

# **Charlevoix channel** dredging scheduled to conclude by May 15

CHARLEVOIX -About 13,000 cubic yards of material is scheduled to be removed from the Charlevoix Harbor channel before May 15, as part of a maintenance dredging contract under the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District.

Great Lakes Dock and Materials, LLC., located in Muskegon, will perform the work for the Corps of Engineers for approximately \$480,000 and place the dredged materials in open water in Lake Michigan. The state-approved open water is located about a mile and a half northwest of the harbor entrance.

**USACE** maintains about one mile of inner channel between Lake Charlevoix and Lake Michigan, supporting the U.S. Coast Guard Station Charlevoix, commercial traffic – including a ferry to Beaver Island and com-

mercial fishing charters - and heavy recreational boat use.

Charlevoix Harbor is a deep draft harbor maintained under the authority of the U.S. Rivers and Harbors Act to 18 feet in Lake Michigan and the inner channels of Lake Charlevoix.

To protect fish spawning, dredging is not allowed from May 15 to July 15 in the channel, in accordance with Michigan Department of Natural Resources regulations.

The public is urged to avoid areas actively being dredged and follow all posted warning signs. Lights and signs will mark the discharge vessels off-

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District, maintains a navigation system of 81 harbors and channels joining lakes Superior, Michigan, Huron, St. Clair and Erie.

# East Jordan Officers recognized for Outstanding Performance

At the April 16th regular meeting of the East Jordan City Commission, Two East Jordan City police officers were recognized for their outstanding performance by East Jordan Police Chief Scott Hankins.

Chief Hankins highlighted a recent case involving Officer Kevin Kessinger who was tasked with locating an individual with a bond violation. When the man was finally located, he fled and threatened to shoot Officer Kissinger. Chief Hankins commented, "We take it pretty seriously when people threaten to kill our cops." He explained, "When additional officers arrived, because of the threats that had been made, the officers had their weapons out." When faced with a number of officers, the subject was able to be taken into custody without injury to him, or to the officers involved. Once in custody, the man was found to be carrying only a knife. Hankins commented, "Due to the professional, rational, and immediate response of Officer Kissinger, the

subject was taken into custody safely and the city was protected from a potentially violent male."

Chief Hankins stated, "I want to commend Officer Kissinger for his actions that night and present him with a medal of commendation."

On another occasion, Officer Dan Reece and Chief Hankins were confronted with a man carrying two knives and threatening to kill someone. After repeated demands to put down his knives, he finally yielded to the officers and was taken into custody.

Hankins commented that recent training for an active shooter situation made it

almost routine for them to handle a situation that was only seconds away from being a deadly force encounter. Due to the professional, rational approach to this encounter, Officer Reece took a violent, armed man into custody without injury to the suspect, the officers, or nearby residents. He continued by saying Officer Reece responded to this armed subject in a courageous manner.

Chief Hankins said, "The officers deserve recognition for the type of work they do and the dedication to the service they provide to the City of East Jordan. I am truly proud of them."

# The Planning Commission approves revised Lofts on Lake project

The Planning Commission met last week and approved a revised proposal from Michigan Community Capital for the Lofts on Lake mixed use project at 100 North Lake Street. The revised plan increased the

number of floors from 3 to 4, and increased the total number of apartments to 57, which include 9 studio units, 27 one-bedroom units, 18 two-bedroom units and 3 three-bedroom units. The first floor would now

have 7,909 sq ft of retail lease space. The proposed project would include the development of 63 off-street private parking spaces and 24 on-street public parking for a total of 87 new parking spaces. The next step in the process will be consideration by the City Commission.

The Planning Commission also held a pre-application discussion of a possible food truck court adjacent to the car wash on Ray Street. Because this is the first time that a proposal has been received for the operation of several food trucks in a permanent space developed for that purpose, the Commission directed Planning Director Scott McPherson to research and propose changes to the applicable city ordinance regulating outdoor cafes and outdoor eating areas.

She joined The Dow Chemical Company upon college graduation, working in laboratory research and development and ultimately landing a customer product development position in the same R and D group with David. That, then, is how they met, marrying in 1983, and they spent their forty-first anniversary this past February.

