EJ Shoe Club's "Honor & Service" project

The East Jordan Shoe Club is close to completing the goals of its Honor & Service Project to recognize area military veterans. The project, centered around inspiring, educating, and expressing gratitude, aims to honor veterans and foster a sense of appreciation within the community.

Last August the Shoe Club, consisting of 31 East Jordan middle school students and six high school student mentors, began an ambitious project to help the East Jordan American Legion post raise over \$160,000 to fund improvements to East Jordan's GAR Park located at the corner of Main and Williams Streets. The students will also publish a commemorative book featuring interviews with our local veterans, produce videos, and take a major trip to Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, enabling the students to dig deeper into the history of the Civil War. The students are also planning a rededication ceremony for GAR Park this Memorial Day.

Improvements to GAR Park include a pavilion, landscaping, sidewalks, a fence, and signage. The park is also home to a large "honor" star that was fabricated by the school's high school welding class. The park's existing gazebo has also been repainted and relocated to a more prominent

The students hope to raise awareness of the history of GAR Park, which was originally for Civil War veterans. The park will be renamed Grand Army of the Republic

Veterans Park to honor all veterans.

In interviewing veterans for their book, students say they've learned a lot by hearing the veterans' stories first-hand, in a way that cannot be created in a classroom. The students feel not only has the interview process been good for them but they feel it's also been great for the veterans, allowing them to share their stories. Something that was not encouraged for a lot of Vietnam veterans when they first came home from fighting. After telling stories of potentially traumatizing events during wartime, the veterans interviewed by the students expressed how proud they were to serve and would do

Through private and corporate donations and municipal grants, the project is 95% funded. The club still needs help to get to the finish line in time for dedication this spring. The East Jordan Shoe Club was founded in 2008 by Middle School teacher Matt Hamilton who was inspired after listening to a motivational speaker. It is a club for 7th and 8th graders at East Jordan Middle / High School that helps enable middle school students to work hard, dream big, set goals, and give back to their community. 



Gov. Whitmer Signs Bipartisan Bills to Cut Red Tape and Lower Costs for Families

LANSING — To-day, Governor Whit-mer signed unanimous, bipartisan legislation that cuts red tape and lowers costs for families that are transferring assets, like a vehicle or watercraft, when a family member has passed. The new law will ensure values of the title transfers are aligned with the cost of living so that families are not left on the hook for additional costs.

"We shouldn't be placing additional burdens on Michiganders when they lose a loved one. These bills make the transfer vehicle or watercraft that you own to your own family members much simpler, and lower your loved ones' costs," said Governor Whitmer. "With these unanimously passed, bipartisan bills, we are raising the maximum value of such a transfer to

passed, bipartisan bills, we are raising the maximum value of such a transfer to better reflect the current cost of living. Let's keep working together to lower costs for Michiganders with commonsense changes to save them time and money."

Under current law, Michiganders need to go through probate court if a vehicle or watercraft that exceeds current thresholds is transferred to a new family member from a deceased relative. With the cost of goods rising, this added an additional burden for families dealing with the loss of a loved one. The new law will reduce that cost for families who inherit assets by better aligning the threshold level with current values of assets.

House Bill 4416, sponsored by Rep. Graham Filler, amends the Estates and Protected Individuals Code to update certain asset threshold amounts, creates "standby guardians", and inserts safeguards to help protect against inappropriate gifts.

House Bill 4417, also sponsored by Rep. Graham Filler, modifies the maximum value of a transfer of ownership of a vehicle to the surviving spouse or heir after the owner's death, adjusting for the present cost of living.

"These bills will modernize Michigan's probate code, while making our probate laws fairer and easier to understand," says state Representative Graham Filler (R-Duplain Township). "I am proud to work on bipartisan legislation that improves the lives

of Michiganders."

House Bill 4418, sponsored by Rep. Kelly Breen, amends the value of money, securities, and insurance transfers allowed to minors.

House Bill 4419, also sponsored by Rep. Kelly Breen, increases the maximum value for the issuance of a certificate of title for the transfer of a watercraft from a deceased owner's interest, adjusting for the present cost of living.

"Grieving the loss of a loved one is hard enough without having to endure litigation over inherited property. That's what these bills will help avoid," said state Representative Kelly Breen (D-Novi), chair of the House Judiciary Committee. "I'm proud of the bipartisan work we've done to help Michigan families avoid Probate Court and make a difficult time just a little easier."

The governor also signed House Bills 4325 and 4845.

House Bill 4325, sponsored by Rep. Helena Scott, increases fines and penalties for large amounts of illegal littering.

