The event will be held on October 2 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the South Arm Café in East Jordan. Horse pulling has become a fading art and increasingly more expensive to host. "It used to be that farm teams would go. Now if you're not a millionaire it's hard to compete," said **Pig Roast Committee** Horse Pull Organizer Hud Drenth. While the Bellaire and Gaylord Fairs had good turnouts at their Horse Pull events, the 2023 Pig Roast Horse Pull only attracted one team. "It

Cutler sentenced in sexual assault case

As often occurs in sexual assault cases, it took an exceptional amount of courage for the victim in this case to report

what had happened. As also often occurs, once that initial person came forward, there were others who found the strength to speak up.

On September 22, 2023 while handing down the sentence upon Antonio "Tony" Cutler, Judge George Mertz stated "What I see, and over a long period of time, a pattern from you of conduct directed at young men and under aged men. It's clear to me that you have a proclivity towards young men and under aged men."

The criminal charge in this case was due to Cutler's grazing of the groin area of a young male who Cutler supervised at a local restaurant he worked at. Investigation revealed several other young men who had met Cutler through his work as a teacher, umpire or supervisor and reported inappropriate sexual advances or inappropriate sexual behavior.

This case has therefore brought light to an aspect of

Cutler pled "No Contest" to Aggravated Assault. He was sentenced to 90 days jail, 1 year of probation. The judge also added Cutler have no contact with any minors during that term of probation.





Three of BTFD volunteer members, Daryl Richards, the Banks Township Ellsworth Fire Captain; Nathan St. Pierre, the Banks Township Atwood Fire Captain; and Ward St. Pierre, the Banks Township Medical Director, were presented with certifications by Jeff Stevens, the team's PADI (Professional Association of Diving Instructors) diving instructor, at Monday Night's meeting. The men were instructed in multiple settings including classrooms, pools, and lakes. With the lake training they practiced real situ-

ational skills in preparation for harsh rescue conditions. The classes took place mainly in Charlevoix and East Jordan, both cities fire departments provided the team with much needed assistance as well as diving equipment while training. Banks Township is "really lucky to have these three in your community. They've bitten off a huge commitment," said Stevens during the ceremony.

The department was awarded the MI Fire Equipment Grant, which was established to provide funding for the purchase of fire equipment for part time, on call, or volunteer firefight-

The Banks Township Fire Department covers not only Banks Township but also provides service for portions of South Arm and Norwood Townships. They have been working hard to expand and equip their aging membership. Being located on the Chain of Lakes, the department has depended on both the Charlevoix and East Jordan fire departments on the rare occasions divers were needed. After a drowning in 2022, the department has worked hard to make the team a reality. "This is a huge deal for us; a big accomplishment not only for Banks Township but also Antrim County," said Richards.

Seth's Challenge: 300 Miles. 24 Hours. 1 Tandem Bike.

Bike Ride Aimed at Helping Fund Regional Trail Connections

On Saturday, Sept. 30, a group of trail enthusiasts are embarking on a fundraising mission, attempting to ride a tandem bicycle 300 miles in 24 hours.

Top of Michigan Trails Council's (TOMTC) Development Director Seth Gernot conceived the idea, and he's counting on a few of his friends to help him realize his goal of pedaling the two-person bike from Lake Huron to Lake Michigan. Their planned route starts in Alpena and traces the tip of the mitt, eventually ending in Traverse City.

The fundraiser is a collaboration between the Top of Michigan Trails Council and TART Trails. The two non-profit organizations are working together on the Nakwema Trailway, a 40plus mile trail that will connect Charlevoix to Traverse City.

The 45-year-old Gernot said the 300-mile route uses about 180 miles of trail in both the Top of Michigan Trails and TART Trails networks., both of which he hopes to boost financially via his team's efforts.

"It's going to be painful, but the pain will hopefully be temporary and quickly forgotten" Gernot, an Elk Rapids resident, said. "I plan to ride the entire way on the front of the bike while periodically switching

out the rider in the back.

"None of us are professional cyclists," he continued. "We're moms and dads and occasionally we ride alone or with our kids. But, we all love riding and want to see more trails for everyone to enjoy."

The route starts in Alpena and goes north ds through Cheboygan to Mackinaw City. From there, the riders will turn south to Petoskey, Charlevoix, Traverse City, and then continue to make a loop through Suttons Bay, Sleeping Bear Dunes, and Interlochen, and, finally, back to Traverse City.

"On paper, it's quite possible to pedal 300 miles in 24 hours," said Gernot, who's done such adventure rides in the past. "One just needs to average 15 mph for 20 hours. This leaves just four hours for inclement weather, bathroom breaks, headwinds, flat tires, food and water refueling, and anything else that can slow down a bike made for two."

"The future Nakwema Trailway is a critical component in our effort to create a 300-plus trail network that will connect Sleeping Bear Dunes to Mackinaw City and beyond," said Top of Michigan Trails Executive Director Brent Bolin. "We hope everyone can get behind Seth's challenge and help us achieve this goal."

A support vehicle will accompany Gernot and his crew. They'll be stopping in various places along the way.







"We were pleased with how our players handled their first road trip of the season," head coach Don Jess said. "Benzie is a really good team and our kids took over in the second half of



A "full bathroom" is a room with a toilet, a sink and a bathtub. A "threequarter bathroom" has a toilet, a sink and a shower. A "half bathroom" or powder room has only a toilet and a sink.

assum. fin. -- assumable financing

closing costs -- the entire package of miscellaneous expenses paid by the buyer and the seller when the real estate deal closes. These costs include the brokerage commission, mortgage-related fees, escrow or attorney's settlement charges, transfer taxes, recording fees, title insurance and so on. Closing costs are generally paid through escrow.

CMA -- comparative market analysis or competitive market analysis. A CMA is a report that shows prices of homes that are comparable to a subject home and that were recently sold, are currently on the market or were on the market, but not sold legally binding until a certain condition is met. One example is a buyer's contractual right to obtain a professional home inspection before purchasing the home.

dk -- deck

expansion pot'l -- expansion potential mean that there's extra space on the lot or the possibility of adding a room or even an upper level, subject to local zoning restrictions.

fab pentrm -- fabulous pentroom, a room on top (but under the roof) that has great views

FDR -- formal dining room

fixture -- anything of value that is permanently attached to or a part of real property. (Real estate is legally called "real property," while movables are called "personal property.") Examples of fixtures include installed wall-to-wall carpeting, light fixtures, window coverings, landscaping and so on. Fixtures are a frequent subject of buyer and seller disputes. When in doubt, get it in writing.

frplc, fplc, FP -- fireplace

gar -- garage (garden is usually abbreviated as "gard.")

grmet kit -- gourmet kitchen
