Urgent Needs Grants from C3F Give Emergency Support to Charlevoix County

The Charlevoix County Community Foundation made 13 Urgent Needs grants to area nonprofits in 2023 totaling \$83,447, helping them to provide basic needs like food, clothing, heat, housing, healthcare, and emergency services for our Charlevoix County neighbors in need.

Our heroic first responders got much needed equipment and services, allowing them to better carry out their jobs. Beaver Island EMS purchased a triage kit and wireless headsets, which are improving emergency medical care and response for Beaver Island residents. St. James Township used funds to implement an emergency training exercise last spring, hosted by the Charlevoix County Sheriff Department with support from 10 other local, state, and federal agencies (including the US Coast Guard) to better prepare for emergencies in their remote community. Because emergency services providers have very stressful jobs, BASES provided first responders with acute crisis counseling to lower their trauma response, reduce their long-term stress, and increase their job retention. Resort Bear Creek Fire Department (serving Bay Shore to connect to Charlevoix County) was able to purchase two new AEDs and one new piece of radio communications equipment, which will significantly improve their ability to respond to cardiac incidents, improve

communications between responders, and increase the chances of survival for those affected.

Food insecurity is still a major issue in Northern Michigan, and Urgent Needs grants addressed this in several ways. A grant to Manna Food Project helped to fund their Food 4 Kids backpack program, which delivered 21,000 backpacks full of nutritional food to kids throughout Charlevoix County last year. The Health Department of Northwest Michigan used grant funds to inform Charlevoix County SNAP participants about using SNAP and Double Up Food Bucks at local farmers markets, which increased access to local healthy foods for recipients of food assistance benefits. Grant funds also helped Good Neighbors Food Pantry to purchase a new trailer with a braking system to stock their Boyne City food pantry shelves each week. The Northmen Den Youth Pantries (NDYP) provided access to 360 students at Round Lake Education Center with a reliable

source of supplemental, high-quality food for disadvantaged middle and high school youth and their families through their mini grocery store pantry located at the school.

Health and human services organizations also got a boost this past year. The Serenity House - Alano Club of Charlevoix, which serves people of all ages who struggle with addictions, was able to purchase a new AED unit and provide training for volunteers and program participants, to help their clients in an emergency. Grant funds to Child and Family Services of Northwestern Michigan provided assistance for foster and adoptive children and families as they arose, helping them to maintain or access food, shelter, safety, healthcare, mental health services, transportation, and more. Boyne City Middle School (BCMS) received support for the Winter Outwear Assistance Program to provide warm outwear for students and families in need this winter. The Salvation Army of Petoskey got support for

their Emergency Financial Assistance Program to provide aid for individuals or families experiencing a financial crisis by helping with heat, electricity, water, shelter, and other basic needs. A grant to Ronald McDonald House Charities West Michigan for their Family Support Program provided food, lodging, and transportation to Charlevoix For more information about the grant-making process, establishing a fund, or making a gift to the Urgent Needs Fund, please contact the Charlevoix County Community Foundation at (231) 536-2440, or online at www.c3f.org.





The Garden, the knife, the miracle, and Malchus

What ever became of Malchus?

He is the servant of the high priest identified for us in the Gospel of John, the one who had the misfortune of having his right ear sliced off by Simon Peter in the Garden of Gethsemane and the fortune of having his ear restored speedily by Jesus.

The season of Easter brings Malchus to mind.

He was among the soldiers of the high priest who went to arrest Jesus in the Garden that Thursday night, the eve of what would be the world's most fateful Passover when Jesus the Son of God would be condemned by His own people after being accused of blasphemy, and then brought to Pilate the Roman Governor to be condemned once again in a Roman court and sentenced to death by crucifixion for the false charge of treason.

We wonder how Malchus felt about all of what happened to Jesus after the incident in the Garden where Jesus restored his ear.

Malchus was not only was among those soldiers who came with torches and weapons led by Judas, the former disciple of Jesus who was betraying Him for 30 pieces of silver, Malchus was there near the front of that mob. He had to be near the front to be in the line of Peter's wielded knife. Peter, acting impulsively and wrongly in an effort to defend Jesus, struck Malchus. Jesus quickly rebuked Peter for his actions, as we read in the gospels, and then just as quickly performed this remarkable healing.

And how did Malchus feel when it happened? He was probably in shock at first. He likely kept putting his hand on his right ear to make sure it was really still there.

And it was, a testimony not only to the healing power of his Man they came to arrest violently in the dark of night, but a testimony also to the goodness and compassion of this Man.

Did this give Malchus pause? Did he begin to think differently about Jesus?

Did he initially feel animosity toward Jesus as he went to arrest Him? Was that why he was near the front of the mob of soldiers? Did Malchus personally see Jesus as an enemy the way his master Caiaphas did? Or as a servant of the high priest, was he just performing his duty?

denied Jesus, though Peter later repented and cried bitterly over his failure.

But what about Malchus? Did he ever repent?

