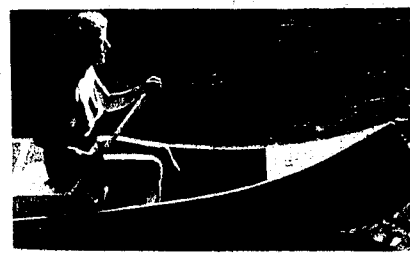

The magnificent art of doing absolutely nothing

Before you read this story, it is important that you be in the right frame of mind. Lean back in your chair, or better yet, lie down. Put your feet up. Breathe deep. Close your eyes.

That's my favorite pastime once I've trekked to the top of Avalanche Mountain. The breeze up there is somehow rarified. There is seldom anyone else up there; I never want there to be. Lake Charlevoix stretches shimmering fingers out to the horizon. Boyne City looks like a toy town, its little dramas reduced for the moment to the sort a child might act out with her dolls. The sounds of barking dogs, motorcycles and children don't reach up here. Yet the air seems to tinkle with leaves rustling, insects buzzing, grass growing. Sparrows flit among the trees that have leafed out in summer splendor.

I think about trees as factories. In four months, they produce enough food (chlorophyll) to last an entire year. That gives them an eight month vacation: eight months to relax, sink roots a little deeper into the soil, and contemplate life on a sunny hill.

Perhaps if I lead an exemplary life I'll come back as a tree. That's the sort of thoughts one should have while leaning against a mound of grass at the top of a hill, face tilted to the sun. Because there is a time when pressures below become a little too intense, when mind and muscle strain a little too far to cope with a little too much. There's a reason for doing nothing, a reason that can't be written off as just laziness.

If you're from Down Below, chances are this is why you've come to Charlevoix County: to get away from it all and relax. To crack open the windows of a musty cabin, stock the refrigerator with your favorite beverage and lie on the sunny deck of a sailboat. Visitors say there is something special about the air here; that

the fresh lake breezes with just a hint of sunwarmth at their edges are simultaneously relaxing and invigorating.

It takes a special knack to find pleasurable relaxation in the little things: watching the aspen leaves wink in the sunlight, meandering at water's edge along Lake Charlevoix, catching the sunset from atop Avalanche Mountain, or trying to count the stars on a clear night.

That's what doing nothing is all about. While you're doing nothing, you're doing something very important: allowing the mind and body to revitalize. And while there is plenty of activity around here; you can golf, fish, swim, hike or boat within a small radius of your home; sometimes the secret to a great vacation is not to try to do anything.

Norman Vincent Peale, one of the great writers and religious leaders of our time, tells in his book, "The Power of Positive Thinking" how he discovered the art of doing nothing.

"One February morning I was rushing down the long veranda of a Florida hotel with a handful of mail from my office in New York . . . As I hurried by . . . a friend from Georgia who was sitting in a rocking chair with his hat partially over his eyes stopped me in my headlong rush and said in his slow and pleasant Southern drawl, 'Where you rushing for, Doctor? That's no way to do down here in the Florida sunshine. Come over here and set in one of these rocking chairs and help me practice one of the greatest of the arts . . . an art that is passing out. Not many people know how to do it any more.'

'Well,' I asked, 'please tell me what it is. I don't see you practicing any art.'

'Oh, yes, I am,' he said. 'I am practicing the art of sittin' in the sun. Sit here and let the sun fall on your

face . . . it makes you feel peaceful like . . . it gives me energy.'"

Peale found that taking just an hour out to do nothing made his work go much more smoothly later on.

Dale Carnegie, author, teacher and lecturer, realized the importance of doing nothing now and then. He kept an old maroon-colored sock in his desk drawer to remind himself to make his muscles go limp now and then.

There are other techniques for relaxing. Terry Smith, a counselor at the CHIP Counseling Center in Charlevoix, recommends progressive relaxing. Sit or lie back in a relaxed position, think of the muscles in your toes, feet, legs, thighs, torso, and so on relaxing and

letting go of all tension. Some people do yoga, or meditation. Others lie in a hammock and watch the leaves against the sky, or sunbathe, summertime's most productive way of doing nothing at all.

Why not? Summer is just about the only time you can get away with doing nothing. Fall finds you raking leaves, buying school clothes for the children or coping with increased paperwork. Winter brings snow that needs shoveling, Christmas parties and shopping. It takes twice as long to do everything when it's cold. Spring reveals closets that need cleaning, brings play practice and graduations.

