

## **Alba Sportsman's Club: STRONG TRADITIONS LIVE ON!**

When my father bought land between Mancelona and Gaylord in 1967, I had no idea how much it would impact my "growing up". Being from the Grand Rapids area, as well as other "southern" Michigan locals, we have always considered this our home. It just felt like it and still

Home and family tend to form strong attachment to an area that holds certain traditions... whether hunting, fishing, camping, snowmobiling, or whatever. There is one place here in northern Michigan that has many memories for me, as well as many others. That place is the Alba Sportsman's Club, and their "every Sunday except if it's Christmas" pancake breakfast.

It's quite a surprise at how many people all over the state of Michigan (and even other states) know about the little town of Alba and their Sportsman's club breakfast. My dad loved telling the story of running into several people with an Alba Sportsman's club hat while in Lakeland Florida. Like old friends who never met, they talked for hours about the place.

#### SO, WHAT IS "THE CLUB"?

Well, obviously it's located in Alba (just due west). It was started in 1952. Meetings were held in various places until the current facility was built. A breakfast tradition was started soon after as a way to raise funds to pay utilities and other expenses. It was initially a "plated breakfast", then became all you can eat pancakes, and then all you can eat everything (eggs to order, sausage, toast, etc.)...my favorite time! Then COVID hit and the associated decline in attendance resulted in a back to the plated breakfast which continues to this day (eggs made to order, and "how

many pancakes?" made to order). They could barely scrape by and have been struggling ever since. There have been price increases, but it's worth every penny.

In the good old days, the club ran 4 crews, sometimes more, to offer breakfast every Sunday (except Christmas) year-round. Today, the club is down to one crew that cooks breakfast the 2nd Sunday of the month. However, they are currently forced to shut down during the winter as costs for heating and plow service are too much.

When my parents moved to the property, they attended regularly. One of my traditions is still in play...I hold what we call "The Lost Weekend" at our place. We have anywhere from 10-20 guys come up and we pretend like we're 18 again. We're old enough now that our sons are coming up. It's a "tradition" (as we say: it's not a tradition... we just do it every year!)... and a large part of

it has been ending at Alba Sportsman's Club for the pancake breakfast. We lucked out this year and hit it on the 2nd Sunday in June and got our breakfast! Such a simple thing can make a big impact. Some of these guys only see each other once a year and it's like we never left.

One thing that always fascinated me as a youngster going there with my dad was an old "huge" photograph reproduction of a large buck and doe deer in a winter scene. I had only seen that picture in one other place... our basement. It formerly hung in my grandpa Jake's hunting camp. How cool is that?

#### THE CLUBS OFFERINGS

The club has been used for CPL classes, hunter safety courses, wedding re ceptions, birthday parties, reunions, and even funeral the snowmobilers that always stopped in for break-

They currently have pistol bowling pin shoots and trap shoots scheduled for this summer. They are also working to host 2 more CPL classes, one in August and one in September.

A couple of special treats that the club offers is their Spring picnic (free to the entire community) and a fall harvest potluck dinner. They also plan to attend and have a booth at Alba Day (last Saturday in July... this year the 29th). They will have a bake sale as well as "merch" on hand... T-shirts and hats. So, stop by and visit, make a purchase to help maintain the club. This is what it's all about folks. Places like this contribute to the

community. Seems pretty important doesn't it? Can't let them just "go away", we need more like them!





Amy Kurtz is one special community leader, and thank you, Anne Golski for recommending her.

A graduate of Charlevoix schools, Amy went on to U. Michigan to earn her degree in communication studies. During her summer breaks, Amy worked as administrative assistant for the Venetian Festival, which is pertinent as now, 20 years later, she has come back to Charlevoix for four months and again is serving in the same capacity for this summer's festival.

Amy has several deep passions, specifically helping care for those suffering from domestic violence,

caring for those in need in general, and traveling, e.g., experiencing new places and new people.

Among her many local volunteer activities have been Joppa House, Boulder Park Terrace, America House Senior Living Community, Women's Resource Center, Charlevoix Food Pantry, and other worthy causes.

When she graduated

from college, Amy moved to Hawaii for about six years, helping with those who are abused in their homes and helping women find housing. During this time, she earned her Master's Degree in public administration, and with a specific focus on domestic violence.

