

With the exception of Arizona and Hawaii, every state will change its clocks an hour ahead at 2 a.m. on Sunday.

The reason for daylight saving time is to shift an hour of daylight from the morning to the evening. Governments implemented daylight saving time as a measure to conserve energy.





Many businesses and nonprofits have goals relating solely to financial results.


Certainly, we must have growth and profitability goals. Recognize though, that we achieve our goals thanks to our team members.

In 2008, after my husband and I lost our jobs, I experienced a profound shift in my mindset. From an 'I can do anything' attitude, I found myself grappling with a shaken confidence and a sense of being lost.

At the time, I was part of the John Maxwell coaching program. One of our assignments was to practice coaching with fellow trainees. In one of our sessions, after sharing my feelings of loss and diminished self-worth, my coach made an observation that became a turning point for me. He said, "It sounds like you no longer consider yourself worthy." This statement struck a chord with me, capturing exactly how I felt.

He then suggested a powerful exercise in visualization. He encouraged me to envision myself at the top again – as a woman standing triumphantly on a mountain peak or at the top of a ladder. I repeated the mantra, "I'm going to the tippy-top," and surrounded myself with these images - on my car's rearview mirror, bathroom mirrors, the refrigerator, and even tucked inside drawers and beneath pillows.

This simple act of visualization slowly but surely

rebuilt my confidence. Today, I feel unstoppable once again. But whenever I sense a dip in my confidence, I return to those affirmations and visualizations.

Remember, none of us should ever feel unworthy but rather embrace our intrinsic value and potential. Until next time, dear readers, believe you are enough, and watch your life transform.

Amid the warmest winter on record, with days in February and March topping 60 degrees, federal Economic Injury Disaster Loans are available because of ongoing federal drought declarations affecting 42 Michigan counties.

"Michiganders are used to tough winters, but this year's record-setting warm winter has been tough in a different way, causing economic hardships for small businesses and regional economies that rely on snow," said Governor Whitmer. "I know how hard this winter has been on families and communities who rely on winter tourism revenue and all the associated business that comes with it-hotels, restaurants, and shops. Fortunately, businesses in these 42 counties in the UP and the Northern Lower Peninsula can apply for support right now. A drought is a droughtwhether we're talking about rain or snow. Businesses impacted by low snow in these 42 counties can apply for support right now, and I'll continue to push our federal government for more solutions. Sen. Hoitenga stands against bill to remove voters' voice in inland lake level management

LANSING — State Sen. Michele Hoitenga on Wednesday said no to legislation to remove voter decision making over certain special assessments for inland lake districts.

"While there is a real need to address the issues caused by the impact of weather on fluctuating lake levels, this legislation goes too far by circumventing the voice of the voters living in these special assessment districts," said Hoitenga, R-Manton. "There are many inland lake communities across northern lower Michigan and the people, not bureaucrats, should have the final say on these special tax assessments."

Senate Bill 662 seeks to amend the definition of a normal inland lake level and the process for financing a "normal level project," removing voter approval for special assessment districts of \$600,000 or less.

Record-Breaking Winter

- 16% of the Great Lakes froze over this winter, compared to 53% normally.
- Marquette has seen 72.6 inches of snow this season, compared to 127 inches on average.

- The Tahquamenon Country Sled Dog Race in Newberry was cancelled due to weather.
- Detroit reached 73 degrees on February 27, the hottest February day in recorded history—dating back to 1874.
- Snowfall in Grand Rapids is more than three feet—36 inches—below the seasonal average.

"It's all hands on deck to ensure our small businesses affected by the unseasonable lack of snow across the First District are able to make it through this tough winter," said U.S. Representative Jack Bergman. funds," said state Senator Ed McBroom (R-Vulcan). "Winter will be back next year, and we want these shops to be open and ready to serve the visitors who come to the UP."

"This winter has been especially hard on our businesses that rely on snow. From ski hills to hotels and restaurants, many businesses I've spoken to are concerned whether they can even make it to the summer," said state Senator John Damoose (R-Harbor Springs). "Thank you to all who took the time to meet with us and to the Governor for working with the Small Business Administration to help make special low-interest EIDL loans available. I encourage all of our businesses to move quickly to secure this critical support."

"The lack of snow this winter has had a profound impact on our local seasonal economies and the people who depend on them, especially in the U.P.," said state Representative Jenn Hill (D-Marquette). "I appreciate the governor encouraging Michigan's small businesses to take advantage of the aid that's available. We all want to ensure our communities remain resilient in the face of these unexpected challenges."

"Michiganders up north know that getting through the winter means pulling together. That's true during unusually warm winters, too," said state Representative Betsy Coffia (D-Traverse City). Drought Designation

42 Michigan counties are covered by a disaster designation for drought from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Through SBA declarations related to those designations, businesses in these counties may be eligible for emergency loans that offset their business losses if the loss is related to the drought.



SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans

SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans are designed to help businesses through disaster situations that have impacted their economic well-being. Loans are up to \$2 million to help meet financial obligations and operating expenses that could have been met had the disaster not occurred. Businesses pay no interest on the loan for the first year and a maximum rate of 4% for the rest of the loan period. Businesses must apply by the application deadline for their county.

Take Control of Your Mind and Money

Dear Dave,

I'm trying to work my way out of debt, but it seems like something always happens to stall things or knock me backwards. I make \$55,000 a year, I'm single and I have \$15,000 in debt, along with a mortgage payment of \$1,224 a month. I've been trying to live on a budget, but I'm still not sure where all my money goes. Can you help?

-Lindley

Dear Lindley,

I know living on a budget can be hard at first. And honestly, it usually takes folks who are new to doing it about three or four months of practice before they start getting it right and seeing the results.

For starters, your house payment is a little heavy for someone making \$55,000 a year. I generally recommend keeping your mortgage or rent payment at about 25% of your take-home pay. Sometimes you can slide by paying a little more, but in those cases, you'd really have to be on top of your finances. So, the biggest thing you can do right now is take control of your money, instead of letting it-or a lack of it-control you. And the best way to make all this happen is by consistently living on a realistic, written monthly budget. Once you start doing this, you've taken your first big step toward

having a real gameplan for your money. At that point, the idea of trying to live on a budget ends, and the fact that you are living on a budget, and telling your money what to do—instead of a lack of it dictating what you can do—becomes more of a reality.

Remember the Star Wars movie "The Empire Strikes Back"? At one point during Luke's training, Yoda tells him, "Do, or do not. There is no try." In a larger sense, Yoda is urging Luke to focus and work harder, instead of continuing with half-hearted attempts and giving up easily. If you want to accomplish a difficult task, Lindley, you have to throw yourself into it completely. You must fully commit, and stop making excuses. You have to focus, and fight to

make it happen. It's no fun waking up broke at the end of every pay period. We both know this. So, put your head down and get your mind in gear. Make. This. Happen.


