


HELPING PEOPLE AND MAKING THINGS HAPPEN

Ryan Novotny is Executive Director of Charlevoix County Transit (public transportation, e.g., buses) and Charlevoix County **Transportation Authority** (e.g., Ironton Ferry). I am ashamed to admit that I knew little about Charlevoix Public Transportation until I met with Ryan. Oh my gosh, what a challenging and vitally important responsibility, which I will briefly explain, but first Ryan's background.

Ryan was born and raised in the city of Charlevoix. Growing up in Northern Michigan, he loved to hunt, fish, and go camping. He was also always tinkering with cars, motorcycles, electronics or anything else that he thought he could fix. After he graduated, his need to see more of the world took him to Colorado, where he started his career in the auto repair industry, working and living in Steamboat Springs. In time, he returned home to Michigan, continuing as an auto mechanic with Fox Motors.

In 2014, Ryan joined Charlevoix County Transit as lead mechanic and never turned down a chance to use his knowledge to help Transit, routinely helping with building repairs or fixing computers. Within a relatively short time, he was offered the position of Transportation Coordinator, both Transit and the Ironton Ferry, and in 2022 he became the Director, thanks no doubt to his exceptional work ethic, in-depth knowledge and considerable skills.....and his leadership lenge for Ryan is staffing.

Generally, the county buses do not include our public schools, which have their own, though bus service is offered to a private or parochial school for field trips, for example, Michigan being a school of choice state enables students to opt to attend a school out of their residential area and the county provides bus transportation. An example would be a student from East Jordan attending Boyne Falls School. Also, certainly, a major use of buses is for our veterans, seniors and others in need, to and from medical and other appointments. County bus rides number about 4,000 a month.

There are about 20 bus drivers and they are generally dedicated to their service to our community.

Hiring people is not easy. As a county (government) position they are competing against many other potential businesses in hiring employees, and the training required to drive a bus is extensive versus training required for most other jobs. Someone must believe in the importance of "serving" to choose to work for our county transit system over other, easier jobs. As it is, if someone cannot drive that day due to illness or some other reason, a replacement driver has to be found, as people must get to work, school, medical appointments, and so on. This at times can involve last minute scrambling, and Ryan may be a driver himself that day, and also if a mechanic cannot work, he may find himself under a bus address-

So, while Ryan is a true leader with team responsibilities, he is definitely a

ing an issue.

"hands on" team member using his training, knowledge and technical skills. And he loves being able to do so, as he loves helping people and keeping important services happening for the people of Charlevoix County. A wonderful example being an extensive fire in a condominium building on Park Avenue in Charlevoix maybe two winters ago. The residents of course evacuated into the cold, and the county quickly sent their heated buses as shelters until these people could make other arrangements.

Much of Ryan's success is founded on his continuous learning. In addition to being a devoted husband to Kelsey and father to their four young children, he is earning an Associate Degree in Business at North Central Michigan College and also enrolls in selected management and leadership courses.

A major source of growth and enjoyment for Ryan is Leadership Charlevoix County. Since he graduated from the program, he has continued to help it, providing needed transportation, teaching when he can, and he is an active board member.

I mentioned Ryan's work ethic as key to his success and that of our county transit system, and so are his being detail oriented, being a team player, eagerness to learn and share his knowledge, his humility, loving his work, and being appreciative of his responsibilities with our county.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

In addition, the Health Department of Northwest Michigan (HDNW) and the Northern Michigan Public Health Alliance recognize October 13 as Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day and October 17-23 as Men's Breast Cancer Awareness Week.

So, get out your pink, show your support by attending local events, and schedule those screenings.

Did you know that:

- One in eight women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime. According to the Susan G. Komen organization, one woman is diagnosed every two minutes in the U.S.
- The two most common risk factors of breast cancer are being born a female and getting older.
- In 2022, an estimated 44,000 people in America died from breast cancer.

HDNW helps women and men—be proactive in fighting breast cancer through education, awareness, and screenings.

