High School Senior, Young Artist Concerto Winner, Performing With **Great Lakes Chamber Orchestra**

The Great Lakes Chamber Orchestra (GLCO) presents the winner of the 17 th Annual Young Artist Concerto Competition, Lena Sytsma-Reed, in their September 7th concert at Bay View. Lena will be performing the first movement of Haydn Cello Concert No. 1. The concert, Copland: Clarinet Concerto & Hoedown, directed by Maestro Libor Ondras, features award-winning clarinetist Jeanmarie Riccobono, and includes Caroline Shaw's Entr'acte and Debussy's Dances Sacred and Profane. A senior at Charlevoix

High School, Lena Sytsma-Reed is the 2024 Grand Prize Winner of the 17th GLCO Young Artist Competition. Lena has played the cello since she was 11 years old. She is part of the Dorothy Gerber Strings Program, where she studies privately with the Great Lakes Chamber Orchestra's Principal Cellist, Elizabeth Bert, and plays in the Dorothy Gerber Youth Orchestra (DGYO) under GLCO violinist, Dr. David Reimer. In the spring, Lena went on tour with the DGYO where she performed with the orchestra and had master classes with members of the Cleveland Symphony and the Cavani String Quartet.

Lena's other interests include varsity soccer, cross country, swim team, robotics, Model United Nations, National Honor Society, and quiz bowl. Lena serves as a

30,000 visit the **Mackinac Bridge for** the 2024 bridge walk

ST. IGNACE - A cool, clear start shifted to beautiful sunny skies for the 2024 Mackinac Bridge Walk on Monday, which undoubtedly reassured the roughly 30,000 people who made plans to participate.

"While not the largest crowd we've seen, 30,000 is on the upper end of the range of 21,000-35,000 participants we've had in recent years," said Mackinac Bridge Authority (MBA) Bridge Director Kim Nowack. "It was an absolutely beautiful day, with cloudless skies giving

closed at 6:30 a.m. to all vehicle traffic for the walk, reopened promptly at noon.

Based on the success of the recent events, the 2024 Annual Bridge Walk again started from both St. Ignace and Mackinaw City, which eliminated the need for busing and offers additional options for participants. The bridge walk has

been an annual event since 1958, with the exception of 2020 when it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The 2023 walk was the 65th event, when 35,000 people participated. In recent years, crowds ranged from 21,000 to 35,000.



A "Stay" Interview

I have written about the stay interview before, am repeating as this is such an important leadership prac-

A stay interview is designed for us as leaders to have with our good performers, asking them purposeful questions to assure that they are happy and wish to stay with us.

A stay interview is preventive medicine. If we are effective as a leader, our team members will be highly motivated and energized.

Turnover is costly. Just think, it involves the exit costs, recruiting, orientation and training, lost productivity, often customer disappointment, and sometimes the adverse effects of negative energy and talk internally. The point is, turnover is expensive.

We want to keep our best, our "A" performers, for sure, and also invest in our next level, our "B" performers, who we can develop into significant contributors.

Here's where a stay interview becomes very helpful. Asking our people such questions as:

- ☐ What do you like about being a member of our
- team? Our business? ☐ What gives you a sense of satisfaction? Of significance?
- ☐ What could we do to enable you to better use your
- skills? To feel fulfilled? ☐ How could we improve our productivity? Our com-
- munication? ☐ What ideas would you like to offer us?
- ☐ What questions would you like to ask us?

These are simply sample questions. Each business can determine their own,

though I think they should be along these lines, and definitely focus on What? How? and Why?

Conversations are how we develop trusting relationships. Make sure our conversations are frequent, sincere, and that we are focused on our team members and their ideas, asking purposeful questions and listening to understand and learn. They need not be long conversations.

A short conversation is better than no conversation.

No matter how busy we are, this is important and we must make the time. Our people have to know we care about them, we appreciate them, that they are important members of our team, and that their ideas are heard and matter.

The outcomes of this leadership practice will be increased retention, improved productivity, and likely, improved financial results!

