

VETERAN OF THE MONTH DECEMBER 2023 DAVID LLOYD ARNOLD



The Veteran of the Month for December 2023 is David Lloyd Arnold.

Born in Charlevoix Michigan September 28, 1939, to parents Lloyd and Aletha Arnold. Dave grew up in Charlevoix and was proud to be a fourth-generation local boy. He attended Charlevoix Schools graduating in the class of 1957.

On January 28, 1959, he enlisted into the United States Navy at Detroit Michigan. 

It's a Credit Card Addiction

Dear Dave,

I think my mother-inlaw has a serious credit card problem. She can't afford stuff, but she shops anyway, chalks up more and more debt, acquires more credit cards, and thinks she'll pay for it all later somehow. Her ex-husband has bailed her out a few times, but he's unwilling to help anymore. My wife and I, and my wife's sister, want to address this issue, but we're all worried about her reaction, and we don't know where to start. Do you have any advice?

–Randal

Dear Randall,

First, everyone involved should understand they're likely to receive an angry response from this lady if she's confronted over her actions. Sometimes people get ticked off when they hear the truth, especially when it's connected to their own misbehavior. It may even be a good idea for your wife and her sister to get some advice from a family counselor beforehand. Really, what we're talking about here is an intervention.

Also, you need to stay out of the discussion.
This is something for her daughters to handle.
Support your wife and her sister through it all, but if you're in there asking questions and probing around, you're liable

to come off as the evil son-in-law. And you folks don't need to add any more problems to the mix.

They need to sit down with her in a quiet setting, one where there are no interruptions, no television and no one else. Start with the fact that they love her and care about her deeply. That's very important in a situation like this. But they also have to walk through what's really going on, and let her know they're tired of watching her destroy herself, and her finances, with her irresponsible behavior.

If she had a drinking problem, you'd want to try to make her see how alcohol was hurting her and the relationships she has with her family. In this case, she basically has a credit card addiction. And it's wreaking havoc on her financial well-being and people who care about her.

So, show as much love and understanding as possible. But someone needs to say something soon.

NCMC receives more than \$600K in federal, local grants to establish college-led child care and preschool program

Phase II of NCMC's Child Care Initiative launches with support from the U.S. Department of Education, the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation, and the Emmet County Board of Commissioners

PETOSKEY — North Central Michigan College's Child Care Initiative (CCI), which is leading the development of a sustainable, community-centered child care system in Emmet County, will enter its second phase with more than a half-million dollars in funding thanks to a federal grant and local support from the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation and the Emmet County Board of Commis-

A \$490,569 grant from the U.S. Department of Education's Child Care Access Means Parents in School program (CCAMPIS) will expand child care access to NCMC's student parents with infants and toddlers, addressing a key barrier standing in the way of parents' ability to graduate.

NCMC was one of just 34 CCAMPIS awardees nationwide and the only awardee in Michigan. The grant is renewable for up to four years, and funds can be used in the near term to subsidize student parents' child care costs.

"Attending college while raising young children is no easy feat," said Jennifer Wixson, NCMC early childhood education program coordinator and head of the CCI. "Parents face a unique set of circumstances that affect their academic persistence and completion. Our first step will be identifying who our student parents are so that we can connect them with resources to support them on their path toward graduation."

The CCAMPIS grant will finance 55% of CCI's Phase II total costs for 2023-24, with the remaining 45%, or \$394,268, to be funded by non-federal governmental sources and

fundraising.

Another key funding partner, the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation, has awarded the college a two-year, \$100,000 grant in support of Phase II initiatives, including establishing the NCMC Child Care and Preschool Program, a four-classroom proof-of-concept prototype built on a true-cost business model.

CCI's Phase I research revealed that many family child care owners do not pay themselves a set salary based on their true business costs. Rather, their rates reflect the "going rate" in the community, which is informally regarded as what families can afford to pay. The result is a business model that drastically undervalues home-based providers and their employees. The NCMC Child Care and Preschool Program will demonstrate the feasibility and viability of a true cost fiscal model, Wixson explained.

"We know that ensuring living wages, benefits, and a predictable salary scale is critical to sustaining and growing our local child care system," Wixson said. "By developing, prototyping, and piloting these concepts, we will ensure their success in Emmet County, and ultimately, across our Northern Michigan region."

