
relaxed attitude and the fun

George met Dorine in 1981 at a Halloween Party. Rumor has it he wore a mask the whole time so he could watch her without being caught staring. But being the "shy" person he was, it was Dorine that made the first move by asking him to a hockey game after she had won tickets for the best costume at work for Halloween. The rest is history. George was not all work, he began officiating soon after moving to Boyne and officiated High School and Middle school basketball, football, baseball and softball. This also led him into volunteering as a little league umpire and then soon a board member of the Boyne City Little League where he and Dorine ended up volunteering for 34 years together. George became the tour guide for the spouses of the State of MI Little League District Administrators and our inhouse food connoisseur where he lined up our restaurants when we attended training or the Little League Congresses every 3 to 4 years.

He loved to spend time with his kids, Cody and Cadie on the gun range or the archery range and test each other's skills with the targets. George bought Cadie her first pink gun (anybody that knows Cadie, knows that almost everything she owns is pink). He also liked spending time on the boat with them taking them around to his favorite spots and laughing at his funny stories about growing up on the

George and Dorine loved to travel around the country and they would drive to see as much of the off beaten sights they could find. Cadie had the same travel bug and because of her they were able to see some of the most beautiful parts of the country depending on where she decided to move to and live for a while. He was also a fan of the Food Channel and made travel plans around some of the best restaurants he watched on the show, "Diners, Drive Ins and Dives". Many of their southern trips were always centered around the Kentucky area as he either had to restock his bourbon supply or get

the newest flavor to try. They also were on a mission with Cody to see the Tigers play baseball in all of the Major League stadiums and had just been to Baltimore this spring. They had completed 8/15 watching the Tigers and 1 at the Astros stadium.

George touched so many lives that it was a standing joke in the family that no matter where we went, he would run into someone that knew him. He has left a hole in so many hearts that will never be the same again. His big hugs, infectious smile and his colorful wardrobe will be missed the most. RIP George until we meet again.


She was born on August 10, 1960, in Bellaire, the daughter of Maurice R. and Margaret M. (Hebden) Murphy.

DNR and partners fight blaze near Grayling

BY DAVE BARAGREY

Fire crews worked through the night on Saturday, June 3 to contain the estimated 2,400-acre Wilderness Trail Fire in Crawford County which closed I-75 for much of Sat-

The fire started around 1 p.m. about 4 miles southeast of Grayling near Staley Lake in Grayling Township.

Among those assisting with the fire are the Michigan State Police, USDA Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Grayling Public Safety, the Grayling City/Charter Township Fire Department and fire departments from Frederic Township, Kalkaska, Blue Lake, Beaver Creek, Markey Township, Higgins Township, Richfield Township, South Branch Township, Otsego County, Cold Springs and Denton Township fire departments are assisting with the fire.

Ground crews, heavy equipment, a Michigan State Police helicopter, and four USDA Forest Service fire boss planes and a Type 1 helicopter also have been assigned to help suppress

The fire cause is not yet available.

Evacuation and safety information

The Red Cross has been activated to assist people evacuated from the area. Shelter is available at Grayling Middle School and Beaver Creek Township Hall.

The wildfire has produced an abundance of smoke. Visibility may be reduced on roadways drive with care in affected areas. Limit exposure to wildfire smoke by staying indoors with windows shut, especially if you have asthma or another respiratory condition.

Closures and flight restrictions

Previously closed sections of I-75 between 4 Mile Road (exit 251) to North Down River Road (exit 256) are now open. Please check MiDrive for the most up-todate information on road closings. Remaining closures as of Sunday, June 4:

Staley Lake Road from M-72 to 4 Mile Road is closed.

Wilderness Trail from Keystone Landing Road to Staley Lake Road is closed.

Staley Lake Beach and Kneff Lake Beach are closed.

A Temporary Flight Restriction is in place for a 5mile perimeter around the fire at heights below 5.000 feet. Do not fly aircraft or drones in the area.