ANTHONY TROSHAK

TEACHER, COACH AND MENTOR

Tom Schultz suggested that I write about Anthony Troshak, a Physical Education and Health teacher at Charlevoix High School. Tom praised Anthony for the values he upholds and teaches to his students and the members of the boys' basketball program, where he serves as the head coach.

To provide some background, Anthony was raised downstate in Williamston. He participated in football, basketball, and track. After graduating from Williamston, Anthony attended Michigan State University. He began his teaching career at Caseville Public School, where he also coached varsity boys' basketball. It was at Caseville that he met his wife, Megan, who is also a teacher.


The couple later relocated to Brown City MS/HS. They spent seven years in Brown City, where Megan taught 2nd and 3rd grades, while Anthony taught science, PE, and health, and also coached the boys' varsity basketball team.

Megan, originally from Boyne Falls, and Anthony enjoyed spending time in northern Michigan. They had always considered moving up north, and in 2021, the opportunity arose. Megan is now in her third year teaching 4th grade at Charlevoix Elementary School. The couple has two daughters.

When Anthony arrived in 2021, he began teaching Physical Education and Health. He enjoys working with a diverse group of learners and is dedicated to helping them establish healthy habits that will last a lifetime. "I want every student to feel welcomed in the gym and weight room. I strive to foster a positive, energetic environment by playing music—sometimes even in the hallways—and incorporating fun games, activities, and competitions to keep students engaged and active." He truly enjoys being a part of the Rayder staff and is thankful for the opportunity to work with such wonderful teachers and students.

In his first year at Charlevoix, Anthony coached the 8th-grade boys' basketball team and assisted the varsity program under former Head Coach Matt Stuck. "Coach Stuck is an outstanding coach and individual. Assisting him for a year gave me the chance to learn from another coach, an opportunity I hadn't had early in my coaching career."

After Coach Stuck stepped down following his youngest son's graduation



and the 2021-2022 season, Anthony was appointed as the head coach. In his second year at the helm, Coach Troshak led the Rayder boys basketball team to a remarkable turnaround, improving their record from 6-18 to 17-6. "We had many returning players last year, which allowed us to discover our true identity as a team during the summer. This helped us get off to a strong start. While we were short on size, our solid guard play made up for it. Over those two years, we made significant progress not only as basketball players but also as teammates and individuals."

Coach Troshak is deeply involved in the youth basketball program. He manages the K-2 (boys and girls) program and the 3rd-6th grade boys' program during the winter season. From early November to mid-January, you can find Coach Troshak in the gym every Saturday coaching youth basketball. "I believe having a strong youth program is crucial. We're fortunate to have many dedicated parents, volunteers, and older players who support the program."

In addition, Coach Troshak organizes two summer youth camps: one in June, which typically attracts over 100 participants, and another in August, drawing more than 50 participants. He credits his wife and children for enabling him to • Prioritizing the team first Valuing relationships and





The expected cost for the new playground is approximately \$250,000. With the help from gifts from foundations, businesses and residents the Rotary Club of Charlevoix is hopeful to make this playground a reality by next summer.



Rewarding Success

Dear Dave,

My wife and I are trying hard to get out of debt and start controlling our finances. We've always given our kids allowances in the past, but we've been considering putting their allowances on hold until we pay off our debt and get in better shape financially. What do you think about this idea? -Cody

Dear Cody,

I'm glad you two are making smart changes in your lives, but I wouldn't stop what you've been doing where your kids are concerned. It can be a series of great teachable moments for them. I would, however, stop calling it an allowance. In my mind, there's a victim mentality attached to word "allowance," and that's not something you want taking root in their minds.

Kids should learn at an early age that money is connected to work. Even a kid who's in kindergarten is old enough to begin doing some age-appropriate chores around the house. So, let's start calling it a "commission" instead of an allowance. Why? Because in situations like these shouldn't be viewed as "allowing" them something. It should be looked at—by you and by them—as rewarding success.

