City Commission visits Lansing before housing meeting on Friday

It's a busy week for the Boyne City Commission! Their regular meeting ended late Tuesday night, but Mayor Tim Nemecek, Commissioner Bob Pearsall, Commissioner Sandy Pritchard and City Manager Mike Cain gathered at City Hall at 4:30 Wednesday morning and drove to Lansing for the Michigan Municipal League's Capital Conference. First up after registration was meeting State Senator John Damoose on legislative issues facing Boyne City. They also met with people here from neighboring communities like East Jordan, Elk Rapids, Traverse City and Sault Saint Marie. Their busy week continues Friday...

HOUSING MEETING

The City Commission will hold a special meeting on housing priorities at 5:30 p.m. Friday, March 15th. The meeting will focus on how to make City-owned properties available for development, including:

- North Boyne Property 11+ acres • Community Garden Site - 3.44 acres
- Industrial Park Property 32 acres

Here is a summary of actions taken at Tuesday's City Commission meeting:

COMMUNITY GARDEN

The City Commission approved a plan to create a Community Garden on city-owned property on Boyce Street at the west end of the Boyne City Airport runway, as recommended by the Airport Commission. Both commissions see this as a "win-win" idea. That end of the runway includes trees that need to be removed to meet FAA flight path guidelines for the airport, and it is possible that the current Community Garden may be made available

TREE ADVISORY GROUP

Approved the Parks and Recreation Commission's request to add a Tree Advisory Group to provide advice on the type and placement of trees on city property.

STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Approved an MDOT contract for \$518,300 in street improvements to be done after Labor Day. A state grant will cover \$248,784 of the cost, leaving \$269,516 as the city's share.

RUBBISH COLLECTION

Approved a \$72,000 contract with American Waste to handle the

with Tip of the Mitt Welding and Fabrication of Boyne City to repair a metal hand rail in Old City Park.

AWARENESS

Approved a recommendation from the Women's Resource Center to proclaim the month of April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in the City of Boyne City. Mayor Nemecek has invited the WRC director to attend a future City Commission meeting to make a presentation on this issue.




National Nutrition Month Eating healthy no matter your income, schedule, or eating habits

- People with healthy eating patterns are likely to live longer and are at lower risk for serious chronic health problems compared to individuals with unhealthy eating habits.
- · Poor nutrition can contribute to many debilitating diseases, including obesity, heart disease, and some cancers.
- Less than one out of every 10 adults and children eat the daily recommended amount of vegetables, four to five a day.
- Four out of 10 children and fewer than one out of 7 adults eat the daily recommended amount of fruits, four to five a day.

Fruits and vegetables are essential to a healthy diet because they provide vitamins and minerals for our bodies. Low levels of vitamin/mineral intake can lead to mental impairment and central nervous system defects in infants.

"Eating healthy can easily be a way of life that involves eating what you like and making it fun," says Judi Marlin, HDNW Registered Nutritionist.



"One example is to create a board of lean meats, cheeses, nuts, fruits, vegetables, and whole grain breads and let everyone eat family style rather than serve sandwiches and chips. We have plenty of ideas and recipes to share."

More tips and tricks include:

- Cut up vegetables to be small and add them to your favorite recipes,
- Buy and eat frozen when fresh isn't available,
- Use coupons and sales to reduce the cost of fresh foods.
- Look for healthier options even when you're on the go at convenience stores and gas stations, such as apples, boiled eggs, cheese, and nuts.





ASK LAURA YOUR DOSE OF POSITIVITY AND INSPIRATION Embracing Worthiness -A Journey of Reframing **Our Stories**

Dear Readers, this week, let's continue our heartfelt discussion about the all-toocommon feelings of unworthiness. It's a silent struggle that many of us face, often stemming from deep-seated narratives we've told ourselves over the years.

In her insightful book, "Worthy," Jamie Kern Lima shares her personal journey, tackling these very issues. Being adopted, she initially felt abandoned and unwanted. Yet, she realized the power in reframing her thoughts. Instead of seeing abandonment, she chose to see desire and love – her adoptive parents chose and wanted her. It's a profound shift in perspective.