FIRE DANGER IS EXTREME IN **MUCH OF THE STATE**

Michigan remains under extreme fire danger conditions following a prolonged stretch of hot and dry weather. Check daily fire danger conditions on the Great Lakes Fire and Fuels

The DNR recommends these actions to reduce the risk of wildfire:

Never leave a fire unattended, even for a moment. Check first to see if conditions permit open burn-

ing at gov/BurnPermit. Always put fires out completely with water. Drench, stir with a shovel and drench again.

Don't park hot equipment over dry grass on the roadside, which can ignite.

Source was a campfire on private property

People who were evacuated from the fire area were allowed to return to their homes late Saturday.

The fire started about 1 n.m. Saturday near Staley Lake in Grayling Township and burned in a southwest direction through jack pine, mixed pines and oak. The fire source was a campfire on private prop-

I-75, closed Saturday afternoon because of poor visibility due to smoke, reopened shortly before midnight Saturday.

Wisconsin firefighters arrive to help with Grayling fire, now estimated at 90% contained

A team of 10 firefighters from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources arrived Sunday to help the Michigan DNR and cooperating agencies battle the Wilderness Trail Fire located southeast of

Firefighters continue to secure and suppress the fire, which started with a campfire on private land. The fire is approximately 90% contained as of 5 p.m. Sunday. The fire remains at

approximately 2,400 acres. "We're grateful for the help from our neighbors in Wisconsin as well as the support from federal, state and local fire departments, emergency management officials and law enforcement personnel," said Mike Janisse, leader of the DNR Incident Management Team responding to the

Ten firefighters from Wisconsin brought three Type 4 engines with tractor plow dozers and two Type 6 engines to assist with fighting the fire. They arrived early Sunday afternoon.

These resources were made available by the Great Lakes Forest Fire Compact agreement. This compact is comprised of the states of Minnesota,

Gov. Whitmer Activates State Emergency Operations Center to Coordinate Response to Wildfires

LANSING, Mich. -Satrurday, Governor Gretchen Whitmer activated the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) due to two forest fires in Crawford and Iosco counties. The Department of Natural Resources (DNR), Michigan State Police (MSP), and United States Forest Service have deployed air assets to assist with fire suppression ef-

"I am activating our State Emergency Operations Center to coordinate an all-hands-on-deck response to the wildfires in northern Michigan," said Governor Whitmer. "By taking this action, we can ensure state and local first responders have what they need to get this fire contained and prevent loss of life or property. I want to thank the first responders who have been working to keep Michiganders

The SEOC was operational at 7:00PM, according to the MSP Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division (EMHSD). SEOC personnel are monitoring the situation and working with state and local officials as well as private sector partners to ensure any resource needs are met. MSP/EMHSD district coordinators are engaged with local emergency management officials and supporting local emergency operation centers.

Crawford County Forest

In Crawford County, multiple fire agencies are responding to a large forest fire approximately more than 3,000 acres. The fire continues to spread in the area of Staley Lake Rd and 4 Mile in the Grayling area. 10 protect motorists, I-75 has been closed between 4 Mile and North

Down River Rd. The Grayling Middle School and Beaver Creek Township Hall have been opened for any persons evacuated, and the Red Cross is in the area to as-

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources has activated an Incident Management Team to enhance and manage today's response efforts.

Iosco County Forest

In Iosco County, multiple fire agencies are responding to a forest fire approximately 250-300 acres. The fire is contained, and the area will continue to be monitored as a precautionary measure. Five individuals who were evacuated are expected to return to their nomes later this evening.

Fire danger in the area is extreme due to windy,

dry, warm weather and dry fuels. Fire danger for much of the state is expected to be high throughout the weekend. The DNR reminds people to check Michigan.gov/BurnPermit before planning to burn yard debris or start a campfire, and always to have an accessible water source nearby. For more fire safety tips, visit Michigan.gov/PreventWildfires.

The SEOC is the Emergency Operations Center for the State of Michigan located in Lansing and is overseen by the MSP/EMHSD. The SEOC coordinates the response and recovery efforts of state agencies and local governments.

Wisconsin and Michigan, and the Canadian provinces of Ontario and Manitoba.