By the Hand of Providence, Malchus would be the recipient of the final miracle Jesus ever performed before His death on the cross. That in itself is notable enough to get his name into the historical record of the arrest of Jesus.

But was the name of Malchus ever written into the Lamb's Book of Life? Did he come to recognize himself as one of the lost sinners Jesus was going to die for on the cross?

It would have been difficult for Malchus to see Jesus as an enemy after the healing in the Garden. Did Malchus ever come to the point of praying to Jesus to be his Savior?

We can only hope. And we only have reason to hope because we know the same Jesus who was falsely condemned and later crucified on the day we refer to as Good Friday was also resurrected on the first Easter Sunday morning.

And the same Jesus who died for lost sinners including Malchus, including you and me, offers the same hope of resurrection to all who put their faith in Him. Perhaps Malchus received the forgiveness Jesus offers sinners. Perhaps Malchus received an even greater miracle, the miracle of a transformed heart promised by the Savior. Have you received the forgiveness offered by Jesus? Has your heart been transformed through the restoring touch of the Savior? There would be no better time than now during this Easter season.

When Trauma Comes to School, Part 2 of 3

Every day students walk into their local school carrying bags you can see and some bags you can't see. Along with the supplies they need for school such as books, paper, and pencils, they also carry the baggage of trauma. Whether it is trauma from home or trauma that happens at school they carry an invisible bag full of trauma.

What we don't see is the hurt and pain these kids carry into school with them every day. We may not fully know what is happening in the lives of these children, but what we do know is how it affects them in the classroom.

Whether that trauma is happening at school such as being bullied by their peers or it is happening at home, it is still happening. Kids have very little control over what happens to them in life. This is especially true for kids who are experiencing trauma at home.

Their home lives are complete chaos. They very well could be experiencing multiple traumatic things at once. It could be lack of parenting, domestic violence, a parent uses substances, abuse, divorce, loss, death, and the list can

just go on and on. The problem comes when teachers are trying to teach and they have children who are acting and reacting to trauma triggers, many times teachers are not even aware of. Kids could be having major meltdowns over the littlest things. Kids of trauma usually don't respond very well to change. So, this makes transitions difficult. Due to lack of consistent parenting and boundaries when a child is told "no" at school they completely loose their minds, or completely shut down and refuse to do anything.

When there is a loud noise or sensory overload some kids who have experienced trauma meltdown. They can't handle the loud noises going on, even something like walking through a crowded hallway can be a challenge for some kids.

When kids are going through a divorce or a death in the family or another type of loss separation anxiety can be a real struggle. They are afraid to be left or that their parent isn't coming back. This most likely will be seen in younger children.

Teachers really struggle with their traumatized students. They don't know how to help them. They need help from other trained staff in the school. Teachers don't be afraid to ask for help and keep asking for help. You and your students need and deserve it. Communicate with whoever you need to in order to get the help your students deserve.


School staff help when needed. Just even stepping in to give breaks to teachers who are worn out. Offer training to teachers and other support staff on trauma so your staff can help students who are struggling every day.

Help your students by filling in the gaps when needed. Give them a break. Communicate with the staff members who can offer help and compassion. Talk with parents and family who are supports for your student. Teach your students emotions and how to express them in a healthy way. Listen to your students and give them comfort when needed. Try to be patient with them. They are struggling to just exist and function.

School needs to be a safe place for all students. If there is something happening at school that is not allowing a student to feel safe, then it needs to be dealt with. If there is a bullying situation going on the adults need to put a stop to it. When handled properly a bullying situation can be stopped.

School may be the only safe place a child has. You as their teacher may be the only caring adult a child has. Do your best to advocate for your student so they can learn the best they can. Yes, there will be rough days, but there will also be good ones.

You're Playing with Fire

Dear Dave,

My wife and I owe about \$40,000 on our mortgage. My father-inlaw, who is a very nice and generous man, said he wants to pay off the house for us, then let us pay him back over time. We've borrowed much smaller amounts of money from him in the past, and we were always able to repay it with no issues and no pressure. How do you feel about us taking him up on his offer?

Dear Seth,

I understand you and your wife have been fortunate in these kinds of situations over the years. And I know your fatherin-law would probably be a lot easier to work with than a mortgage company when it comes to the size and frequency of payments. But I still think you're playing with fire if you take him up on the offer.

I assume your fatherin-law is doing pretty well financially, since he The borrower is always slave to the lender. Always. And sadly enough, nowhere is that more true than within a family.

Accepting this offer could bring instant discomfort into the relationship for you and your wife. This money situation is likely to hang over things like a dark cloud. Thanksgiving, Christmas and other special occasions will feel different-and kind of weird—when you're suddenly celebrating with your mortgage lender instead of just good, old dad.

Even if you come from a reasonable, stable family, and it sounds to me like your in-laws are very good-hearted folks, this debt will always be in the back of your mind. But if you're involved with a dysfunctional or controlling family, that tension is going to be right there—constantly.

I'd thank your fatherin-law for his generosity and for the offer. But in my mind, it's just not worth the risk.