"The signage of the illegal dumping bill by Governor Whitmer is a major victory in creating a

better environment for all Michiganders," said state Representative Helena Scott (D-Detroit). "Polluters will not be able to abandon land and buildings, creating blight, without consequence. The increased fines and penalties send a clear message: We're putting the health and safety of our ecosystem and the people of Michigan first. If you pollute, it will cost you."

House Bill 4845, sponsored by Rep. William Bruck, designates a portion of M-125 in Monroe County, as the "Captain Joseph M. Liedel Memorial Highway".

"For 28 years CPT Joe Liedel selfishly served not only his community, but also the victims of the attack on New York City, in September 2001," said state Representative William Bruck (R-Erie). "He loved what he did and I'm certain if he could come back from the grave would do it all over again, and he would not want to be honored. However, for the sake of his family and our communities, it is fitting he be forever honored for his enduring legacy of service."

I had read the book before, but this time, with a focused intent, I dove back into Chapter 8.

What followed was a transformative period where I began to immerse myself in everything associated with that leadership role. I visualized it, breathed it, and lived it in my mind. When I returned to my coach, I confidently declared, "I've decided to do it, but I don't know how." His response has stayed with me ever since, quoting Les Brown: "The how is none of your business."

I achieved my goal. That book, that coach,









My Wife Thinks She Owes Me Money

Dear Dave,

My wife and I have been married for nine months, and we've been following your Baby Steps plan for three months. We have about \$50,000 in debt, and I recently cashed out an old whole life policy that enabled us to pay off \$22,000 of our debt. My wife still feels weird about us doing that, since the money paid off all the student loan debt she accumulated before we got married but none of the debt I brought to the marriage. I look at everything as ours, not mine and hers. What can I do about her sense of guilt and feeling indebted to me?

Dear Anonymous,

This isn't an uncommon thing in situations like yours. But more than feeling indebted to someone or experiencing a sense of guilt or shame, it's really a discussion about differing views of marriage.

You're never in debt to your spouse. You should be all in where your husband or wife is concerned. Remember the vows? For richer, for poorer. In sickness and in health. If she makes you chicken soup when you're sick, does she charge you for it? Of course not. When you get married, you agree to take on each other's burdens.

Once you walk down the aisle with someone, you're choosing to serve each other. You're also choosing to take on each other's debt, each other's income, each other's assets and each other's crazy parents. Everything!

It all boils down to having a shared view of a proper marriage relationship. And the proper (and biblical) view is we own everything. There's no mine and yours anymore. Now, you can't make her feel—or not feel—a certain way. But you can ask her questions to understand where she's coming from and what blockers are keeping her from being totally together in this. Talk about it. Put your heads together and practice thinking about your marriage as a union.

It will take some encouragement from you and some getting used to on her part, but if you work together, it's a muscle you can grow and develop together!



VETERAN OF THE MONTH

Garland Evertt Crumbacher

The Veteran of the Month for March 2024 is Garland Evertt Crumbacher. Born April 19, 1918 in North Lima, Ohio to parents Henry and Lottie Crumbacher. Garland grew up in Northeast Ohio just south of Youngstown. He was very active in high school athletics, lettering in basketball and track. After graduation he decided to take over the family business of raising cattle, horses and produce on their 160 acre farm, and enrolled in agriculture extension classes. His plans were cut short when he received his draft notice and was ordered to report to Fort Hayes, Ohio for induction into the United States Army on June 2, 1941. After basic training he was assigned to Company B, 413th Infantry, 104th Infantry Division called the "Timberwolves". Receiving special training to become Night Fighters, his unit was then sent to the European Theater of Operations arriving in Cherbourg, France on August 24, 1944. By then Garland had been given the rank of

15, under the command of General "Terrible" Terry Allen, the 104th Division was directed to Holland to secure the Port of Antwerp. On October 23rd they engaged in a two-week battle against the German Army called the "Battle of the Dykes". On November 3rd,

during this engagement, Staff Sargent Crumbacher was severely wounded by machine gun fire. Because of fierce fighting, his comrades could not evacuate him from the battlefield for 22 hours. Once evacuated Garland was sent to a hospital in Paris France,

and later to a hospital in southern England. On December 12, 1944 he was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds received in Action. Garland arrived back to the United States on February 19, 1945, and then married Sara Jane Petermen on April 2, 1945. On May 16, 1945 at Percy Jones Hospital Center, Camp Custer, Michigan, Garland was given an Honorable Discharge and awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge, European African Middle Eastern Theatre

During his rehabilitation, doctors recommended that he keep physically active and suggested that farming would be an ideal choice of employment. Garland and Sara Jane purchased his parents farm and along with their sons Gary and Ron raised Herford cattle until 1971. Garland continued working as a machinist for the Sperry-Vickers Corporation in Salem Ohio. On April 18, 1979, Garland Evertt Crumbacher answered the final call and is being honored by his Son Gary and Family.