From her Organic Chemical Group experience, she moved to a Plastics Development Group, and then to a similar position in the Chicago area, following David's leaving Dow for a Technical Director's management position in Chicagoland. She excelled in her work there with I.T.W., but when David's job changed to a different company in Houston, she opted to interrupt her professional career to care for their young daughter Sara and pursue graduate studies at the University of Houston. She then began her new career as an environmental manager at the University of Texas Medical School in Galveston.

Desiring to return to the Midwest, the Bowens moved in 1993 to Rochester Hills, Michigan where Tina served as an Environmental Engineer with NTH Environmental for two years while David began a ten year stint as Technical Director for a national specialty chemical company. Two years later, an opportunity came for Tina to work as an Environmental Manager for Parke Davis Pharmaceutical R and D (later to become Pfizer R and D) and the family moved to Ann Arbor where they lived for nineteen years (minus two years spent in San Diego on a Pfizer transfer). Tina had a stellar career with Pfizer, retiring as Director of Operations in 2008 after managing Pfizer's Ann Arbor physical facilities with a staff of over 300 people. She then worked for another six years in a similar position with the University of Michigan, who had purchased the facilities from Pfizer. Tina's final retirement from U of M came in 2014, when Tina and David moved to their Charlevoix retirement home on Lake Marion.

As was her husband David, Tina was a music lover; she played dulcimers, banjo, and guitar and for years they enjoyed traveling to music festivals in the U.S., Canada, and Ireland. She loved boating and being on the water; she was raised on the Maumee River, and almost all the Bowen residences were in waterside communities. And she loved gardening, whether as the church volunteer gardener, home vegetable grower or tender of her greenhouse and seasonal flowers and plants.

This is effective leadership!

Mary Faculak encouraged me to meet Sarah Roche, who is the K-6 STEM teacher at East Jordan Elementary School and is making a very positive difference with her students, as she is in the East Jordan community.

Sarah grew up in Saginaw. She spent summers in Harbor Springs and at Camp Daggett, which she loved. In fact, after her time as a camper, she became a counselor, a sailing instructor, and even worked in the kitchen during her years at camp.

Sarah's father transferred to Savannah, Georgia. On her drive back up north she stopped at several colleges. She very much liked her college visit at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, as it was beautiful and offered just what she wanted. In time, she became a teacher at a charter school in Cincinnati, for six years teaching third grade inner-city students.

In time, Sarah moved back to Oxford and taught five more years of general education before making the shift to the STEM teacher at the Talawanda School District. In 2015, Sarah helped design and implement the first ever elementary STEM program, and led the way for seven years prior to joining the staff at East Jordan Elementary School.

As a dedicated teacher at East Jordan Elemen-

# Zonta Of Petoskey Grants \$22,500 To Area Organizations

PETOSKEY - Zonta Club of Petoskey awarded grants to six area organizations for their work in the community to empower women and girls. These grants supported the following programs:

Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Northwest Michigan is granted \$2,000 to increase organizational capacity that will support two female children in a one-on-one mentoring relationship with caring, adult mentors in Emmet County by the summer of 2024. The grant will include recruitment, training and educating volunteers, program and mentoring costs, child and parent training and administrative expenses.

Child and Family Services of Northwestern Michigan is granted \$2,500 to support a new service called Safe Haven North Supervised Visitation and Safe Child Exchange. Expenses include gas cards for clients for transportation to and from Safe Haven North, phone cards, food, clothing as well as professional development for staff.

Northwest Habitat for Humanity is granted \$2,500 to support finishing touches on the Foundations for our Future project, hoping to raise their building capacity of new homes from 1-2 per year, to 15-20 per year. The homeownership program provides women an opportunity to not only purchase a home, but education on how to become fiscally independent.

Cross of Christ Lutheran Church Community Paper Pantry is granted \$3,000 to be sed to purchase paper products, cleaning supplies and hygiene products. These items are not covered by Bridge Cards or food assistance programs. Each client is given two bags a month and the pantry serves an average of 90 families a month.

North Central Michigan College was given a four-year \$10,000 pledge towards the building of the new classroom and Student Center Building built in 2021. The building opened for service in the Fall of 2021. This is our 4th and final gift of \$2,500 towards this pledge.