My wife and I did this very thing with our kids as they were growing up. Each of them had a list of chores that were expected of them each day. If they did their jobs, they got paid at the end of the week. If they didn't, they didn't get any money.

Some people may look at this method and call it "tough love." But it's really not. It's just love. It's something you do when

you're trying to teach your children, and guide them toward becoming independent, responsible adults.

Dear Dave,

I was wondering if you recommend including future purchases, especially major purchases, into your monthly budget. If so, how far in advance should you do this?

Dear Andie,

When you wait until things go wrong or something breaks down, you'll find yourself in a mess and the victim of your own poor planning. That's why I'd start putting money aside in my budget as soon as I saw signs there would be a need for whatever item it may be.

Let's say you're pretty sure you'll need a newer vehicle in a couple of years. Go ahead and start putting the money aside now. Decide on a reasonable, affordable ballpark price, then do the math to see how much you'll have to save every month to make it happen. And if you can make it happen faster than two years? Great!

And remember, this kind of stuff is a whole lot easier when you don't have things like car loans and credit card payments hanging around your neck! – Dave

DNR awards construction contract for new Lake Michigan fisheries research vessel

The R/V Steelhead II will be built by Onaway-based Moran Iron Works

Advanced technology, improved crew safety, solar energy and more precise Lake Michigan fisheries data — that's what is on the horizon for Michigan Department of Natural Resources when the new research vessel (R/V) Steelhead II is completed. The DNR announced the first step by awarding the vessel construction contract to Moran Iron Works of Onaway, Michigan.

The DNR expects the new research vessel to be on the water for the 2026 field season.

"We at Moran Iron Works are proud to be a part of another turnkey vessel for the Great Lakes Region," said Victor Rupert, vice president of operations for Moran Iron Works. "Projects like the R/V Steelhead II fabricated for the Michigan DNR complement our niche and resources by utilizing our high-quality welders, highwire corridor and deep-water port in Rogers City, Michigan."

Tom Moran, founder and CEO of the company, attributes the manufacturer's successful bid to the skill and efficiency of his team.

"This contract is a compliment to our entire team here at Moran Iron Works, and the pinnacle of success for me personally," said Moran. "Only because of that do we get the honor to build one of the most meaningful vessels on the Great Lakes. We will exceed the expectations of the DNR and make them proud they chose a Michigan company."

The DNR's decision to award the construction contract to an established Michigan-based company followed a competitive bid process. The award to a Michigan vessel manufacturer also aligned with the interest of the state Legislature, which appropriated the funding for this vessel build as part of the 2023 state budget bill and addressed remaining funding needs with the 2025 budget bill. The new vessel


"The R/V Steelhead II will replace the aging survey vessel Steelhead, which has been operating on the Great Lakes for almost 60 years," said Pat O'Neill, **DNR Fisheries Division** boat captain. The S/V Steelhead is approaching the end of its reasonable and safe life expectancy. Repairs are becoming more costly, and parts are becoming very difficult to procure.

The new 66-foot, steelhulled vessel will be a vast improvement over the antiquated S/V Steelhead and include upgrades to improve vessel operation, safety and crew accommodations. In contrast to the original diesel engines that power the S/V Steelhead, the Steelhead II will incorporate rooftop solar panels, reducing its overall carbon footprint, and be powered by two Environmental Protection Agency Tier III diesel engines that utilize high-efficiency emission control technology.

Better tools, better results

"Data collected aboard the S/V Steelhead over the last 56 years have been instrumental in providing fisheries managers with the information needed to effectively and appropriately manage Lake Michigan's fish populations," said Patrick Hanchin, manager of the DNR's Charlevoix Fisheries Research Station. Like its predecessor, the R/V Steelhead II will conduct surveys using multiple types of gear to inform fisheries management in Lake Michigan. The vessel will incorporate modern scientific equipment to better quantify prey fish abundance — critical information to support management efforts for the recreationally popular trout and salmon fisheries throughout Lake Michigan.