The Community
Foundation was a key
partner when North Central
launched the CCI in 2022,
awarding the college
\$50,000 to fund Phase I
research. Community Foundation Executive Director
David (DJ) Jones said the
initiative was — and continues to be — well aligned
with the Community Foundation's mission to improve
the quality of life for all
people in Emmet County.

"Child care is a critical need in our community," Jones shared. "We are pleased to continue our support of North Central's dedicated initiative to find solutions that are sustainable."

Emmet County has emerged as another local partner, with the board of commissioners unanimously approving a \$50,000 funding request on November 16. Those funds will be used to support the engagement of employer partners in the college-led child care and preschool program.

In addition to providing proof of concept, Wixson noted four objectives and outcomes resulting from the program:

- Enabling student parents
 to pursue their educational goals assured
 that their children are
 in a safe, educational,
 caring environment
 nearby, which will lead
 to an increase in their
 attendance rates and
 achievement.
- The on-campus program will utilize a sliding fee scale and priority enrollment while mod-

- eling the use of various funding streams, allowing low-income student parents expanded access to high-quality child care services.
- Providing tangible
 evidence of North
 Central's commitment
 to students' welfare,
 leading to increased
 retention and completion rates, as well
 as participation in a
 parent advisory group
 and other parent engagement experiences
 on campus.
- Promoting cognitive, emotional, and social development as a foundation for future academic achievements and increasing the capacity of community child care opportunities and preschool programming.

Grayling senior Mitchel Harrington has been selected as the Weekly Choice Charlevoix County News Soccer Dream Team Player of the Year.


Harrington scored 48 goals this season and had 16 assists for Grayling High School. He broke the school record for goals in a season.



It was the second straight home game for the Red Rayders, and their second consecutive win boosting their early season record to 2-0. Both were non-conference matchups.



Choosing a Foreclosed Home to Buy

Foreclosed homes represent some of the finest buying opportunities in many years. If one understands how to choose the right property, they can be pleased with the purchase.

Just because it is a foreclosed property, does not automatically guarantee that it will be a good buy. There are several factors to consider before choosing a property and making an offer. This will help ensure that a choice will be the right one.

Purpose

Is one an investor or looking for a home to live in? Depending on the intended use for the property, the buying criteria may be somewhat different. Investors usually are planning to either rent the property or resell it. The primary consideration is positive cash flow, or the ability to profit from a resale.

Owner-occupant buyers who intend to buy a foreclosed home to live in are not concerned about rental cash flow. Their priorities are correlated to the size of the home and the location. They too should be very mindful of other criteria that will have a big impact on the purchase after it is completed.

Location

If an investor, the most common mistake is location. The property choice should be influenced by an investment plan. If intending to rent the property, choose a home that does not have too much competition in the immediate area.

One of the things that led to a high foreclosure rate among investors during the last years of the housing boom was investors who bought properties for rental, in areas where there were already many vacant rentals on the market. It will force rent rates down, or vacancy rate will be higher. If planning to resell, the same rule applies. A property may look very cheap, but if there is too much competition for rental or resale, it is going to reduce cash flow or force to lower the selling price.

Owner-occupants need to choose locations occupied by more owner-occupants then there are tenants. Buying a home to live in, in an area with lots of rental properties, will likely cause the home value to remain lower. Preferably, stay in an area that is made up of a high majority of owner-occupants. This will help ensure that the property value will remain stable or go up, not down.

Afford

Investors want positive cash flow. Owner-occupants need affordable payments. Investors should know before buying, what the rental rate or resale value would be. Then determine an offer price that insures costs will not exceed the likely cash flow or resale value.


Owner-occupants should

qualify themselves based on their take-home pay not gross income. For a mortgage that is comfortable and affordable, try not to exceed 36% of take home pay for a monthly payment. One may qualify for more, but this could lead to financial problems down the road. Have a monthly payment firmly in mind when shopping and making offers. Do not let agents or lenders tempt to borrow more than you can afford. Buying a foreclosed home in a good location, with a monthly payment that is affordable will result in less stress and more happiness in a new home.