Women's Resource Center of Northern Michigan is granted \$10,000 from Zonta Club of Petoskey's Women and Children's Fund at the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation to be used for construction expenses in creating a new, private entrance in the newly purchased building.

In addition to these grants, Zonta of Petoskey gives each year a \$2,500 grant to the Women's Resource Center Northern Michigan to support a scholarship for women at North Central Michigan College, plus operating support for the WRC Northern Michigan, and support to remodel a room at the Safe House. The club also provides money toward the making and donation of mastectomy pillows for McLaren Northern Michigan Hospital, and a \$1,000 scholarship yearly for the

Young Women in Public Affairs program.

The Women and Children's Fund at the Petoskey Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation was established in 1996 with a \$10,000 gift from the Zonta Club of Petoskey. The designated purpose of the fund is to support programs or projects which benefit area women and children and help them achieve their full potential.

Zonta Club of Petoskey was chartered in 1971 and is one of 38 clubs in the state of Michigan. Their members participate in service projects that support the mission of Zonta: to advance the status of women worldwide. Zonta International was chartered in 1919. More than \$375,000 has been donated to local organizations since the club's charter.

# The Walking Debt

Dear Dave,

A few years ago, I had a real problem with credit card debt. Since then, I've gotten much better at handling my money, and I'm making about \$80,000 a year. Two weeks ago, I received a letter about a credit card I had in 2020. The amount owed is \$7,688. The letter doesn't say I'm being sued, but it says I have to appear before a judge in two months for a pretrial conference. I live in Florida, and I've never heard of anything like this. I only have \$1,000 in savings.

Dear Damari,

I'm glad to hear you're handling your finances better now than you did in the past. But at this point, you're learning that old debts don't necessarily die, aren't you? Ignoring debts isn't a good plan, because many times they come back to life like a zombie and come looking

I'm not an expert on Florida law, but a pretrial conference in a case like this—over a \$7,688 credit card bill—is highly unusual. I've been helping people with money problems for 30 years, and I've never heard of anything like this. It could be some kind of new tactic the collections attorney is using to try to intimidate you.

If I were in your shoes, I'd call the attorney who's suing you and try to negotiate a payment plan or settlement. Do you have anything you can sell? Because I've got a feeling if you can come up with \$3,000 or so and offer it as payment in full, they'll

take it. I don't mean to be unkind, but these guys figure you're a deadbeat because you've got a 5-year-old debt hanging over your head and haven't tried to pay it. They'll take almost anything they can get at this point.

In general, when you go to court over a situation like this, you're going to lose. You have a legal debt, and you haven't paid it. It's that simple. So, if you don't have anything to sell to make some money that way, you need to get busy working an extra job or two. I'm talking about doing Door Dash or something—in the morning before work or in the evening after work. Kiss those weekends goodbye too. Just go nuts for a few weeks, and make a bunch of extra money fast.

It won't be easy, and you're going to be dogtired for a while. But you can scrape together \$3,000–4,000 before June easily if you'll just put your head down and make it happen. Then, offer it up to the attorney. Demand a written release, with the debt declared settled and paid in full, and chances are, this thing will be off your back!

# **Grants for Environment, Arts & Culture Awarded**

Community Foundation hosted two grant cycles in March, responding to requests from local nonprofit organizations working to address environmental needs as well as needs in arts, music, history, and culture. Thanks to donors who participate with the Community Foundation to make a difference close to home, a total of \$112,495 in grants have been awarded to nonprofits between the two cycles.

Environment and Land Use grants totaled \$63,960 and include projects that will improve water quality in the Lake Charlevoix Watershed, replace invasive species with native species, protect land, create more natural habitats, and build capacity for organizations doing this work.

Tip of the Mitt Watershed Council will use their grant to restore the Stover Creek stream channel profile, create instream habitat, and provide for more natural flow of water, sediment, and wildlife in Lake Charlevoix. Walloon Lake Association and Conservancy will purchase a vehicle for their staff to use in their work around the watershed. On Beaver Island, Tara's Meadow will conduct workshops on soil regeneration, organic waste management, and local foods production, and will bring a monarch butterfly expert to lead in native plantings and butterfly protection efforts. St. James Township will use their grant to protect, educate, and improve access at the Gull Harbor Natural Area.