Preliminary estimates show that the fire threatened 35 residences, 38 vehicles including 23 campers and three boats, and 58 outbuildings. Three outbuildings were lost. This continues to be assessed as staff are able to get into the affected area.

The fire started at around 1 p.m. Saturday and burned through jack pines, mixed pine and oak forestland. Crews battled the blaze through the night and into the next day under hot, dry conditions.

Residents and area visitors are asked to stay away from the fire area while crews continue to work. Roads in the fire perimeter remain closed.

Wilderness Trail Fire update: Beaches and railroad reopen, local roads to reopen Tuesday

Firefighters have the Wilderness Trail Fire located southeast of Grayling more than 90% contained. Recreation areas at Kneff Lake and Staley Lake are open after being closed

while firefighters battled the wildfire.

Additionally, railroad tracks north of 4 Mile Road have reopened to train traffic after inspection. Roads within the approximately 2,400-acre fire in Grayling Township are expected to open on Tuesday.

When roads reopen, residents and visitors to the area are warned to stay out of blackened areas. Dead trees could pose a hazard and the ground still may be warm in some areas.


"Please avoid the area if possible," said Mike Janisse, commander of the **DNR Incident Management** Team assisting with the

If you do visit the area, stay on roads and keep pets on leashes.

"A newly burned area can be very interesting to look at, but make sure you stay a safe distance away from the burned area," said Janisse.

Fire crews will still be on the job within the fire area to mop up and take care of any problems. Please drive slowly and give them space to do their work.

Time Tested Leadership Values

I remember well a luncheon meeting of the Loyola Club in Washington, DC I attended some years ago, and I'd like to share several insights I took away.

For context, the Loyola Club's members are those who have been educated by the Jesuits. There are 28 Jesuit universities and 57 high schools in the U.S. The luncheon speaker was Chris Lowney who authored Heroic Leadership. Chris, a former Jesuit, became a managing director of J. P. Morgan, and now he is an author and speaker—a very good one.

So that you understand how wise and important Jesuit messages can be, the Jesuit Order was founded in 1534, and, as Chris Lowney put it, the order is like a nearly 500-year-old company that is a leader all around the world, in 112 countries on six continents.

A 489-year-old company! Do you realize how many companies in the U.S. are even 100 years old? Surprisingly few! So many companies fail to manage (lead) themselves well and collapse or must sell.

So how have the Jesuits thrived for nearly 489 years throughout the world? The answer is so simple! In 1534, St. Ignatius based the foundation of the Jesuits on self-

awareness, caring for others, curiosity, and making things happen.

This is the blocking and tackling of leadership: "How am I received by

others?" "How can I help you?"

As Lowney quoted another leader at the luncheon, "You must love the people you'll lead before you can lead them."

And he points out that we are all leaders. Leadership is influence. We can influence our co-worker, encourage, help and guide her, and this is leadership. Leadership is what we do with our influence, whatever our role.

Leadership comes from our heart and our head. It's our attitude, and attitude is everything. It's having a purpose bigger than ourselves. It's caring about others, and wanting to help

Lowney gave this wonderful example of attitude and purpose.

President Kennedy visited the NASA Space Center in 1961. We were in the space race with Russia, and at the time this was very important. The Russians were ahead of us, and we felt threatened. Kennedy wanted us to be the first to put a man on the moon. During his tour of the space center Kennedy stopped to speak with a janitor. He introduced himself, and asked, "What do you do?" The janitor thought, then responded, "I am helping to put a man on the moon.

Talk about purpose and attitude!

As leaders, it's not about us. It's our helping others. We cannot be self-absorbed, we must get over ourselves. It's the givers who are most effective (and the happiest).

How are we influencing others? And where does our leadership come from? In reflecting on Lowney's ideas, let's remember that we can always have influenceeveryone has influenceand if that influence is coming from our heart and our head, it will have a positive effect on others. This is true leadership!



Be a part of your community, put yourself out there, contribute your ideas, all mantras of Pam Grassmick.

