like this."

A new philanthropyfocused partnership through the Council of **Michigan Foundations** will make Michigan Spark Grants funding available this summer

to communities identified as "opportunity communities" - those that traditionallv have been

under-resourced and underrepresented and who lack access to parks and recreation.

This innovative model aligns with federal funding requirements to support communities adversely affected by COVID-19, along with helping to improve and redevelop existing public recreation in communities that historically have experienced barriers to accessing these types of grants.

Connecting 'opportunity communities' to resources

To create this new grantmaking model, the DNR sought advice and perspective from an advisory group composed of philanthropy, regional government planning, parks and recreation, and other grant-making entities with relevant expertise. What emerged was the framework for a grant program with a more equity-focused application and evaluation process, a new approach that gives funding priority to opportunity communities - areas that lack public recreation spaces and have a high proportion of households that are struggling financially and a high number of residents with physical and

mental health disparities. The DNR's new partnership is aimed at removing barriers facing these nearly 40 opportunity communities in accessing not only funding, but also the needed supporting services for expanding a community's ability to successfully manage and implement recreation projects.

Recognizing that the Council of Michigan Foundations – representing Michigan's united, diverse philanthropic community, and an original member of the Michigan Spark Grants advisory group - has the

structure and network in place through its members to engage and support the opportunity communities, the DNR forged a groundbreaking partnership with CMF to align \$27.5 million in Michigan Spark Grant funds (the balance of the program's original \$65 million allocation) through CMF member foundations to support communities in developing and implementing their local public recreation projects.

"Through this innovative partnership with the DNR, Michigan philanthropy will help to ensure community voice is centered in this work to advance equitable and transformative change for opportunity communities across the state," said Kyle Caldwell, CMF president and CEO. "We look forward to supporting our foundation members as we collectively work to expand access to outdoor recreation spaces and programs for communities that have been historically under-represented and under-resourced."

Michigan Spark Grants have proved much different than other grant programs offered by the DNR.

"We were very encouraged by the willingness of the DNR to do something different to further broaden access to recreational opportunities," said J.J. Tighe, director of the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation's Parks & Trails Initiative, and a member of the Michigan Spark Grants advisory group. "We had to find creative solutions that didn't just create a new grant program, but could instead leverage the locally based resources of community foundations to provide grantees with additional support, remove barriers and create the conditions for each community to have long-term success.

"The partnership with CMF expands the reach of the Michigan Spark Grants program and better supports grantees interested in bringing more public recreation opportunities to their residents," said Tighe. "It's about trying to ensure that everyone who wants to take advantage of grant dollars can find a way there."

The final round (nearly \$23 million) of Michigan Spark Grants through the DNR (applications due June 26).

The \$27.5 million subset of CMF Michigan Spark Grant funding and additional resources available to opportunity communities (details coming this summer).

Applicants can seek a minimum of \$100,000 up to a maximum of \$1 million. Applications opening May 1 are due June 26, with award announcements expected in late September. ·. Units of government or public authorities.

·. Federally designated tribes.

·. Regional or statewide organizations that are established with a recreational focus.

·. Consortiums of local units of government or public authorities.

MEA members forge family partnerships, help improve literacy in rural communities

CHARLEVOIX, Mich. -What started as a pilot program to engage families and communities in reading has created new bonds among students, parents and educators in rural communities across Northern Michigan.

Through the Family Literacy Projects, MEA members identified families in rural areas with higher rates of poverty to encourage students to read, and parents to read with their younger children. The program provided families with a collection of books to read and discuss at home, as well as web-based resources to inspire further reading.

"Literacy isn't something that only takes place in the classroom between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m., and it requires working partnerships between educators and families," said MEA member Glen Young, a retired Petoskey High School English teacher and co-director of the Top of the Mitt Writing Project. "In order for literacy to thrive beyond the classroom, it has to involve the family — that could be parents, grandparents, siblings or other caretakers." The project is part of a National Endowment for the Humanities grant awarded to the Top of the Mitt Writing Project and brought together teachers, families and school administrators in the Boyne Falls, Pellston, Charlevoix, Alanson, and Grayling school districts. The books were geared primarily toward K-8 students, and the topics ranged from classic novels to more modern works.