White lily is Christian symbol of resurrection

For Christians around the world, the two great symbols of Easter are the cross and the white lily. The cross represents the suffering of Jesus on behalf of mankind and the white lily is the symbol of His resurrection from the dead on the first Easter morning.

Other symbols of Easter as a holiday are the bunny and the egg, but these have their roots in the celebration of Christ's resurrection as well. The idea of the bunny stemmed from the German tradition of growing eggs each Easter as a reminder of the resurrection and the new life offered to believers. From the very early times, the egg has been considered the most important symbol of rebirth.

The tradition of coloring eggs and hiding them at Easter is an American custom, however. The Easter bunny tradition made its way across the Atlantic from Germany some years ago and grew in popularity after that.

Here are some other interesting facts about Easter: • Easter is now celebrated (in the words of the Book of Common Prayer) on the first Sunday after the

full moon, which happens on, or after March 21, the Spring Equinox. The earliest possible date for Easter is March 22 and the latest date is April 25.

• Easter marks the final day of the liturgical period in the Christian calendar. It marks the end of Lent, a 40-day period of fasting, prayers and the repentance for one's sins. During the Easter season, Americans buy more than 700 million Peeps -- making Peeps the most popular non-chocolate Easter candy.
Each year, 16 billion jellybeans are made for the Easter season (that's enough candy to complete a 60-foot wide Easter egg that stands as tall as a nine-story building). Red jellybeans are the favorite of kids. • In addition, 5 million marshmallow chicks and bunnies are produced daily in anticipation of the Easter season, and 90 million chocolate bunnies.

• When taking a bite into a chocolate bunny, 76 percent of Americans prefer to bite off the ears first while 5 percent eat the feet first and 4 percent eat the tail first.

• The tradition of having an Easter egg hunt on the South Lawn of the White House started in 1878 when Rutherford B. Hayes was in office. He and his wife Lucy officially opened the White House grounds to the children of the area for egg rolling on Easter Monday. It became an annual event.

• According to one survey, 63 percent of Americans prefer a chocolate bunny on Easter morning, by far the highest response. Next in line, with just 10 percent, was a marshmallow bunny.

• Can you believe this? The world's largest jar of jellybeans weighed more than 6,000 pounds!

• After Halloween, Easter is the biggest candy-consuming holiday. About 70% of the candy that is purchase is chocolate.

Boyne City Commission Explores Housing Options

The Boyne City Commission held a special meeting on housing priorities March 15th, and directed staff to move ahead with preliminary steps like surveying property and researching water and sewer access, and regulations governing proximity to the city's nearby composting site. The meeting focused on how to make City-owned properties available for development, focusing on their North Boyne Property along Court and Robinson Streets, and the Community Garden Site on Robinson Street. They decided not to pursue creating any housing in the Industrial Park. Earlier last week, the Com-

mission approved a plan to create a new and larger Community Garden site on Boyce Street adjacent to the of Common Prayer) on the first Sunday after the

city airport, which could be used if the current Community Garden is used for housing.

The Commission discussed a variety of possible multi-family housing options on the two sites, ranging from duplexes to fourplexes to larger apartment buildings of 8 or more units. The ultimate goal would be to issue requests for proposals from developers. Both areas are close to city water and sewer lines.







Buying a Home with Resale Value

Buying a Home with a View

Homes with a pleasant view of the horizon often sell at a premium above similar homes without the view. However, if a view is important to you, buy it mostly for your own pleasure and not as an investment. Though you may place a considerable dollar value on the view, future buyers may not be so like-minded. It may take you longer to find a buyer when it comes time to resell the house. Or you may end up dropping your price to more nearly match other sales prices in the neighborhood.

In short, if you are buying a house with a view, try to pay as little extra as possible. Otherwise, you might not get your money back.

Lot and Landscaping

Even though most real estate value is usually concentrated in the building, the lot is important, too. Obviously, it should be as level as possible. Assuming the property is in a typical neighborhood, the lot should be rectangular – no odd shaped lots or oddly situated lots.

Yard sizes are smaller in modern homes than in older homes, but there should still be a decently sized front and back yard. Do not buy a house where the entire back yard is taken up by a swimming pool, for example. Do not purchase an over-landscaped property, either. You would normally pay a premium for that, which you may not be able to recover when you sell. You will get your best value if the house is moderately landscaped or under-landscaped for the area. You can always improve the landscaping during your ownership by improving the grass and adding bushes and trees. Just do not spend too much.

House Size

In each residential neighborhood, houses will vary in size and rooms, but they should not be too different. If resale value is an important consideration, you should not buy the largest model in the neighborhood. When determining market value, the homes nearest to yours are most important. If most of the nearby houses are smaller than your house, they can act as a drag on appreciation.

On the other hand, if you buy a small or medium house for the neighborhood, the larger homes can help pull up your value. This is one of those times where determining your "wants" versus your "needs" can be extremely important. Buying what you need in a more prestigious neighborhood may provide more financial reward than getting what you want in a less desirable neighborhood.