What a role model. Pam grew up on Beaver Island, actually fourth generation. She graduated from high school, one of five grads, went on to earn a Bachelor of Science at Eastern Michigan, became a nurse at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, where she met Brad, a physician. They married, decided to follow their urge for adventure, moved to the bush country in Alaska and practiced medicine for a year.

In time, they moved back to metro-Detroit, Brad practicing critical care and Pam retired, raising their two sons while volunteering in the community. About 10 years ago, they moved full time to Beaver Island and could not be happier with their two common passions, which are their community and people and the Beaver Island natural resources.

She encourages and developed low impact outdoor activities such as the waterway trail and the



birding trail as a way to enjoy the island's natural resources and provide eco-

nomic development.

A very important contribution which Pam is very involved with preservation of the ash trees, which are a major component of their forests. Ash trees have all but disappeared east of the Mississippi River due to the Emerald Ash Borer, and Pam has helped control that bug with help from the USDA and parasitoids, very thankfully.

Pam's other volunteer activities are numerous and meaningful, for example, she was involved in hospice care on the island, serving on the Charlevoix County Planning Commission, her involvement with the Charlevoix County Community Foundation helping with decisions about the distribution of funds involving land use and our environment, and also funds for general use,

and also with Leadership Charlevoix County, a very excellent program developing our future community leaders.

Pam encourages us to visit Beaver Island, any time of the year. She specifically mentions the birding festival later this month of May, two music festivals during the summer, and a Celtic festival in September.

Reliable high speed internet service is a challenge. It is not great on Beaver Island, which is problematic for remote workers and health care and medical services. There is no hospital or fulltime physician on the island, so good internet communication is needed. Headway is being made, thanks to recent meeting from the National Telecommunications, and Information Administration (NTIA) Federal Program Officer with island anchor institutions becoming more aware of the needs of the island and its

Workforce housing is also an issue, as it is throughout our county. People from elsewhere have purchased houses so they may rent them via Airbnb or directly – for

residents.

steep rental prices.

And another important initiative with which Pam is deeply involved is the Great Lakes Island Alliance, involving 18 islands of the Great Lakes, which meets monthly via Zoom to discuss the issues they face, which generally are unique to islands and require collaboration to solve

Still another activity with which Pam is involved and cares deeply about is strategic planning for the education and preservation of the rare history of Native American Beaver Island inhabitants.

Pam encourages us all to be involved, make connections, always be thinking how to make things better and to share our ideas. She admits that for many years, she did not have a whole lot of self-confidence, but as she followed her passions, her confidence grew. She urges "Have the shoulders to stand up for what we believe in." Amen to that!

What a blessing getting to know Pam is to me, as she is to Beaver Island and Charlevoix County.



Michigan's population falls a hair in 2022

Michigan's population fell slightly in 2022, according to U.S. Census Bureau estimates released Thurs-

Michigan's population was estimated at 10,034,113 as of July 1, down 3,400 from 2021's estimate and 43,200 from the 2020 population of 10.077.325.

Census estimated.

The estimates show that the Sun Belt continues to attract people from much of the country, with Florida, Texas, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Georgia and Arizona adding nearly 1 million peo-

ple combined in the year. Meanwhile, Maryland, Louisiana, Massachusetts,

nois and California combined for a nearly 1 million person loss to other states.

Michigan was the only state to lose population from 2000 to 2010 but gained from 2010 to 2020, rising above 10 million people.

Estimates from University of Michigan economists anticipate declines over the next few years before modest increases, with the state peaking at about 10.5 million in 25 years.

and without substantial growth, it could be a big problem for the state's employers, said Don Grimes, a regional economic specialist with U-M who estimates the state will consistently have more deaths than





The Boyne City Main Street Social District receives approval from The City Commissioners

The Boyne City Commissioners approved the Social District Application during the Tuesday, May 23rd City Commission Meeting.

Main Street Executive Director Ingrid Day gave a thorough explanation of the project that started in 2022 and once again needed the approval and support of the

City Commission to reach its goal.