We had fun and the skills we learned, the writing styles, and the books are still bringing joy to our family.'

"The Family Literacy Project was a great success for me, personally, because it allowed me to understand that reading is an easy way to connect with my kids," said Dave Grossi, also a Charlevoix parent. "It's made the one last thing we do before bedtime a fun thing for the kids to look forward to. "Learning doesn't stop at the end of the school day, and our dedicated educators work tirelessly to build partnerships with families to improve literacy in their communities," said Chandra Madafferi, Michigan Education Association president-elect. "We applaud these hard-working educators and are excited to see our students love for reading improve across Northern Michigan." Keys in talent development are recruiting and selecting a great candidate for the position and then, of course, developing and helping that person do her/his best work, be a great team member, and succeed.

In this article we focus on the first key, i.e., hiring an outstanding person.

There are many more jobs here in Northern Michigan, and elsewhere, than there are candidates. Attitude, character, and

qualities are vitally important. We want a person who has fire in her belly, is a thinker as well as a doer, has a drive to be successful. and who will be a treasured member of our team. Business is competitive, so a person has to "want it," be ready to work hard and go the extra mile and make sacrifices at times.

How can we judge attitude? We must rely on our instinct.

One of the best hires I made was because I was so impressed with a young man who walked fast, actually very fast, and with a purpose, and when we were seated, he was always leaning in.

We want a person with humility coupled with inner-confidence, comfortable eye contact, giving full attention, listening attentively, asking good questions, and is "likeable," e.g., a genuine smile.

We have to rely heavily on our instinct to judge charac-

Let's think about the qualities we want in the candidate we select. Surely, we want the person to have: Humility – Humility is the

foundation of growth, and striving for continuous improvement is a path towards success

Empathy – Whatever the position, the person must have good relationships with her colleagues, and be encouraging, helpful, and caring

A Positive Attitude - Genuinely rooting for colleagues, offering help, and contributing ideas about how we all and our business may be better than before Quiet Confidence - To ac-

cept responsibility and be accountable. Good people want to be accountable

Attentive Listening Skills – Listening may be our most important skill in business (and in life), and listening is key to relationships

Readiness to Ask Questions – To learn what is needed, what success looks like, what do others think, and how can we improve

Listen to our gut, if we sense that a person may not be the right selection, we should not compromise. Listening to our instincts almost always pays off.

As we recruit, we are not only seeking a great candidate for a position, we are recruiting for a team! We want someone who will

strengthen our team. someone who will have a positive influence on others, increase collaboration, share ideas, encourage teamwork, pride and loyalty to one another and to our business. We want someone who by her example, everyone will look to with respect.

In our world today when so much is impersonal due to heavy reliance on the Internet, we want to connect with candidates with a personal touch - with empathy and curiosity. Each candidate is a person and will welcome our treating them with the human dignity we all deserve.





Wilson Township Cemetery Ordinance 1 of 2023

Public Notice is hereby given that at the May 10, 2023, meeting of the Wilson Township Board of Trustees, the Wilson Township Cemetery Ordinance was amended as follows:

THE TOWNSHIP OF WILSON, CHARLEVOIX COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

NOTE: THIS IS A CORRECTED VERSION FROM LAST WEEK'S PAPER

Section 1: Title

This ordinance shall be known and cited as the Wilson Township Cemetery Ordinance.

Section 2: Definitions of Cemetery Lots and Cemetery Plots

As Used in This Ordinance:

Cemetery Lot: An area of land within a cemetery sufficient to accommodate from one (1) to six (6) Cemetery Plots.

Cemetery Plot: An area of land within a cemetery lot typically measuring four (4) feet wide and ten (10) feet long.