Amy then sailed the South Pacific Ocean in a 35-foot sail boat with a friend and subsequently moved to Virginia Beach. She was able to purchase her own sail boat, a 31footer, on which she has lived for almost nine years. While in Virginia, Amy was a Rotary member and served as President of their chapter, and also served as Grant Manager for the Hampton Roads Community Foundation, which has given her an appreciation for the great value of our Charlevoix County Community Foundation.

As an aside, Amy is a Master Captain of Sailing Vessels, accredited by our U.S. Coast Guard. She has used what she has learned to first sail her boat to Charlevoix for a summer. then later south to the



Caribbean, where she spent the past few years volunteering for causes including the St. Maarten AIDS Foundation, and the Grenada Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

These deep interests and desires to help are shared by Amy's family. Her mom, Elaine, spent years with our elementary school serving children with special needs and has always been an active volunteer. Her dad, John, was President of Charlevoix State Bank and continues to this day to be involved in important community work. Her brother, Luther, served as Mayor for eight years, up until this past November and is now active in trying to solve our lack of affordable housing for the workplace, while Amy's sister-in-law, Mary,

works tirelessly and qui-

etly behind a great number of Charlevoix's worthy

Amy believes strongly that the Venetian Festival serves a valuable role as it provides free world class and fun activities for a great many who might otherwise not be able to afford these events. Her work right now with the Festival weeks away is stressful, and with a smile, Amy assures me this is good stress. Her favorite parties are those she has helped organize and is then able watch and enjoy from the sidelines.

After her work with Venetian completes around the end of August, Amy will spend about another month her with family and friends, then back to Grenada, an island and country in the Caribbean and her sail boat, Ophelia.

While she loves Up North Michigan, she does not love the cold, and she believes the people in Grenada are the friendliest and most welcoming she has ever known.

Thank you, Amy, for being who you are, for all your help, and for coming back every summer.

## Tip Of The Mitt SCORE Selects Tillie's Tafel As Client of The Year

The Client of the Year is selected by the local SCORE mentors from the clients served in the year prior. SCORE offers confidential mentoring services at no charge for current or prospective small business owners.

SCORE Tip of the Mitt has been working with Patti and Jeff Dewes, owners of Tillie's Tafel, since 2021 when the Petoskey Regional Chamber of Commerce recommended SCORE's services. Here is their story:

Patti and Jeff had semiretired in 2019 and were traveling the country in their RV. They ended up in northern Michigan early spring 2020 when the pandemic hit and decided to stay and ride out the pandemic. So what to do to keep busy?

"I have always truly enjoyed by grandmother's cinnamon roll that she made for all our holidays," states Jeff. "Her recipe has been passed down from generation to generational for more than 100 years. When Grandma died in 1975, my mother took over that tradition. I come from a family of all boys, so when my mother died in 2016, I decided to take over that tradition."

They decided to find a farmer's market in northern Michigan to sell their cinnamon rolls. The market in Petoskey accepted their application, and on the first day they sold 75 rolls in 25 minutes. Realizing their success, they started rent-

ing a commercial kitchen and hired an employee to make 218 rolls, which they sold out in two hours. People began asking for rolls for weddings, birthday parties, showers and more and the need for a small storefront became obvious. There was space on Mitchell Street, and Tillie's Tafel, named after Jeff's grandmother, was born. Her name was Matilda, or Tillie, and Tafel is the German of the street of the s

man word for table.
"In 2021 we sold over
80,000 gourmet cinnamon
rolls and in 2022, we sold
over 93,000 gourmet cinnamon rolls. Patti, and my
daughter Allie, help manage and run the bakery and
we are looking forward to
future expansion. We enjoy

working with the local schools and nonprofits in fundraising efforts and truly appreciate the residents of northern Michigan and what they have meant to us over the last two years," states Jeff.

"I think the biggest hurdle we faced was not having any food service experience. My wife was an interior designer, and I was an owner of a lumber yard. We were prepared for the challenges of opening a grassroots business, but the challenges of a food service business took us bit by surprise it was a big learning curve! Our biggest challenge was packaging and waste, since we make our rolls daily and do not sell any day-old products, we had to find ways to

calculate proper daily yields and avenues for any rolls left over at the end of the day. Moomers Homemade Ice Cream, out of Traverse City, uses our frozen roll pieces to mix with their cinnamon ice cream to create Tillie's Tafel Gourmet Cinnamon Roll Ice Cream. We also have a local brewery that takes our day-old rolls and uses them to make a cinnamon roll IPA.

