Charlevoix County lost a good friend last week BY KAREN WALKER


Charlevoix County lost a very good and very popular friend early Friday morning February 16th.

Patrick Harmon of Boyne City died unexpectedly at Munson Medical Center in Traverse City.

Pat was a friend to everyone and everyone's friend. A Boyne area native and lifelong resident, Pat grew up on the farm that his father was born and raised on in Boyne Valley Township. He graduated from Boyne Falls High School and started working at the Charlevoix County Road Commission in 1986 as a truck driver and mechanic, subsequently becoming a road foreman. But he was best known as Road Commission manager after being appointed in 1997 during a low point in the organization which faced a multitude of problems, including public relations, fiscal management, and employee relations.

Under his management, the many problems he inherited were addressed and corrected, using his forethought and friendly manner. The public as well as township governments and employees recognized and appreciated his leadership. His mechanical ability, knowledge of heavy equipment, and familiarity with the county were a valuable asset to the Road Commission.

While refining the Road Commission's image and efficiency, Pat was the spark that ignited one of

Charlevoix County's most appreciated programs: the county-wide road millage. His appeal to the County Board of Commissioners was a success, with the result that the main county roads are now on their way to being the best in Northern Michigan. Preceding his retirement in 2022, Pat paved the way for a successor to replace him and provided guidance during the transition.

Not one to rest after a life of public service, after he retired, Pat ran for County Commissioner in 2022 and successfully won the largest district in the county. Pat's untimely death will now deny those residents the contributions to the community that a native son could provide.

Retirement was supposed to give him time to enjoy his many hobbies and passion for engaging people at a more leisurely pace. He was a long-time NRA member and enjoyed hunting, fishing, and spending time with friends and family at the hunting cabin he helped hand-build. That cabin was a popular place for his many friends to gather. Pat regularly hosted large gatherings at the cabin. It was a popular spot, especially during hunting season. Pat was also well known for his skills in small engine repair, working out of a small shop at his home. Pat meant so much to so many.

Pat leaves behind an extended family and countless friends. His funeral was held Wednesday, February 21, 2024, at St. Matthews Catholic Church in Boyne



Heather loves our Charlevoix community. As she says, "This is where I belong."





AG Nessel Re-Issues IRS Scam Alert After Fraudulent Emails Sent in Her Name

LANSING – Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel wants consumers to be on the lookout for scam emails that may contain her name. It has been recently reported to the Department of Attorney General's Consumer Protection Team that bad actors are sending emails purporting to be from Nessel. The email claims to offer help with scammers attempting to steal the recipient's tax refund. However, the emails themselves are a scam.

The attorney general's duties protecting and serving the people of Michigan do not include collecting or facilitating the collection of federal tax debt, so her name would never be attached to a debt collection email. Nessel has re-issued her IRS Phone and Email Tax Scams alert to remind

consumers of how these scams look and sound.

"Each year at tax time, bad actors appear out of the woodwork to scam hard-working consumers out of their tax refund," Nessel said. "Remember, government agencies rarely ask for personal information by phone or email. These calls and emails should be reported immediately. My Consumer Protection Team stands ready to offer resources and advice when needed."

In the scam email, the person writing from a fake "Attorney Dana Nessel" email address claims to have received information that the recipient had complained about their tax refund. The fake attorney general goes on to ask the taxpayer, "Are you dealing with scammers? If so,

kindly get back to me with the letter whereas, scammers are going to cost a huge amount of debt that you can't even complete it through your entire living..."

Readers will notice the broken English and incorrect tenses, which are important clues to the email's lack of authenticity. Additionally, the emails are purportedly being sent from a gmail account, not an official state or federal email address.

Nessel also wants to inform the public about what the IRS will never do. As the alert points out, the IRS will never:

- Demand immediate payment.
- Demand payment without any chance to appeal or dispute the amount due.

- Threaten to have you arrested.
- Require payment in the form of a gift card, prepaid debit card, or wire

transfer.

• Call, text, or email you and ask for your personal or financial information.





Increase Expectations Gradually

Dear Dave,

I'm getting married this summer and about to become a stepmom. To be honest, I'm a little worried about the family dynamic. My fiancé's daughter from an earlier marriage seems a bit irresponsible. She's 23, has trouble holding a job and still lives at home. She seems to expect her dad to step in when she doesn't have money for her car payment. We both agree he has been too lenient with her in the past. He wants to change things, but neither of us believe suddenly pulling the rug out from under her is a good idea. Do you have any advice for handling this situation?

Dear Susie,

If you and her dad really want to show her you love her, you'll make sure she starts learning some character and discipline. It'll take a little time at this point, and it's very important that both of you are in agreement every step of the way.

Marriage counselors say you have a good chance of a successful marriage if you're in agreement on four things—religion, money, children and in-laws. I know you and your fiancé love each other, but I'd strongly suggest you two go through pre-marital counseling to make sure you're on the same page when it comes to handling this and other issues.