Headstone: An upright memorial placed at the head of a grave

Marker: A memorial set flush with the surrounding grade

Monument: A statue or other structure placed in memory of the deceased

Green Burial: The act of burying human remains with no embalming fluids or similar body-preserving chemicals in a biodegradable casket and without a vault constructed of concrete or similar material.

Section 3: Sale of Lots or Plots

Cemetery lots or plots shall be sold only to residents or taxpayers of the Township for the purpose of the burial of the purchaser or his or her heirs at law or next of kin. No sale shall be made to funeral directors or others than as heretofore set forth. The Township Clerk or their designee, however, is hereby granted the authority to vary the aforesaid restriction on sales where the purchaser discloses sufficient personal reason for burial within the Township through previous residence in the Township or relationship to persons interred therein. are flush type and do not interfere with cemetery maintenance.

The installation and cost of headstones, markers, monuments, and footings shall be the responsibility of the owner of the plot. The installation will be with the approval and supervision of the Township Clerk or the Cemetery Sexton.

All monument footings must meet or exceed manufactures specifications and must be approved by the Township Clerk or Cemetery Sexton prior to installation.

Section 7: Interment Regulations

A single plot may be used for the burial of one adult, a parent and child buried at the same time, or two children buried at the same time. A single plot may be used for the burial of two (2) cremains.

Not less than 36 hours' notice shall be given in advance of any time of any funeral to allow for the opening of the grave. Arrangements contrary to this shall be made with the Township Clerk or Cemetery Sexton

The appropriate permit for the plot involved, together with appropriate identification of the person to be buried therein, where necessary, shall be presented to either the Sexton or the Township Clerk prior to interment. Where such permit has been lost or destroyed, the Township Clerk shall be satisfied, from his or her records, that the person to be buried in the plot is an authorized and appropriate one before any interment is commenced or completed.

All graves shall be located in an orderly and neat appearing manner within the confines of the plot involved.

if he or she fails within sixty (60) days of the date of mailing the notice to affirmatively indicate in writing to the Township Clerk his or her desire to retain the cemetery lot or plot.

If the Township Clerk receives no written response within sixty (60) days after mailing the notice required to be sent pursuant to subsection (a) above, the cemetery lot or plot identified in the notice shall revert to the Township free and clear from any claims of that original purchaser or qualified assignee. The Township Clerk shall then cancel in the official cemetery records that the burial permit issued and indicate in those records that the cemetery lot or plot is eligible for resale under the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.

Section 12: Repurchase of Lots or Plots

The Township will repurchase any cemetery lots or plot from the owner for the original price paid the Township upon written request of said owner or his legal heirs or representatives.

Section 13: Records

The Township Clerk shall maintain records concerning all burials and issuance of burial permits separate and apart from any other records of the township and the same shall be open to public inspection at all reasonable business hours.

Section 14: Vault

All burials shall be within a standard concrete vault or other non-collapsible container, installed or constructed in each burial space before interment.

No concrete vault shall be required in connection with

All such sales shall be made on a form approved by the Township Board, which grants the right of burial only and does not convey any other title to the lot or burial space sold. Such form shall be executed by the Township Clerk or their designee.

Burial rights may only be transferred to those persons eligible to be original purchasers of cemetery lots or plots within the Township. The Township Clerk or their designee shall approve all transfer requests and shall enter the transfer upon the official records. Upon such assignment, the Clerk or their designee shall issue a new burial permit to the assignee and shall cancel the original permit.

Section 4: Purchase Price and Transfer Fees

The Township Board shall from time to time, by separate resolution, establish the purchase price for cemetery lots and plots and the fee for transferring one or more cemetery lots or burial fees to a qualified assignee

Section 5: Grave Opening Charges

The opening and closing of any burial space, prior to and following burial therein, and including the interment of ashes, shall be at a cost to be determined from time to time by resolution of the Township Board, payable to the Township.

