It may be true that there were players out there that put up fancier numbers when it came to goals and assists than Boyne City junior Amayo Bardeguez-Barerra. However, when it comes right down to it, the Ramblers' midfielder just had an impact on the team that was immeasurable.

"I think I was able to help my team by providing leadership as a team captain and also being connected with the play," he said. "A lot of plays might not have started with me or ended with me, but most of our sequences had to go through me and I think that was how I was able to help my team."

Bardeguez-Barerra had five goals and six assists for Boyne City this year, as they went 10-6-5 overall and finished runner-up in the Lake Michigan Conference. His efforts helped him be named to Division 3's second team all-state, all-regional and all-

district.

"Amayo is worthy of player of the year because of his work ethic, IQ/understanding of the game, and the way he makes things happen on the field for us creatively," his head coach Ross Daniels said. "Amayo has outstanding vision to find a pass for his team mates or to take on a player on the dribble to open up space for his team mates

around him. I look forward to having Amayo back next fall for his senior season and to continue to see his development as a player, leader and individual."

Daniels felt Bardeguez-Barerra handled the challenging role of midfield quite well.

"His intelligence and ability to read the game to put his team mates in positions to succeed is what separates him from other skill players," he said. "Amayo is very skilled technically on the ball, but is also an excellent tackler and defends well. His ability to play full 80 minute shifts repeatedly in a week and cover all the ground he needs to cover is impressive."

Bardeguez-Barerra was flat out just a student of the

game. "My whole life, I have loved soccer and have been watching pro soccer and I watched my dad paly when he would go and play, and I think watching a game can sort of alter your way of thining," he said. "If you are able to make the same plays as the professionals, then you are doing a good job and I think watching soccer end I watching soccer end I watching pro soccer and I watching pro soccer end I watch

helped me out a ton in that." And of course, the talented Bardeguez-Barerra enjoyed being a part of a skilled squad this fall.

"I am just thankful that I was able to make the dream team and for my team, helping me out and helping me make it on that team as well as all-state," he said. "It was a great season, probably the most fun I have had because the teammates we weren't just teammates, it was like a big family and we all knew each other really well. It didn't end the way we wanted (a district loss to Traverse City Christian), but I honestly couldn't complain much, it was great."



The 1995 Petoskey graduate was a standout on the pitch as a player under legendary coach Scott Batchelor. He then succeeded Batchelor as the head coach in 2010 when Batchelor retired.

Jonker's '22 squad finished 16-8-1 while playing its customary rugged schedule. The Northmen came in second in the always-tough Big North Conference, going 8-2 and losing only to league-champion Traverse City West. Both losses came by one goal.

The Northmen then went on to a second consecutive

Division 2 district title. Jonker, who teaches

economics at Petoskey High School, had a deep, balanced and experienced roster in 2022. The squad was led by leading scorer Sawyer Webster, goalkeeper Jackson Jonker (the coach's son), solid midfielder Michael Squires, and the likes of Ben Shuman and

Aidan Norton. "One through 18, every kid could really play," Jonker said. "From a chemistry standpoint there were zero issues or headaches all year long. The kids got along so well. They were all rooting for each other and I think that made it a super enjoyable group to work with."

Batchelor and then Jonker are the only two

coaches the program, which will celebrate 40 years in 2023, have ever had.

"It's been an honor to inherit the program from Batch," Jonker said. "That consistency has been really helpful. Batch always had extremely high standards in terms of how we conducted business in the classroom and on the field and we've carried that over.

"We've been fortunate to work with incredible families and incredible kids. Our Petoskey Youth Soccer Association has been the biggest part of that success over those 40 years. I feel really fortunate to have been able to carry on the legacy that Scott created.'

That consistency and continuity is evident in Jonker's staff, which includes assistant Matt Nedwiki, Pete Platte and Noah Honaker along with junior varsity coach John Lennon. Both Platt and Honaker are products of the program.

"I'm really fortunate," Jonker said. "I have an incredible group of assistants who take a lot of the coaching responsibilities. I've worked with these kids for so long, it's good for them to have some different voices. I'm organizing and setting up practice, but I'm turning a lot of the coaching over to those guys during the practice and the kids are really receptive to our entire

ages just like this one






