



Dr. William "Bill" Harvey Millar, 87 (April 21, 1936 - March 4, 2024) PETOSKEY

Bill Millar (formally known as William Harvey Millar) passed away at home on Monday, March 4, 2024 at the age of 87. The son of the late William Harvey Millar and Edith Elma Ellis, he was born on Tuesday, April 21, 1936 in Mt. Clemens, Michigan. Bill always enjoyed referencing the fact that he shared a birthday with Queen Elizabeth II.

Bill graduated from Mt. Clemens High School in June 1954 and from The University of Michigan in August 1958 with a Bachelor of Science Degree and again in August 1962 with a Master of Science Degree in Dentistry. In June 1963 he entered the U.S. Army as a captain with the responsibility "of fighting tooth decay," as Bill would say. He was a lifetime member of The University of Michigan Alumni Association

Upon completion of his time of service in the U.S. Army, Bill returned to Mt. Clemens, where he joined his father's dental practice for three years. He then returned to The University of Michigan, where he received his Master of Science Degree in Orthodontics. In 1972, Bill moved to Petoskey, Michigan where he set up his practice in Orthodontics until his retirement in 2014. It gave Bill great satisfaction to know that he played a role in improving his patients' quality of life. He was a lifetime member of the American Association of Orthodontics and the American Dental Association. Bill had several hobbies and interests. He thoroughly enjoyed building and flying remote control airplanes, and he had his pilot's license. He even dabbled in driving remote control cars and boats. Being a potter gave him hours and hours of satisfaction; it also gave family and friends many pieces of pottery. He found pleasure in going to concerts and listening to jazz music, particularly musicians such as Miles Davis, Dave Brubeck, Charlie Parker and Art Blakey. He was particularly fond of Ella Fitzgerald's voice. He even gave acting a shot by appearing in two Bay View productions: On Golden Pond and Blithe Spirit. Perhaps Bill's greatest pleasure came from his involvement with Crooked Tree Arts Center (CTAC). Not only was he a past Chairman of the Board of Directors, he served on numerous committees, such as Performing Arts and Visual Arts. What he enjoyed most of all was actively participating in hanging the art work for all of the shows. With his hammer, nails and measuring tools, he was in "hog heaven." In 2016, Bill and his wife Jane received the Arts & Cultural Leadership eddi Award from CTAC.

Above all, Bill loved his family. Even though he would not admit it, one of his favorite times was when all of the children and grandchildren would get together. Bill was preceded in death by his parents and his son James Harvey Millar. Surviving Bill are his wife Dr. Jane Millar; two daughters Karen Marie Kendall married to Dr. Rich Kendall, Kathryn (Kathy) Ann Millar and son David Russell Millar; two blended family sons Mitchell (Mitch) Byron Franseth, Gregory (Greg) Scott Franseth and one blended family daughter Mistelle (Misty) Langen; six grandchildren Garrett Wesley Langen-Muir, Roya Irene Franseth, Karina Jane Langen, Anthony Rostam Franseth, Cosmo Franseth, Ezra Michel Franseth; and Bill's brother James Millar and his wife Beth.

COMMUNITY LEADER JO ANNE BEEMON MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN OUR WORLD

Jo Anne Beemon describes herself as a lifelong activist, and she surely is! All for important and worthy causes, causes that will help make our world better!

Jo Anne was appreciative that Melissa Agawa recommended that we meet. She thinks very highly of Melissa and though they have not done a ton of community work together, when Jo Anne is standing on the southeast corner of Bridge and Clinton with signs and eager to speak with folks about key issues, especially we need to stop wars, we need peace and justice. Melissa will stop by to at least express her appreciation, which says a lot about each of them. In fact, I now think about how often I walk by that corner without even a friendly hello. Shame on me!

For over 20 years, Jo Anne and peace friends, have been vigiling for peace every Friday. At times, standing on that corner can be very cold. It is then JoAnne remembers the innocent victims of war who cannot feed or keep their babies warm. Jo Anne remembers, the combat of the war itself, the loss of lives, the wounds suffered, as well as the bitter cold. So, to Jo Anne and the Peace Women, they must handle cold.

Born in Ada, Michigan, Jo Anne attended schools there and attended a liberal church, which influenced her at an early age, as the church taught and encouraged "Look at all sides."

There were numerous field trips and Jo Anne got to meet known leaders, including Eleanor Roosevelt, Attorney General Bobby Kennedy, Ralph Nader, and others. Kennedy influenced her (to this day) when he said "You can make our world better! We must work together." That is a message our country certainly needs today! Jo Anne graduated Grand Valley State University, focused on Philosophy and Social Sciences. She worked with thalidomide children at Mary Free Bed. On Saturdays, Jo Anne joined other students in visiting Gerry Ford's office in Grand

Rapids to lobby and picket against the Vietnam War. She attended peace marches in Washington DC with Quakers and stood at the wall as Veterans with haunted eyes threw their metals over the White House fence. She joined her Mother in marches for the Equal **Rights Amendment and** many years later against the war in Iraq with her daughter and joined in the Climate March in New York.