Let's face it, this is your chance, right now. Put down this newspaper, go sit in the sun and do nothing. Practice makes perfect.

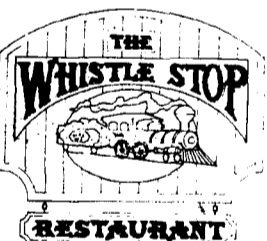

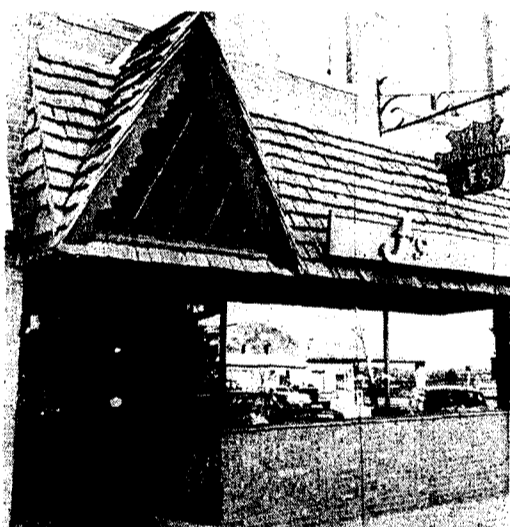

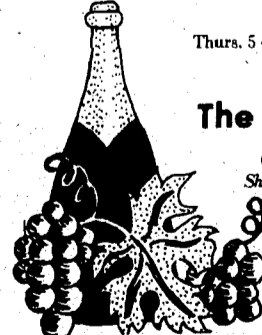

Do something while doing nothing at all

You'll be happy to know that Fun and Sun has been researching this topic diligently, solely in the interests of keeping its readers informed, of course.

In the course of compiling our data, we developed a genuine thirst for revenge against blue-bottle flies, a knack for spilling soft drinks in the sand and a slightly pinkish tinge.

But for the practiced sunbather, we still highly recommend lying in the sun. After all, what better opportunity is there to do absolutely nothing and yet still accomplish something? Who has ever been criticized for trying to catch a few rays?

There are a few things to remember, however. Just because Charlevoix County has a northern climate, doesn't mean you still won't get a good burn if

you're careless. Here's some tips to keep in mind.

-New suntan lotions are sporting ratings these days. A Sun Protection Factor of two gives only minimum protection from sun rays, a factor of 15 gives maximum protection. The number corresponds to the number of times longer you can stay in the sun than you could if unprotected.

-Certain drugs can cause photosensitivity, such as antihistamines, antibiotics, water pills, sugar substitutes, sulfa drugs, tranquilizers and others. See your doctor if you're under medication.

-The sun is at its strongest right NOW. Rays increase until June 21, so if you don't have a base tan, use caution.

-You won't realize at first that you have burned. Pain doesn't develop for about two hours and can keep getting

worse for 24 hours. It sometimes lasts several days.

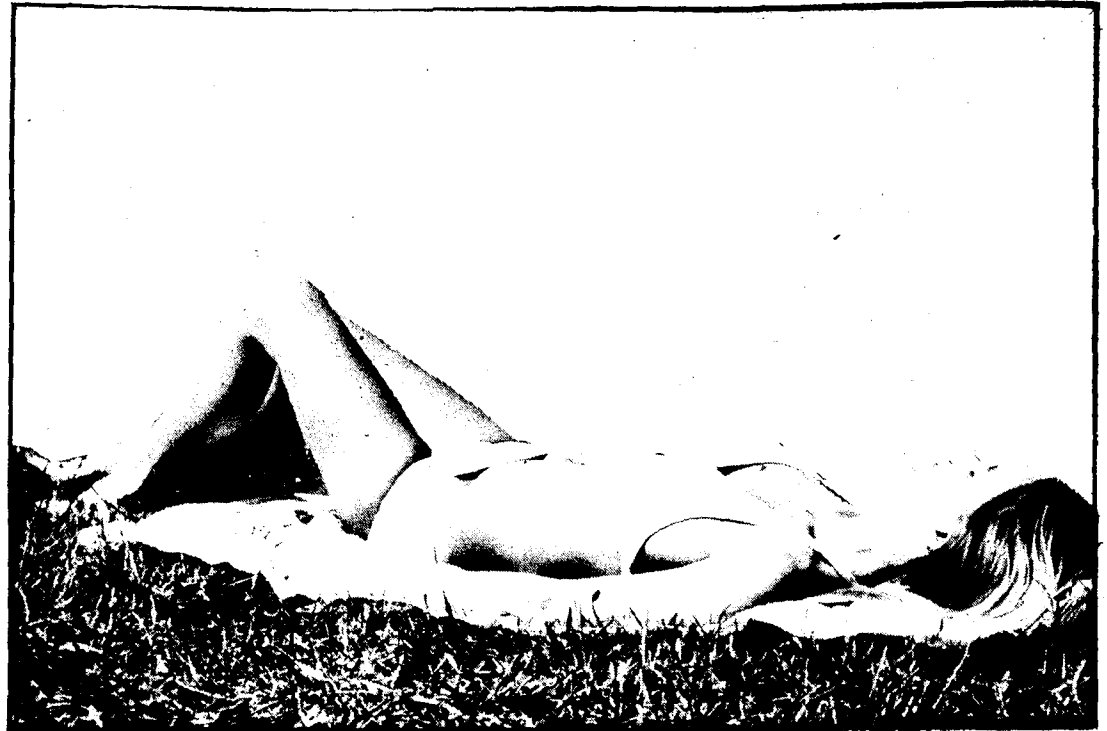
-Sun reflectors are nice for getting an even tan, but they are also dangerous, since they increase the sun's intensity. They are not recommended.