The Social District is a project regulated and offered by the state of Michigan so that verified businesses may serve alcoholic beverages to-go during specific hours of the day. Every year businesses that wish to participate in the Social District will be required to apply through the

State of Michigan with a \$250 Fee and \$70 for processing. There will be designated boundaries that consumers will be required to stay within, as well as signage and maps to reinforce said boundaries.

Along with signs, there will be handouts to explain the rules and identify the businesses that currently participate. Each business

in the Boyne City Main Street Social District will have a logo displayed on the to-go cup. Executive Director Day shares that the program will run seven days a week from Noon until 9:00 pm.

With concerns of liability, if something were to go wrong, the Boyne City Chief of Police was there to validate all questions along

with the prior review by the City Attorney. Commissioners think it will enhance downtown's vibrancy.

Projects of this nature have been successful in other cities and have now received full support from The City Commission to submit and continue the Boyne City Main Street Social District.

The request was mo-

tioned and carried out for the following businesses -Boyne City Tap Room, Boyne River Inn, Café Sante, Lake Street Pub, Muskrat Distilling, Provisions Wine Bar, Red Mesa, Stiggs Brewing Company, and Sunnyside.

Researching Death Records and Raising Funds to Honor Those who Lived a Century Ago

Over 100 white flags emerge from the ground at Eveline Township Cemetery, each representing an unmarked grave of someone that lived over a century ago.

It all started with Christine Brown, a member of the Chief Shawano Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution. To reach their service goal of historic preservation, education, and patriotism, the DAR Chapter annually participates in Wreaths Across America. A program that places wreaths on the graves of Veterans every year at Christmas time. They began at Greenwood Cemetery in Petoskey, but Brown considered the idea to include Eveline Township Cemetery. She figured out how to get the cemetery into the program and for the past seven years, Wreaths across America have been holding a ceremony at Eveline Township Cemetery.

Over the last couple of years Brown has encouraged the Township Supervisor to hold a scan of the cemetery grounds. With no prior layout documented or



records of those buried in the "old section", this would help solve the mystery of how many people lay to rest without a headstone.

Last spring, a professional company conducted a Ground Penetrating Radar scan that detects unmarked graves through technology that rolls across Earth's surface. It is like an ultrasound, but instead high-frequency radio waves penetrate the ground to create a picture of what may lie below.

By doing this they were able to locate unmarked graves and mark them with bricks and white flags. Although they now know where the bodies are – the bricks and white flags will not last.

Brown and her DAR partner are raising funds to erect a monument that will contain the names and information of those buried in said graves.

The monument will have two sides with 50 names per side and sit within the cemetery. To have one side complete, they need to have found and documented 50 of the deceased.

Brown shares,

"I just don't think we can justify a big monument if we don't have at least one side full."

We will never know what grave belongs to what person; however, Brown is searching for the names of those buried.

So how do you put a name to a nameless body that rests underground?

Christine Brown shares that the process is not an easy one, but with persistence and countless hours of research, they have identified over 35 of the deceased.

Brown and her partners have researched the Charlevoix County Death Ledgers to find people who died in Eveline Township. Further research is needed to obtain obituaries to prove the person was, in fact, buried in Eveline Township Cemetery.

A long process to bring honor to people that lived hundreds of years ago, but a process that Brown views as an important part of history.

The monument costs \$10,650 to make, engrave, and install. They have set an installation goal of September 1st when they will unveil the monument to the Township, DAR, and local donors.

Funds need to be raised by August 1st to have the installation complete by said date. Great Lakes Energy's People Fund awarded the project \$3,000 and with 9 generous local donations the project has raised around \$5,200.

In hopes to add to the fund, they will be selling patriotic bracelets, and decorative centerpieces, as well as taking donations.

They will continue to charge forward in the fundraising and research but are asking all northern Michigan residents that have family members or know of family members that may have died or been buried in Eveline Township to reach out with any possible information.





All of the participating teams worked incredibly hard, showed persistence. and displayed teamwork even during incredibly hot weather. A big congratulations to all play-





Signs That You're Ready to Buy

Figuring out whether you're ready to buy a house -- whether you're a renter or are aiming to move up or size down -can be a daunting task. But there are signs that will indicate whether you're ready to take the buying plunge.