"Advanced, modern hydroacoustic technology will be adopted on the R/V Steelhead II — technology that will support improved data collection from a more reliable, modernized platform," said Ben

Turschak, research biologist at the Charlevoix Fisheries Research Station.

Capt. O'Neill said the R/V Steelhead II will allow staff at the Charlevoix Fisheries Research Station to continue their work on Lake Michigan with tremendous improvements in safety, flexibility and dependability over the vessel's projected

50-plus-year life span. "Crew safety is greatly improved with state-of-theart navigational systems, watertight compartmental hull design and a gyro stabilizer designed to minimize the vessel roll in rough seas," O'Neill said. He cited another enhanced feature of the new vessel: a mechanical platform that can be lowered to water level to facilitate activities such as diving, maintenance of scientific equipment and streamlined crew-overboard

The R/V Steelhead II was designed by Boksa Marine Design of Lithia, Florida. Company president Nick Boksa has ties to Michigan; he grew up on Lake Michigan and attended the University of Michigan to earn a degree in naval architecture and marine engineering.

Home Improvement Project Available Soon for Charlevoix Homeowners

is coming to the City of Charlevoix to help improve existing housing.

This new opportunity for Charlevoix homeowners comes from a CHILL (Community Development **Block Grant Housing** Initiatives Livability) grant from the Michigan State Housing Department Authority (MSDHA). The grant's target population are individuals and families who live at or below 80% of the area median income

With this program, homeowners may receive up to \$40,000 to address health and safety concerns and maintenance issues. Some of these projects may include interior and exterior improvements to meet code requirements, roof repair and maintenance, siding, windows, plumbing, electrical, mechanical, and insulation. Cosmetic-only renovations and upgrades are excluded from eligibility. The property must be located within the City of Charlevoix to be eligible.

Eligible homeowners with projects requiring CHILL assistance of \$10,000 or less will be offered as a grant with no requirement for repayment. Projects of \$10,001 or more can receive a-zero interest, zero-payment loan, forgivable after five years and secured as a second mortgage.

"Ensuring the safety and livability of our existing housing stock is a great way to maintain and expand the housing units available in our

community. I'm excited that this program will offer assistance to those in need to maintain their property and improve our neighborhoods more generally," said City Manager Mark Heydlauff.

Jonathan Scheel, Director of Planning & Zoning, is already working on the next steps to get this program ready to go for City residents.

Non-Partisan Choices in **November Election**

Were you disappointed in the lack of choices on your August Ballot? If you look past the straight party option on the November General Election ballot you may be pleasantly surprised to find many more options.

There has been some discussion in Michigan about making local grassroots political positions non-partisan, like school board and village/city offices are. It doesn't take political affiliation to decide how tall a fence should be, enforce a blight ordinance or to keep accurate records. But no action has been taken yet so even our most grass roots positions must declare a party affiliation.

Politics in the 21 st century has become polarizing. What used to be a good-natured university-style rivalry like go blue or green, has become a blood sport. It has divided families and ended friendships. Somehow, we have all witnessed a slow, like boiling the proverbial

frog, increase and blatancy in bullying and name calling in the political arena. Behaviors we work to squelch in our children. At our core we hold more similar beliefs than differences.

According to an article in Forbes, Jan 12, 2024, a Gallup telephone survey showed that in 2023, 43% of Americans claimed to be Independent. With both Democrats and Republicans at 28% each. It appears that a good chunk of Americans have taken a step back from the preschool playground behaviors that have been associated with the 2 major parties. Afterall, political affiliation is not who you are as a person, it's just one slice of a very complex pie. Humans are not either/or, sometimes we are none of the above.

Contrary to popular belief, your write in will not be counted in the November election unless they have submitted a "Declaration of Intent" by 4pm Friday, October 25. A list of official write-in candidates can be obtained from the County Clerk's office after that date. Your write-in must be on this list and their names spelled correctly for your vote to

ITC To Conduct Aerial Patrols of Transmission Lines in Michigan

ITC will be conducting aerial patrols of the high-voltage transmission structures and lines in Michigan from approximately Sept. 9-Oct. 4, weather permitting. The helicopter patrols are conducted to provide an overall status of the overhead transmission system that is operated by ITC's Michigan operating entities, ITC-Transmission and Michigan Electric Transmission Company, LLC (METC).