Invasive species present an enormous threat to Michigan's biodiversity Removing invasives and replacing them with native species, or simply planting more native species, is a highly effective way to address this issue. Three organizations will be using grant funds in related efforts: CAKE CISMA, through the Antrim Conservation District, Camp Daggett, and the Little Traverse Conservancy. Finally, funds granted to the Conservation Resource Alliance will help them to complete a multi-year project to replace aging infrastructure at road crossings on the Jordan River and Deer Creek, in the



Jordan River Watershed.

Arts and Culture grants totaled \$48,535 and include a variety of programming to enhance the arts, music, culture, and history of our area. Grant funds will help bring art, performances, exhibits, music lessons, and instruments to our community, and will help arts organizations build capacity to bring more programming in the future.

Charlevoix Public Schools students will bring three interactive murals to downtown Charlevoix.

Crooked Tree Arts Center will host an exhibit exploring the history, identity, and environment of Michigan.

Bringing professional artists to our rural area is a big benefit for the community. The Beaver Island Performing Arts Alliance will bring a play to the Island community. Traverse City Dance Project will present a live dance performance in East Park in Charlevoix as part of their summer community tour The City of Boyne City's Farmers Market will bring more musicians to the market this summer. The City of East Jordan will purchase some new sound equipment, which will help to attract more talent to share with the community

this summer. Access to the arts and programming for all ages is important. Charlevoix Circle of Arts will provide community arts programming for children and adultsin Charlevoix. Raven Hill Discovery Center in East Jordan will purchase tents to host a pop-up museum on the corner of

Fuller and Pearsall Roadsthis summer while Fuller Road is under construction. The Dorothy Gerber Strings program, offered through the Great Lakes Center for the Arts, will use grant funds for critical instrument repairs and replacements. Tunes Music Makers on Beaver Island will offer lessons and rentals for a variety of instruments, including guitar, piano, mandolin, ukelele, and electric guitar.

Exploring our history and culture provides a better understanding of who we are. It's important for everyone to learn about other cultures as well as our own. The Beaver Island District Library will use their grant to offer cultural programming highlighting Indigenous peoples, crafts, art, music, dance, storytelling, and foods. The Beaver Island Historical Society will use their grant to bring several unique cultural programs to the Island. The Charlevoix Historical Society will continue work to archive and digitize a large collection of photos and docu-

The Northwest Michigan Arts & Culture Network will use their grant to partner with Charlevoix County arts organizations to help to build capacity for the future. At Wagbo Peace Center in East Jordan, renovations of a building will eventually make it possible to host fiber arts workshops, classes, and equipment, taking the organization's work full circle.






Choosing the Charlevoix County News Player of the Year in girls basketball this season wasn't any work at all. Like cream, she rose to the top of the list without needing to pour over it a thousand times.

Abbey Wright's statistics for Charlevoix made her an obvious choice as the best of the best among the others, outscoring last year's Player of the Year Lindsey Cross of East Jordan by nearly seven points a game and possessed the intangibles that made her a true team player.

She scored 20.1 points per game and averaged almost a dozen rebounds (11.9) while finishing just a hair shy of two assists (1.7)and two blocks (1.8) on the season.

"Abbey was a top vocal leader for us on and off the court," said her coach Reece Koepke. "The girls listened and soaked in what she had to say."

"Her defensive presence down in the paint was huge for us altering shots. Every opponent had their head

Looking at all the variables, it was a difficult decision indeed to select the Charlevoix County News Coach of the Year, but in the final analysis Charlevoix Rayder coach Reece Koepke of Charlevoix got the nod... again. He also took the top honor last year.

As a year ago, competition was stiff and all the teams jockeyed for position in the final year of the Lake Michigan Conference as it was disbanded at the end of the season. But it was the Rayders who



again produced some impressive results, including a pair of wins over area rival Boyne City (49-35 and 38-31), won two games in the district tournament before losing in the

finals to finish 14-10.

Duplicating that performance will be a tall order next year with Abbey Wright, Anna Kemp and Bayani Collins departing through graduation.

"Overall, those three girls being seniors helped tremendously with the leadership in their own ways and made us successful," Koepke said. "I always say 'best teams are best led teams."

Koepke will have to find new leaders next year.