No plots shall be opened and closed except under the direction and control of the Township Clerk or Cemetery Sexton. This provision shall not apply to proceedings for grave openings or disinterment, which are done under the supervision of the local health department.

Section 6: Headstones, Markers or Monuments

All headstones or monuments must be of granite, marble, or other equally durable composition. Brass is allowed for markers. Raw, unfinished boulders and field stones shall not be placed within the cemetery other than as landscaping done by the township as part of cemetery maintenance and beautification.

All headstones, markers, or monuments must be placed on concrete footings or foundations that are no higher than ground level to maintain an erect position. All markers are to be placed flush on the face of the concrete foundation. The concrete footings or foundations shall be a minimum of two inches wider than the footprint of the headstone, marker, or monument and no less than four inches in depth, unless otherwise approved or required by the Township Clerk or Cemetery Sexton

Only one headstone, marker or monument shall be permitted per plot. Additional markers (i.e., military veteran markers) may be placed with the Township Clerk's or Cemetery Sexton's permission if the additional markers No green burials are permitted in any Wilson Township cemetery.

Section 8: Winter Burials

No winter burials shall occur without the prior consent of the Township Clerk or Cemetery Sexton.

The Township may charge additional fees for winter burials.

Section 9: Cremains

Cremains may be buried in a container approved by the Cemetery Sexton or Township Clerk in a burial space.

No cremains shall be scattered or dispersed within a Township Cemetery.

Section 10: Ground Maintenance

No grading, leveling, or excavating upon a plot shall be allowed without the permission of the Cemetery Sexton or the Township Clerk.

No shrubs or trees of any type shall be planted without the approval of the Cemetery Sexton or the Township Clerk. Any of the foregoing items planted without such approval may be removed by the Township or the Cemetery Sexton.

The Township Board reserves the right to remove or trim any tree, plant or shrub located within the cemetery in the interest of maintaining proper appearance and the use of the cemetery.

Mounds that hinder the free use of a lawn mower or other gardening apparatus are prohibited.

The Township Clerk or Cemetery Sexton shall have the right and authority to remove and dispose of all growth, emblems, displays or containers therefore that through decay, deterioration, damage or otherwise become unsightly, a source of litter or a maintenance problem.

Surfaces other than earth or sod are prohibited.

All refuse of any kind or nature including, among others, dried flowers, wreaths, papers, and flower containers must be removed at the time these items begin to deteriorate.

Section 11: Forfeiture of Vacant Cemetery Lots or Plots

If a cemetery lot or plot remains vacant for more than forty (40) years after the sale to an original purchaser or a qualified assignee, the Township Clerk shall send by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the last owner of record a written notice informing him or her that the forty (40) year period has expired and that all rights in the cemetery lot or plot shall be forfeited to the Township the internment of cremains.

Section 15: Cemetery Hours

The cemetery shall be open to the general public from the hours of 8 am to 10 pm each day.

No person shall be permitted in the Township cemeteries at any time other than the foregoing hours, except upon permission of the Township Board, the Township Clerk or the Cemetery Sexton.

Section 16: Penalties

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance shall be responsible for a municipal civil infraction as defined in Public Act 12 of 1994, amending Public Act 236 of 1961, being Sections 600.101-600.9939 of Michigan Compiled laws, and shall be subject to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars and zero cents (\$500.00) along with applicable costs of prosecution allowed by law. Each day this Ordinance is violated shall be considered as a separate violation.

Section 17: Enforcement Officer

The Township Supervisor is hereby designated as the authorized township official to issue municipal civil infraction citations directing alleged violators of this Ordinance to appear in court.

Section 18: Nuisance

A violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be a public nuisance or a nuisance per se and is declared to be offensive to the public health, safety, and welfare.

Section 19: Severability

The provisions of the within ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision, section or part thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall only affect the particular provision, section or part thereof involved in such decision and shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of such ordinance which shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 20. Repeal

The prior Wilson Township Cemetery Ordinance, effective on March 7, 2022, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 21: Effective Date

This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after being published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Township.