The aerial inspections will cover nearly all of the Lower Peninsula, including all or part of the following counties (date ranges are approximate):

September 9-12:

Alcona, Alpena, Antrim, Arenac, Bay, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Clare, Crawford, Emmet, Gladwin, Grand Traverse, Iosco, Kalkaska, Lake, Leelanau, Manistee, Mason, Midland, Montmorency, Ogemaw, Oscoda, Otsego, Presque Isle, Roscommon, Wexford.

These patrols are a North American Electrical Reliability Corporation (NERC) requirement for ITC's vegetation management program, support proactive maintenance objectives, and are in line with the company's model for operational excellence. They include

inspections of all transmission structures and equipment including, but not limited to, monopoles, steel towers, wood poles, conductors (wires), insulators and other equipment.

Crews check for damaged or worn equipment and vegetation hazards. The inspection flights are often conducted at low altitudes to allow accurate visual inspection of equipment for lightning damage, wear or other potential problems. This is normal procedure, so there is no cause for alarm if a low-flying helicopter is sighted near transmission lines.





East Jordan Red Devils overwhelm Manistique, 48-6

If it's true that first impressions can mean a lot, then the East Jordan football clearly made a big one last Thursday night when the Red Devils crushed visiting Manistique, 48-6 in their season and home opener at Boswell Stadium.

Okay. It was only Week One, and there's eight more to go and challenges await the Red Devils around every turn ... but, it was a pretty overwhelming.

"It was a good start,"
East Jordan head coach
Adam Grybauskas said.
"The awesome thing was
that we rotated pretty heavily the whole game. A lot of
guys contributed for us. It
felt like every couple plays
a different kid was making
a play for us."

East Jordan had the game well in hand by the half, building an impressive 35-0 lead in the first 30 minutes.

That meant a running clock in the second half, and the game was over all too quickly for the home fans who continued to celebrate after the final horn.

While the offense pounded the ball down the Emeralds throats, the Red Devils defense did its part, coming away with four turnovers, two of which were interceptions.

And that dominance was established without the services of leading running back Logan Shooks, who missed the game. But the Red Devils found some new playmakers who contributed in his absence.

In fact, one emerged right at the start when William Webb raced 55 yards for a touchdown the first time East Jordan had the ball. It set the tone for the rest of the game.

The touchdowns came fast and furious after that, Max Beal running in for two and Webb catching a scoring strike from quarterback Korbyn Russell.

Beal finished with a team-leading 115 yards on 11 carries, while Arlo Knauf added 85 and Coen Burks had 63 and a score. Webb wound up with 78 yards rushing.

Russell was an efficient 11-of-17 passing for 126 yards and a TD, and ran for a score.

Knauf led the defense with six tackles and a fumble recovery, Russell added five tackles and two

quarterback sacks while Ryder Malpass and Webb each had an interception.

"We played pretty clean football," Grybauskas said. "and executed well really in all three areas, and had a lot of guys contribute.

"Pretty much everybody on the team got on the field early on in the game, and rotated in. The guys made plays for us. It was a good team win.

"Everybody's going to play a role this year, which is a little unique. Usually you kind of have your core group, and then you sprinkle some guys around it. But, we really like the whole

group we have this year."
But, it wasn't perfect.

"Blocking (and) tackling could better, and that was an area we were solid, but not where we need to be once we get to mid-year," Grybauskas added.

every week.
East Jordan next travels
to Johannesburg-Lewiston,
which defeated Harbor
Springs, 30-18 in its
Northern Michigan Football
League-Legacy Division
opener.

"They (the Cardinals) run (Wing) T, and they've run it for a long time," Grybauskas said. "Those kids are basically born into that offense, (so) they run that pretty good. We'll have to be ready."