-The birth control pill can cause users to get blotches on their faces after sun exposure. Also, pregnant women may burn easier.

-In general, those of Celtic descent: Scotch, Irish, Welsh, do not tan. Their skin will freckle, burn or peel.

-Thin clothing, such as a wet T-shirt, will give you only 20 to 40 percent protection from the sun. Likewise, a wide-brimmed sunhat gives only about 50 percent protection.

-Your skin uses melanin, a pigment as a natural sunscreen. After exposure to the sun, it takes about two days to produce new melanin.

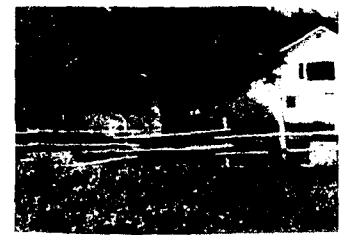

Phones don't ring as much here

For Larry Hughes of Columbus, Ohio, one of the best things about vacationing near Boyne City is the fact that his telephone here seldom rings.

"When I come up here I just collapse," he says. Hughes is a member of the Ohio House of Representatives, manager of the directory department for Ohio Bell Telephone, and one of the presiding officers of the Masonry's Scottish Rite.

In Columbus, his day begins at 6 a.m. He's at the Bell office by 8 a.m., runs over to the House in mid-morning, often finds himself making a luncheon speech, and attending some civic dinner function in the evenings. Usually one of the three House committees on which he serves takes him back to work each evening. And when he comes home, at 10:30 or 11 p.m., the phone begins to ring. "Plus, I have to keep up with my mail," he says. "I always answer every letter personally."

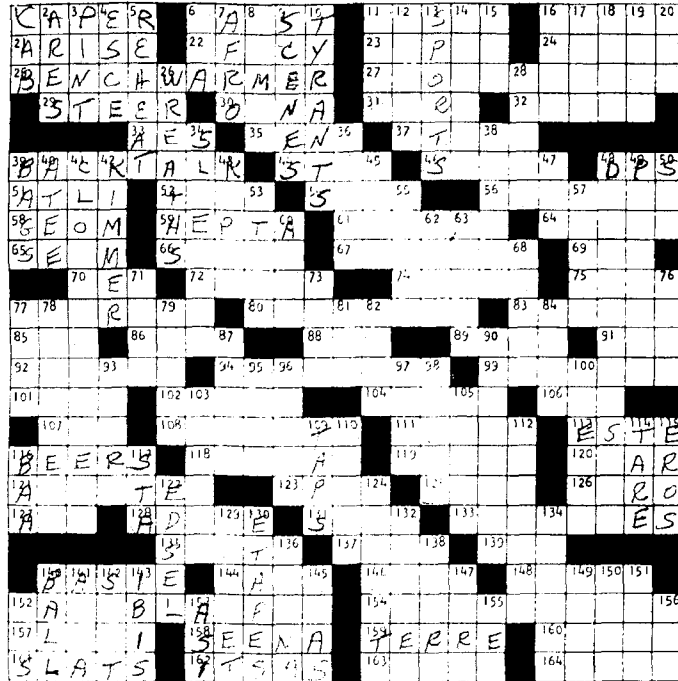

Quiet spots

Want to really get away from it all? Try these . . .