This concept of reframing isn't just a singular story. Astonishingly, 80% of women and 73% of men grapple with feelings of unworthiness. It shows how pervasive this issue is and how vital it is to address it.

My own journey echoes this. Growing up on 8 Mile, in the shadow of an alcoholic, abusive father, and brothers battling drug problems, I carried a heavy load of embarrassment and shame for years. It took a long time to reframe these experiences, to see them not as scars, but as the very things that sculpted my resilience, strength, and positivity.

Our past, no matter how dark, can become a source of strength. It's about changing the narrative from a tale of victimhood to one of survival and growth. I strongly recommend



Spring Fun Facts Spring sunlight leads to better moods Children grow faster during the spring too

Are you in a better mood when spring arrives? Many people are. If you're wondering why, it's really no great mystery. It's just spring fever.

The term "spring fever" is more than a myth. It refers to both psychological and physiological symptoms typically associated with the arrival of spring, including extra energy, better moods, and change in appetite, among other symptoms. While the exact cause is unclear, scientists believe that increased light, more exercise, and more bare skin influence hormone levels.

Children grow fast in the spring than any other season of the year, perhaps in part because of the benefits of the additional sunlight. There are also some negatives attached to spring. Did you know that couples are more likely to break up in the spring than at any other season of the year? Or that there are more tornadoes in the spring than any other time? Or that honeybees are more likely to swarm in the spring to start new colonies?

Maybe it's because March is named for Mars, the Roman god of war. Or maybe it's because the sun starts remaining in the sky longer and longer after the beginning of spring and that impacts people's emotions and also impacts nature. In any case, here are some surprising, interesting facts about spring:

 \Box Tornadoes are most common in the spring and least common in winter. Hurricane season begins in late spring.

 \Box Honeybees are more likely to swarm during the spring. They swarm as a way to start new colonies from successful ones. Surprisingly, swarming honeybees are very docile and the most friendly they will ever be all year. \Box March is named after Mars, the Roman god of war. In ancient Rome, this month signaled the beginning of warfare season. \Box The term "spring fever" refers to a both psychological and physiological symptoms associated with the arrival of spring, including restlessness, daydreaming, and increased appetite. While the exact cause is unclear, scientists believe that increased light, more exercise, and more bare skin influence hormone levels.

 \Box The earliest known use of the term "spring cleanspring and two weeks before Christmas. The lowest breakup time was Christmas Day and from August through October. \Box The fall and spring equinoxes are the only two times during the year when the sun rises due east and

sets due west. \Box On the first day of spring, a person at the North Pole would see the sun skimming across the horizon, beginning six months of uninterrupted daylight. A person at the South Pole would see the sun skimming across the horizon, signaling the start of six months of darkness.

□ Spring almost always arrives on March 20 or 21, but sometimes on the 19 th as this year. The reason the equinoxes and solstices don't always come on the same day is that Earth doesn't circle the sun in exactly 365 days. □ If Pope Gregory XIII would not have established the Gregorian calendar, which most of the world now observes, in 1582, then every 128 years the vernal equinox would have come a full calendar day earlier, eventually putting Easter in midwinter.

 \Box While the spring equinox typically occurs on March 20 or 21, meteorological spring begins on March 1, a month when average temperatures increase by 10 degrees over the month. \Box In the Southern Hemisphere, springtime lasts from August until November.

 \Box During the spring, birds are more vocal as they sing to attract mates and warn away rivals.

□ According to the National Association of Realtors, spring is the most popular season to sell/buy a house. Buyers are usually hesitant to move during the winter when the weather is colder and kids are in school. So, while there are lots of houses to choose from in the spring, property prices are at their highest then. □ A "spring tide" has nothing to do with the season of spring. Rather, it connotes a "springing forth." Spring tides happen twice each lunar month all year long, regardless of the season. □ Children actually grow faster in the spring than during other times of the year.






In fact, he truly believed the Rayders could be playing for a title at the end of the year, either the Lake Michigan Conference or a district final.