After that, I'd recommend letting her dad present any changes to her initially. Neither of you wants to create a scenario where you're viewed as a villain. Let her dad start the process by explaining

that he feels he made a few mistakes in terms of teaching her personal responsibility when she was younger. Then, he can begin to lay out the first few expectations.

In my opinion, there's nothing wrong with requiring her to get a job within 30 days, if she doesn't already have one. If she needs to go job hunting, the process should be an everyday thing, because if she's unemployed, finding work needs to be her job—her full-time job. It would also be a good time to start teaching her about budgeting, saving and everything else that goes into handling money responsibly.

Phase two might consist of requiring her to help around the house doing chores, or whenever help is needed. After a couple of months of this, phase three might be where she is introduced to the practice of paying a very small amount in rent each month.

Do you see what I'm doing, Susie? By stepping up expectations gradually, you're building a foundation so she'll have the tools and knowledge—to where in the sixth or seventh month—she's able to move out and live like a fully-functioning adult should.



GAM Club Services Representative of the Year Dennis "Marty" Joy

FARMINGTON HILLS - Belvedere Golf Club's head golf professional, Dennis "Marty" Joy, concentrates on treating everybody the same.

"We have a national membership from out-ofstate that is here for three months in the summer, then we have season-ticket holders, mostly our local people who play in the spring and fall, and then we have guests of the club and we try to help them and treat them all like they are special," he said. "Nobody gets treated differently, and it works out well in the end because everybody is having a positive experience."

Joy, 53, a professional at Belvedere since 1999 and the head golf professional since 2008, has been named the 2024 Golf Association of Michigan Club Services Representative of the Year. The GAM annually presents the honor to a club representative who demonstrates outstanding service to golf in Michigan.

"I'm very appreciative and kind of surprised," he said. "I haven't won many awards along the way. I've won some golf tournaments, but not many awards. This is new territory for me."

A group of four Belvedere and GAM members nominated Joy. Tom Rex, a Charlevoix resident and one of the nominating members, said Joy is a friendly ambassador of Belvedere.

"I'm originally from Detroit, grew up and played golf down there, and now I'm in Charlevoix, but when I go back to Detroit or anywhere and Belvedere gets mentioned it's always with Marty's name," he said. "Marty is everybody's friend every place I go. I think it's because there is never a hint of conflict with him. He treats everybody so well and he does it day after day."

Rex said Joy is also instrumental in junior golf in Charlevoix.

"We have 80 to 100 kinds in the junior program and Marty goes out each year to play 100 holes of golf and with that raises 75 percent of our budget," he said. "That's just one of the things he does to keep golf growing. He's always helping the high school kids, the Evans Scholars, all sorts of good things happen with Marty around."

Joy, who can be found spring through fall at Belvedere, spends a few months during the winter in Florida. He was born in Ann Arbor while his father was in medical school and at age three the family moved to Charlevoix. He grew up a competitive golfer, though he only played Belvedere a few times.

He played professional tour golf for several years while also working at a selection of clubs, including notable stops at Merion Golf Club in Pennsylvania, Innisbrook Resort in Florida and Carlton Oaks in California.

"When I came back here in '99 I was familiar with Belvedere and I did know some of the members growing up, played golf and tennis with them, so it wasn't a big transition to working at the club," he said. "The head pro then, Steve Braun, put me in charge of the customer service and merchandising end of things while he did more of the teaching, that kind of thing. That worked for me. I feel like I excel in that end of things. Even today, I handle that end and bring in others to do instruction and a few other things."

In addition to serving Belvedere, Joy is well known in hickory golf circles as both a gifted player and an ambassador to the historic aspect of the game. Over 40 members of Belvedere play hickory-shafted clubs and in competition dress in the throwback appropriate apparel of knickers, ties and jackets.

Belvedere, a William Watson design dating to 1925, and host to the Michigan Amateur Championship a record 40 times, is a popular venue for the throwback game of hickory golfers. In 2023 the club hosted the international Hickory Grail Matches and has hosted the Belvedere Hickory Open since 2006 and in 2019 hosted the national U.S. Hickory Open.

Joy, who won in team and singles competition last summer in the Hickory Grail win by the U.S. team over Europe, said the renovation and restoration work by architect Bruce Hepner and Rick Grunch, a former longtime superintendent, has been a tremendous success.

"It's back to the original intent of the design and we're really excited to have the Michigan Amateur back here again next year (2025) in the centennial year of the club," he said. "The golfers who have played here before will see a course that's very different from what they remember."

Rex said Joy will make sure the Michigan Amateur and the golfers playing in it feel right at home.

"It's just what Marty does," he said.



Celebrating women in STEM careers Spotlight on DNR fisheries staff

As March is Women's History Month, it's a great time to celebrate women who are making history in the field of science.

While women remain underrepresented in STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) careers – constituting 48% of the total U.S. workforce but only 34% of the STEM workforce, according to the most recent State of Girls and Women in STEM report from the National Girls Collaborative Project – that gap is closing.