"We have faced the same hurdles that a lot of small businesses have faced over the past 2 years with staffing, inflation, and material resourcing. But with the help of SCORE, we are seeing steady growth and are constantly moving toward working more efficiently daily. The Petoskey

Chamber of Commerce introduced us to SCORE and through them we were matched with Paul Krecke who has been instrumental in directing our needs to the appropriate source. Through the experience of the SCORE mentors, we were able to comprise a solid outlook and platform for our business model with the understanding of the seasonal fluctuations in our

"We are currently looking into franchising our model and expanding it across the Midwest and hopefully across the nation soon. To achieve that next level, we need to add some automation to both our production and delivery process of our rolls. We have hired an award-winning pastry consultant out of Chicago to help up with this process. We have also just purchased two state of the art bakery vending machines that are designed with our custom graphics and stocked daily with fresh gourmet cinnamon rolls and sugar cookies. We plan on placing these machines in airports, hospitals, large factories, and colleges all around the state. Our end goal is to have 20 machines placed strategically throughout Northern Michigan by the end of 2024. We are also working on a frozen take-and-bake roll that can be distributed across the nation so consumers can purchase and bake in the comfort of their own home. Although we feel these are all great ways to experience a Tillie's roll, there is nothing better than the experience of coming into our bakery in downtown Petoskey, Michigan

and having a fresh gourmet Tillie's roll right out of our oven!," Jeff enthusiastically concludes.

SCORE Tip of the Mitt Chapter Chair, Tracey Dryovage states, "We like to pick a client who has had great success in contributing to their community. Tillie's Tafel started by selling their cinnamon rolls in the local farmer's market during the Covid-19 pandemic. Since then, they have leased a storefront in Downtown Petoskey, where they have since expanded into a larger space and added Moomers Homemade Ice Cream. Along with the expanded storefront, they still support the local farmers' markets, along with selling and shipping their products on-line. We at SCORE look forward to a long-term relationship with Jeff and Patti and Tillie's Tafel - for the life of the business."

SCORE's business mentors typically are retired or current business owners, executives or managers who volunteer to share their expertise. ## World Hepatitis Day is July 28

Screening for hepatitis C and vaccinations for hepatitis A and B decreases chance of illness

The Health Department of Northwest Michigan (HDNW) and the Northern Michigan Public Health Alliance (NMPHA) are recognizing World Hepatitis Day to help raise awareness about viral hepatitis and the steps people can take to prevent and manage the disease. HDNW offers vaccines for hepatitis A and B and free hepatitis C screening and testing, including rapid antibody hepatitis C testing.

"Viral hepatitis is a serious, preventable public health threat that we are diligently fighting," says
Dan Thorell, HDNW Health
Officer. "It's important that
we continue to offer education, screenings, and vaccinations to people. And it's
important that people living
with hepatitis know about
their condition so they can
make informed choices

about their healthcare."
There are at least five types of viral hepatitis. The three most common in the United States are hepatitis A, hepatitis B, and hepatitis

Hepatitis A is easily transmitted from person to person or contaminated food. It causes an acute infection that usually improves without treatment but can cause severe illness

Hepatitis B and hepatitis C can be spread through sex or sharing needles. They can cause a chronic infection, which can lead to liver disease including cancer.

There is a vaccine to prevent hepatitis A and B.
There is not one for hepatitis C.

Hepatitis symptoms can include fever, loss of appetite, diarrhea, nausea, abdominal discomfort, dark-colored urine, and jaundice, according to HDNW Medical Director Joshua Meyerson. The disease can also cause liver infection and scarring.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), hepatitis is a group of viral infections that lead to a range of health problems, such as liver cirrhosis, liver cancer, and liver failure.

More than 1.4 million deaths

per year are caused by hepatitis B and C alone. WHO has set a goal of ending viral hepatitis as a public health threat by 2030. Some of the key steps people can take to prevent hepatitis are getting vaccinated, practicing safe sex, and avoiding sharing needles or other drug paraphernalia.

Michigan's Department of Health & Human Services offers low-cost hepatitis C treatment through their "We Treat Hep C" program.