If you are thinking about buying, you're not alone. So are you ready to make the move? You might be if you:

1. Are familiar with the market. If you've been paying attention to how much houses are listed for in the neighborhoods you're eyeing and have a realistic view of how much a house will cost you, you're in good shape. But if you're dreaming about that big corner house with no clue about its asking price, you may want to spend some more time becoming familiar with the market and how much houses are going for.

2. Have the money for a down payment and closing costs. The down payment is a percentage of the value of the property. Freddie Mac says the percentage will be determined by the type of mortgage you select. Down payments usually range from 3 to 20 percent of the property value. Also, you may be required to have Private Mortgage Insurance (PMI or MI) if your down payment is less than 20 percent. Closing costs include points, taxes, title insurance, financing costs and items that must be prepaid or escrowed and other settlement costs. You can expect to pay between from 2 to 7 percent of the property

value. Generally, buyers will receive an estimate of these costs from your lender after you apply for a mortgage.

3. Know how much you can afford. Freddie Mac says that as a general guide, your monthly mortgage payment should be less than or equal to a percentage of your income, usually about a quarter of your gross monthly income. Also, your income, debt and credit history go into determining how much you can borrow. As a general rule, your debt credit card bills, car loans, housing expenses, alimony and child support -should not be more than about 30 to 40 percent of your gross income.

4. Know what additional expenses will come with owning a home. This includes homeowners insurance, utility bills, maintenance costs -- roofing, plumbing, heating and cooling.

5. Have your credit in good shape and make sure your credit report is accurate. Potential lenders will view your credit history how much debt you've accrued, how many accounts you have open, whether your payments are made on time, etc. -- to determine whether they'll give you a loan. You should get a report from each of the three credit reporting companies: Equifax, Experian, and Trans Union.

6. You haven't made any recent major purchases, particularly a vehicle. If you do, you may have a harder time getting a loan -- or it could potentially lower the amount you'll be approved for.

ORDINANCE ADDRESSING FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS OF THE STATE CONSTRUCTION CODE

> Adopted date: May 11, 2023 Effective date: June 9, 2023

Ordinance No. 35 of 2023

An ordinance to designate an enforcing agency to discharge the responsibility of the Township of Bay located in Charlevoix County, and to designate regulated flood hazard areas under the provisions of the State Construction

The Township of Bay, Charlevoix County ordains:

Code Act, Act No. 230 of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended.

Section 1. AGENCY DESIGNATED. Pursuant to the provisions of the state construction code, in accordance with Section 8b(6) of Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, the Building Official of the County of Charlevoix is hereby design nated as the enforcing agency to discharge the responsibility of the Township of Bay under Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, State of Michigan. The County of Charlevoix assumes responsibility for the administration and enforcement of said Act

Section 2. CODE APPENDIX ENFORCED. Pursuant to the provisions of the state construction code, in accordance with Section 8b(6) of Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, Appendix G of the Michigan Building Code shall be enforced by

the enforcing agency within the jurisdiction of the community adopting this ordinance.

Section 3. DESIGNATION OF REGULATED FLOOD PRONE HAZARD AREAS. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Study (FIS) entitled "Flood Insurance Study for Charlevoix County, All Jurisdictions" and dated September 15, 2022 and the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) panel numbers included on Index Panels 26029CIND1B and 26029CIND2B, effective September 15, 2022 are adopted by reference for the purposes of administration of the Michigan Construction Code, and declared to be a part of Section 1612.3 of the Michigan Building Code, and to provide the content of the "Flood Hazards" section of Table

Section 4. MOST RESTRICTIVE STANDARDS. If another ordinance contains standards inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, the most restrictive standards shall apply. All ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are herby repealed.

Section 5. PUBLICATION. This ordinance shall be effective after legal publication and in accordance with the provisions of the Act governing same. This ordinance duly adopted on May 11, 2023 at a regular meeting of the Bay Township Board and will become effective the day following its publication in the Charlevoix County News.