"Our Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Navigation Program (BC3NP) provides low-income women access to mammograms and pap tests, both of which are critical screenings," says Melissa Hahn, HDNW Director of Family Health. "If a woman is diagnosed, we will also work to help them qualify for a special

Medicaid program through BC3NP to help with the costs of treatment."

The program covers pap smears for women 21 to 64, mammograms for women 40-64, and MRIs based on personal and family risk. Over 75 services are provided through BC3NP, including:

Diagnostic mammograms Ultrasounds Breast biopsies

"We are fortunate to be able to offer this program to area residents," says HDNW Nurse Practitioner Jordan Wyeth, who has personally celebrated cancer-free status with women diagnosed with breast cancer in early stages at the health department. "Early detection and effective treatment are critical life-saving steps that we can all take and encourage."



Local Labor Force Continues Post-COVID Growth; But There's Still Cause for Concern

There is good news and bad news when it comes to the regional workforce which has been a challenge in Northern Lower Michigan in recent years, especially following the COVID-19 pandemic. The good news is that recent data shows the local labor force is approaching pre-COVID levels. The bad news is that our long-term demographic trends point to a shrinking workforce in the future. Concerns regarding the state's workforce have been elevated with the administration hiring a new Chief Growth Officer, establishing the Growing Michigan Together Council, and launching a talent attraction campaign. While these events are covered extensively in the news, it is important to understand the local trends.

Data released by the State of Michigan shows that the summer labor force in Antrim, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, and Emmet Counties is approaching pre-COVID levels as seen in Figure 1.

Figure 1 shows that four counties' aggregate workforce in May and June of 2023 closely paralleled 2018 and 2019 before falling short of the pre-COVID summer peak. While the



data for July is still preliminary, this growth trend is a positive for local businesses, governments, and nonprofits who have faced hiring challenges in recent years. A larger labor force means there are more

workers to meet the needs of local employers. Table 1 reveals that the regional growth trend is also present in each of the counties the NLEA serves, with Antrim and Charlevoix Counties actually exceeding their pre-COVID labor force for the month of July.

There are number of factors pulling people into the workforce and keeping them out. Those who went back to school during the pandemic have been completing their

degrees or programs and entering the workforce. Wages are rising which is a draw. Inflation is decreasing the value of retirement savings, potentially pushing older workers to take on part-time jobs. In contrast, childcare remains hard to find and expensive for those who can secure it. The health risks and stock market growth associated with the COVID-19 pandemic pushed many older workers out of the labor force a few years earlier than expected; a significant portion of these individuals are unlikely to return to the workplace as they have settled into retirement. While the recovering labor force is positive for the region, the future of the labor supply is not guaranteed. Local stakeholders should be conscious that demographic trends point to a workforce that will continue to shrink. Table 2 shows that the population of each NLEA county is aging rapidly.

The fact that the NLEA service area aging faster than the state and country is a cause for concern. As the share of the population over the age of sixty grows, there are less working age individuals available to local employers and there is increased demand placed on certain industries, like healthcare. This age group's growth is driven by how desirable the region is to live in; local retirees stay

move here too. While the number of older residents is growing, the number of younger residents is shrinking. In the NLEA service area, there were 4,641 fewer individuals under the age of twenty in 2021 than in 2010. As this share of the population shrinks, there are less students to fill seasonal jobs and enter the local workforce after graduation. As the population of older residents grows and the population of younger residents declines, leaders must consider how to make the regional economy more resilient.

Demographic trends show that the next generation of the region's workforce is not being raised here. This reality reveals the need for a regional talent attraction and retention strategy to ensure the continued success of the local economy. This summer, the NLEA launched Choose the North, a talent campaign aimed at highlighting the professional opportunities and quality of life Northern Lower Michigan has to offer. While the campaign's social media reach continues to grow, it is just one part of the solution to a challenge that requires a multifaceted approach. Civic and business leaders must continue to develop tools and strategies to address regional labor force trends.



On defense, Swanson led the way with 13 tackles, Speigl had six and Herzog took down five.