U.S. Census Bureau data shows that about 50 years ago, in 1970, women made up 38% of all U.S. workers but only 8% of STEM workers.

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources recently spotlighted, on DNR social media channels, some of the dedicated, accomplished women who help Michigan's fisheries thrive, and what inspired them to pursue their passion. In honor of International Day of Women and Girls in Science, which took place Feb. 11, the post featured these employees' reflections on why they got into the field of science.

"I went into the biological sciences field, because even as a young girl I had a strong curiosity about the natural world and especially water," said Sara Thomas, manager of the DNR Fisheries Division's Lake Erie Management Unit.

There are eight fisheries management units across Michigan, each responsible for setting regulations and making decisions for the waters in their portion of the state, both inland and Great Lakes. Each unit has fisheries biologists and technicians who do

research, conduct surveys, work with fish hatcheries to make stocking decisions, set fishing regulations and work with their area research stations, all contributing to sound decision-making on how to manage Michigan's fisheries.

"Now I can still pick up river rocks to see what aquatic insects are hiding underneath or catch fish, but I'm collecting valuable data and getting paid to do something I love!" Thomas said.

Jen Johnson is a fisheries biologist in the Northern Lake Michigan Management

"I was born and raised in the U.P., and as a kid I always loved being everywhere there was water and woods. I knew I wanted to be a fish biologist in third grade when I read a book about animals that live in the water," Johnson said.

DNR fisheries biologists have a bachelor's degree in fisheries biology, fisheries management, aquatic biology or zoology. Their job description includes ensuring that the state's fisheries are appropriately maintained and that environmental conditions are suitable for the respective species.

"My curiosity about the aquatic world grew over time, and I think that what makes a great scientist always asking questions," Johnson said. "I love my career, and it is so rewarding for me to help manage the area I grew up in and to make sure it's there for future generations to enjoy!"

Nicole Sherretz, lab technician at Platte River State Fish Hatchery in Beulah, echoed Johnson's sentiments about a fascination with fish from a young age and a desire to ensure conservation of Michigan's natural resources well into the future.

"Growing up fishing and hunting was a staple in our household; I happened to fall in love with everything

about fish. So many of my fondest memories revolve around fishing with my family or solo trips," Sherretz said. "I want to be a part of managing and helping sustain our amazing resources for generations to come."

Platte River is one of six DNR fish hatcheries, where fish eggs are hatched and the fry (baby fish) are raised, mostly to stock lakes, streams and ponds.

Another one, Wolf Lake State Fish Hatchery in Mattawan, is where Sadie Hallock works as a fisheries technician, whose duties include management support activities to protect, develop and maintain fish species for environmental and recreational purposes.

"I grew up camping and fishing, and that's what led me to become very interested in pursuing an education and eventually a career in the field of fisheries," Hallock said. "I love working hands-on at one of Michigan's state fish hatcheries, raising fish that get to be stocked throughout the state. There is also the opportunity to go into the field to collect eggs or help other units with surveys."

Lydia Doerr is a fisher-

ies technician at the DNR Marquette Fisheries Research Station, whose staff conducts research and stock assessments on fish populations of Lake Superior and northern Lake Michigan.

"My love of science is as complex as the subject itself, and I cannot point to one moment that captured my heart," Doerr said. "I was drawn to fisheries as it provides never-ending opportunities to appease my insatiable curiosity, while allowing me to work with fascinating animals in stunning locations with wonderful people."





What is Escrow?

Escrow is a process that begins when the purchase offer papers are signed by both parties, and ends when the loan is approved and all the necessary requirements have been fulfilled by both the buyer and the seller.

The escrow holder is an intermediary, and an agent of both the buyer

and seller. The escrow holder is given the buyer's deposit, and holds onto all funds until the agreement is finalized. They notify the seller when the deposit has been received and if the check has cleared the bank.

The escrow holder also draws up a set of instructions, itemizing things that have to be done to the property before it is sold and the title is transferred.

For example, if the seller is required to supply a termite inspection, the escrow holder would track this obligation and make it is fulfilled before any funds are transferred to the seller. Findings in the termite inspection report must be corrected on or before the close of escrow. If the report calls for a plumber,

roofer or other contractor, the agent would advise the seller and get authorization for work to be done.

The escrow company is typically the title company.

The escrow/title company provides a complete ownership history of the property and any liens on record in the preliminary title report. Anything that is out of the ordinary, such as condo liens, judgments, etc. against the buyer and the seller must be clarified prior to the close of escrow.

The escrow process can be any number of days depending on what is agreed upon between the buyer and seller. To assure a timely closing, the buyer should do things like inform, the escrow holder of the name and phone number of their insurance agent as soon as possible. The homeowner insurance policy needs to be ordered early, so verification can be made with the lender. The lender will not fund a new loan without a homeowner policy. If there is a delay, the escrow process may be held up.