In 1974, Jo Anne moved to Charlevoix and worked at East Jordan Developmental Needs. She also campaigned to limit the environmental dangers of the Big Rock Nuclear Plant and to protect wetlands.

In its early years, Jo Anne worked for the Women's Resource Center. For over 25 years, she visited and mentored women in jail, most of whom are poor. She wants to assure them that Creator loves and cares for them. For over 15 vears Jo Anne chaired the Charlevoix Lake to Lake Trail, bringing the Cement Plant, Community, GTB, snowmobile club and City and Township together to build the trail. Jo Anne is married, has five daughters and a son. She was active with Girl Scouts, children's choirs, and First Congregational Church. With local conservancies, JoAnne helped make SCL-SML Natural Area, a 25 year ongoing project, near Ellsworth a reality. By knocking on doors, bringing doughnuts and coffee to landowners, and even taking potential

supporters out in her rowboat so they could experience the beauty, peace, and silence of the river. When the Brazilian cement plan worked to take Bells Bay Road and Campground for mining, Joanne organized area resistance and with wide community support, Votorantim withdrew its campaign, saving the Northern 240 acres of land for the public.

Jo Anne is a Grandmother Water Protector and is very thankful for spiritual teachings of Anishinaabe friends and the 12 Step Spiritual Program, which helped her gain peace in her own life.

Key issues which Jo Anne focuses on now are:

□ End War. Build Peace. \Box End waste to slow climate change.

 \Box Stop women's abuse. \Box Work on equality and justice.



At most times, the bridge will be open to two-way traffic. Work will require unscheduled intermittent closures to vehicle traffic of less than 10 minutes, a shorter duration than typical openings of the bridge for marine traffic. Until April 1, the bridge

will be closed to marine traffic in the channel that would require the bridge to open.

From April 1 until the project is completed in late May, the channel will reopen to marine traffic while remaining work is finished.

The bridge will return to normal operation for vehicle and marine traffic.

The project, which began in late October, also includes work on the bridge railings, electrical components, joints, curbs, and gutters, all with a goal of extending the 74-year-old bridge's service life and maintain its reliability.

Based on economic modeling, this investment is expected to directly and indirectly support 89 jobs. For Charlevoix bascule bridge updates on construction and anticipated closures, sign up for e-mail notifications.



Dear Dave,

Our son will be graduating from high school in May, and then heading off to college in August. He will also be working during the summer to save up money for school. When classes begin, do you think he should continue working a part-time job, or would it be better for him to focus solely on his studies? – Brenda

Dear Brenda,

There's really nothing wrong with either approach, especially during a kid's first semester in college. As a parent, though, I'd urge you not to fall into the trap of thinking his grades will go down if he holds a job while in school. Research actually shows that, on average, kids who work while in college carry higher grade point averages than those who don't. The reasons for this differ, depending on who you ask, but I think a lot of it has to do with them having to learn to manage their time—and their lives-more effectively. Lots of kids could pay their way through school, and not have to worry about student loans, if they just used some of the time they spend watching television and on social

activities at a job. We never required

our kids to work during the school year, but they were self-starters. And when they came home for the summer, there was no such thing as just lying around the house all day. They had jobs, and they made money. Of course, some of it went toward having a little fun during their time off. But we made sure they set some aside for the next school year, too.

Long story short, the philosophy of not wanting kids at college to work so they can spend all their time studying is well-meaning, but misguided. For the most part, kids who work while they're in school will make better grades and develop into more mature and well-rounded individuals.

When Trauma Comes Home, Part 1 of 3

Kids bring home many things in their lives. Some things are good like friends, good grades, some things are not so much, like germs. Some things are downright awful!

One of those awful things is trauma. Trauma can walk into anyone's home, sometimes without even knowing. It can come in for many reasons at any time. Keep in mind that it may not even be your kids, it could be a friend of your child. Kids don't walk around wearing shirts that say, "I have experienced trauma." Open your doors to these children. They need a safe place in their storm. You may be the only safe place they have. What kind of trauma could be in your home? You name it! It could be abuse, divorce, death, bullies, and so much more. Dealing with trauma can be an overwhelming task. It can take years to deal with. It may be ongoing. No matter what it is, trauma can be devastating to a family. It could even be living in your house. It could be happening right in your own home. Things like divorce or abuse could be happening. This is one of the hardest things to deal with. Home is supposed to be a safe place. What do you do when trauma is happening within the walls of your home? Get help! Get out if you need!



to help cope or deal with what they are facing. When children experience trauma, it is not something that is their fault. There is a reason your child is acting the way they are. Even when teens use drugs or alcohol. They are trying to cope with life. They don't know how because they are children. They need to be taught. The other thing to remember about families going through trauma and crisis is to not judge. You are not in their shoes. You don't know the full story. There are things that are not within the control of a family who is dealing with trauma. Some families it seems to be a never-end-

So, what is a family to do when trauma comes home? First it so acknowledge there is a problem. Talk about the problem Don't hide it and pretend it doesn't exist. That just makes the situation worse.