Health Department of Northwest Michigan Receives Positive Ratings in New Opinion Survey

Seventy percent of residents in Antrim, Charlevoix, Emmet and Otsego counties have a favorable opinion of the Health Department of Northwest Michigan. The number includes 30 percent who have a strongly favorable

Staff Sargent. On October

The positive results me from a public opinion survey conducted from January 28 through February 1 by an independent public opinion and market research firm. "A 70 percent favorable rating is very impressive in today's world," said Charlie MacInnis, president of Friends of HDNW, a non-profit group based in Harbor Springs which funded the survey.

Not only do residents have a favorable opinion of the Health Department overall, they view it as an important part of the community. When asked whether they agree or disagree that the department provides important services for the community, 86 percent said they strongly or somewhat agree with the statement.

The survey of 400 adults in the four counties also found that the Health Department of Northwest Michigan is viewed as a trustworthy agency. Seventy percent of surveyed residents said they agree that they can trust the agency, with more than one-third, 35 percent, indicating that

they strongly agree that the Health Department is an agency they can trust.

In addition to favorable opinions and high trust ratings, job performance ratings for the Health Department staff were also positive. When asked to rate the overall job performance of the Health Department, two-thirds of northwest Michigan residents gave a positive rating. The overall quality of the staff was rated positively by 71 percent of those surveyed; the overall quality of the services provided was given a positive rating by 67 percent; and the overall quality of the clinics was rated positively by 66 percent of residents.

Providing vaccines and immunizations for people of all ages is a service that was rated positively by 64 percent of residents.

The agency's communication with the public received the lowest rating with only 49 percent rating its communication with the community excellent or good. However, 81 percent of residents indicated they are at least somewhat familiar with the Health Department. "Our non-profit group is prepared to provide assistance where needed to ensure maximum public awareness, acceptance and use of the Health Department's vital services in our community," said MacInnis.

The eight-member Board

of Health, the agency's governing body, received a positive rating of 52 percent.

Sixty percent of residents said that they rarely or never utilize its services. When asked the main reason for not utilizing the Health Department's services, the primary reasons provided were that they believe they do not need the agency's services or are unaware of the services

A narrow majority, 56 percent, gave the Health Department a positive rating for its handling of the COVID-19 pandemic. The most positive ratings came from two groups. Sixty-two percent of senior citizen respondents, and 65 percent of higher income respondents rated the agency's response good or excellent.

The Health Department was considered a reliable and trustworthy source of information on things like masking and vaccinations during the pandemic by 64 percent of those surveyed. Women and high-income respondents gave even higher scores, at 67 and 72 percent respectively.

Friends of HDNW is an independent non-profit group created by community members last year in response to controversies surrounding the agency caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. To ensure maximum

independence, the survey was conducted without the involvement of Health Department staff or members of the Board of Health. The non-profit group employed EMC Research, a national public opinion and market research firm to conduct the

The multi-modal survey ncluded live telephone interviews and email/text invitations to complete the survey online. Telephone interviews via landline and mobile phones were conducted by professional interviewers. Survey respondents were demographically and geographically representative of residents in northwest Michigan. The overall margin of error for the poll was ± 4.9 percentage points.

Closing Costs

First, the responsibility of who pays for closing costs is always negotiable. Local custom may dictate which fees the buyer will pay and those the seller pays

those the seller pays. Typically, the buyer pays for home inspection services and escrow, deed preparation and recording fees, depending upon what is customary for the county the property is located in. He or she may also pay for title insurance, since this is required by the lender. The buyer is also responsible for any fees or costs associated with obtaining the purchase loan.

The seller customarily pays the real estate agent's commission, as well as costs associated with transferring an unencumbered title, such as a title search, reconveyance deed and documentary transfer

Often, a seller will sweeten the deal by offering a one-year home warranty.

Who will pay for what closing costs customarily differs from county to county and should always be clearly spelled out in the purchase offer. A creative sales associate will consider the cash, income and tax situation of the home seller and the buyer when constructing an offer. For instance, if the buyer is short of cash, the agent may ask the seller to pay the buyer's loan points up front in exchange for some other concessions from the buyer. In this scenario, the buyer and seller benefit and both get what they want.