Charlevoix County is blessed with countless places where there is absolutely nothing to do, places with no clocks, schedules, or activities directors to shame you into moving your body. Here are some of our favorites:

• AVALANCHE MOUNTAIN, Boyne City. Admittedly, it's a bit of a hike to the top, but once you're there, we guarantee there's not a thing going on except a panoramic view of Lake

Charlevoix. Wooded trail is accessible from Division Street. Park your car on dirt road, unmarked trail begins off to the left. You won't get lost, just remember: civilization is downhill.

WHITING PARK, north of Advance on Lake Shore Drive. A nice beach on Lake Charlevoix, hiking trails for the ambitious. Generally, a good place to lie in the sun and practice lowering your heartbeat.

DEAD MAN'S HILL, Jordan River State Forest. Take U.S. 131 about 10 miles south of Boyne Falls to Deadman's Hill Road. Just a few hundred yards from the parking lot you can sit atop Deadman's Hill and enjoy a 20-mile vista of the Jordan Valley. It was the last thing an old-time logger saw before he plunged to his death (hence the name). Take a camera, preferably one of those that does everything for you except say "cheese". The state park also has campsites and terrific hiking trails, but they, of course, take more effort.

THUMB LAKE BEACH, 10 miles east of Boyne Falls on C-48. It's a quiet, uncrowded beach frequented mostly by Thumb Lake area residents. Lots of driftwood, gentle waves lap at the shore.

GRAIN TRAIN RESTAURANT, 421 Howard, Petoskey. Who feels like doing anything on a rainy day? A good place to do nothing at all is this health food restaurant with its rustic decor and

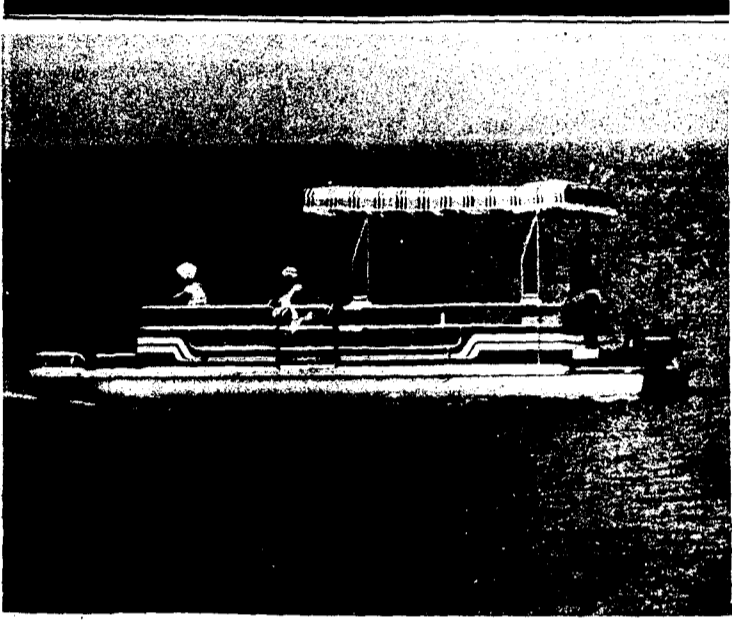
adjoining coop store. Sip a cup of herbal tea and have a transcendental conversation.

PONTOONING ON WALLOON LAKE is a great way to escape the summer crowds that line the Walloon Lake beach. A number of marinas will rent you all sorts of boats, from canoes to sailboats and outboards. Pontoons, however can accommodate a lot of lazy people and requires a minimum of muscular strain.

PEOPLE WATCHING gets more interesting as the summer progresses. We favor reclining on a park bench in Charlevoix's downtown city park while nibbling on a hunk of vanilla fudge from Murdick's next door. Here, the people parade begins around the Fourth of July and continues through Labor Day. Come early for a good seat. For best results, wear a pair of mirrored sunglasses for some undetected and unabashed staring.

FEED THE DUCKS in Boyne City's Old City Park along the Boyne River. They like fresh white bread, but really go quackers over peanuts.

PICK FLOWERS along the country roadsides. Wildflowers grow like weeds this time of year, but they make gorgeous bouquets that are perfect for a sunny cabin window. And it's just about the best way we know to look like you're doing something productive while sitting in the sun.