Depending on what is happening, counseling for family members and or the family as a whole could be needed. It is helpful to have a professional therapist help your family through this time in your lives. Trauma is not something to just ignore. If it is ignored, then it will just get worse. Don't suffer and hope it goes away. Because it won't. Trust me!

There are lots of resources for families in need. All you have to do is look and ask. Don't be afraid to ask for help. Talk to teachers, friends, pastors, and other helpers. They will at least be able to give you a starting point.

Parents worry if their child will recover from trauma. They can if they have supportive adults in their lives. They also need caring adults and helpers Help your child learn to identify and talk about their feelings in a healthy way. This will help you and them be able to figure out what is happening and what needs to be done to get the help they need.

The other thing that will happen is you will see your child have behaviors that are just not who they are normally. They could be having more meltdowns, temper tantrums, and other reactions to what is happening. This is normal given what is happening in your home. You as a parent or adult in the house could also be very well going through your own issues. So, this makes it even harder to deal with. Don't be afraid to ask for help!

Then there are families who take on trauma and hurt children because these children need a safe home. These families foster children who have gone through awful things in their young lives. They take in children that are so hurt and damaged that they can't even function normally day to day. These families take in the trauma, chaos, and drama willingly! ing issue. They seem to be a target for trauma and chaos.

When you help a family who is experiencing trauma, be helpful, not harmful. Ask how you can help. Bring over a meal. Offer to help with kids. Just sit and listen without judgement. Also, don't gossip whatever you do! You wouldn't like it done to you, so don't do it to someone else. Trauma can happen to you just as easily as anyone else.



4 Game win streak comes an end in district final

A bad first quarter but the Charlevoix girls basketball team in a 12-point hole, and it never got any better as Elk Rapids just ran way from the Rayders.

Charlevoix was on a hot streak, having won four straight games coming into the district final against Elk Rapids but sputtered on offense in the first half, some of that due to the Elks defense, and could not recover.

The Elks threw water on the fire, snuffing it out entirely with a 68-28 victory that sent the Elks on to the regional tournament while ending the Ravders season at 14-10. Elk Rapids tied Harbor Springs for the Lake Michigan Conference title with a 13-1 mark, while they bumped their record up to 22-2 with their 10th straight victory. A slow start proved devastating for the Rayders. Elk Rapids held their offense down in the first quarter and built a 16-4 lead. Charlevoix rebounded in the second, but were outscored 19-12 and ended the first half with a substantial, and as it turned out insurmountable 35-16 deficit after starting out slow and then picking up a little steam. Elk Rapids outscored the Rayders 18-12 in the third quarter and started the fourh period with a 53-24 lead and finished the game with a 15-4 run. Abbey Wright scored nine points and took down seven rebounds to lead the Rayders. Bayani Collins contributed six points, and Anna Kemp added six points and three steals.

Red Devils end season in Districts

Slow starts have been an issue for the East Jordan girls basketball team at times this season, and the Red Devils stumbled out of the blocks again in a district semifinal against Elk Rapids last Wednesday and the Elks made them pay with a 46-34 win.

The Elks jumped on the struggling Red Devils in the first quarter, opening up a 15-5 lead. East Jordan continued to be offensively challenged in the second quarter and was outscored, 13-7 to trail 28-12 at the half. East Jordan did play better in the second half, as Smith said, and was outscored only 10-8 in the third period. But the Red Devils still were looking at a 38-20. "They'll be missed," Smith said. "They handled their business with tremendous pride and dedication. The community should be very proud of them, as the coaches are."





You want buyers to imagine their own photos on the walls, and they can't do that if yours are there!

You don't want to make any buyer ask, "I wonder what kind of people live in this home?" You want buyers to say, "I can see myself living here."

3. De-Clutter.

People collect an amazing quantity of junk. Consider this: if you haven't used it in over a year, you probably don't need it.

If you don't need it, why not donate it or throw it away?

- Remove all books from bookcases.
- Pack up those knickknacks.
- Clean off everything on kitchen counters.
- Put essential items used daily in a small box that can be stored in a closet when not in use.

Think of this process as a head-start on the packing you will eventually need to do anyway.