Michigan joins 36 other states in improving access and lowering costs for SNAP beneficiaries, ensures families can get the support they need without being forced to sell their car or empty their bank account

LANSING, Mich. — Governor Gretchen Whitmer has signed Senate Bill 35, bipartisan legislation improving access to food assistance and lowering costs for Michiganders by eliminating the asset test for SNAP benefits. Michigan joins 36 other states in eliminating this burdensome requirement on food assistance, ensuring families can get the help they need to put food on the table without being forced to sell their car or empty their savings. It will give families more financial stability and reduce the amount of red tape and paperwork for health department case workers so they can focus on helping people. feed themselves and their children," said Governor Whitmer. "Improving access to food assistance is a commonsense step already taken by 36 other states to lower costs for families and ensure they can get the benefits they need. Before this bill, Michiganders with more than \$15,000 in assets—including the value of their vehicle and savingswould not qualify for food assistance. This forced people who might have been laid off or just need a little breathing room to make impossible choices to quality for SNAP. Food benefits must be accessible for Michiganders who need them without illogical tradeoffs. I am proud to get this done and grateful for all the organizations, advocates, and legislators-including Senator Irwin-who fought hard to

"I'm glad that we will use national eligibility standards rather than spending

state taxpayers' money to

block residents from the help they need to feed themselves and their families," said state Senator Jeff Irwin (D-Ann Arbor). "Our safety net works better if it can catch people before they hit the ground; now families who face financial difficulties won't be required to deplete all their savings and risk losing everything before they can get food assistance."

"The asset test for SNAP went against our values as Michiganders. Now, instead of punishing families who have hit a roadblock, we can make sure they are able to put food on the table as they work to regain financial security. Eliminating the asset test means that kids can be strong for school and play, and parents can focus on the future," said Monique Stanton, President & CEO of the Michigan League for Public Policy. "In addition to helping the 710,500 Michigan households that receive SNAPincluding more than 531,000 children—eliminating the asset test will also help reduce paperwork for the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services

There may only be five teams in the Charlevoix County News coverage area, but there was certainly plenty of baseball talent to go around between the teams. We are pleased to announce our annual Dream Team, giving you one last look at this past season.

For player of the year, that award has to go to AJ Speigl. While there can be cases made for other players, his stats simply speak for themselves. He hit an impressive average of .571 and had an on base percentage of .656. Spiegl had 56 hits, 10 of which were doubles, six triples and 37 RBI. He walked 24 times and stole 27 bases. He also won two games as a pitcher and struck out 24 batters in just 18.1 innings of work.

Coach of the year goes to Scott Nickel of Charlevoix. He was able to get a young but extremely talented Rayder squad to win the extremely tough Lake Michigan Conference, with a 12-2 record in league play. Johnson won 10 games as a pitcher and in 50 innings of work. He had a 2.10 ERA and struck out 101 batters. Troy Nickel had a great season as well, hitting .352 and he had a .441 on base percentage. Nickel also had four doubles and drove in 19 runs. Waha shined on the mound too, with a 1.08 ERA  $\,$ and he struck out 77 batters. He was credited with win-







that is always a big matchup between us so it was huge to come out on top. We set our sights on that early in the season and worked towards it all year long and it was huge for us for sure."

It is a pretty simple formula for Nickel and the Rayders to find all these wins too. A team first mentality and a loaded pitching staff can go a long ways.

ing isn't exactly what Speigl's opponents want to think about. After all he hit for a .571 average this year with an on base percentage of .656. He had 56 hits, 10 went for doubles, six triples and 37 RBL. He also walked 24 times and 27 bases. While able to play multiple positions, he is primarily a middle infielder, and he also won two games as a pitcher and struck out 24 batters in just 18.1 innings of work.

He also broke the program's single season hit record, which his father and the team's assistant coach Steve Speigl held pre-

first base when AJ broke his record, and it was a cool moment one of the coolest moments of the year, even with all the big wins that we had," Nickel said.

With losing just two seniors from this year's team, there is a high probability that Charlevoix is set for some big moments next spring too.

"They are a big two, so they will be missed but I think we will be just as good, if not a little better next year," Nickel said. "I know sometimes that can backfire on you and it can go the complete opposite direction, but I don't see that with this group. Most of them are right in the middle of a summer travel season so they are playing baseball and will be working at it all winter."
