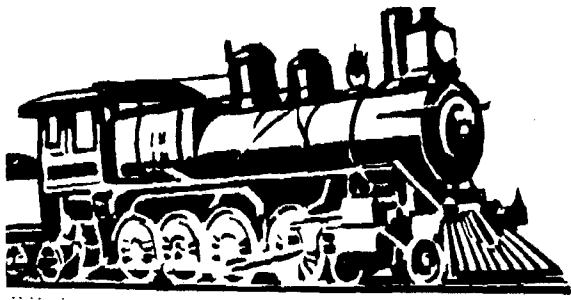


# Weather

## Special students solving future problems

One of the special rewards of teaching is presenting the tools of learning, then watching students both grasp and run with them.

So it is with special pleasure East Jordan Middle School teacher Kay Holley has observed a group of students in her eighth-grade class. The group—Jenny MacEachern, Beth Purvis, Matt Shaw, and Dustin Tinney—will represent East Jordan at the 16th annual Michigan Future Problem Solving Program State Bowl at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, April 1 and 2.

The state bowl is the culmination of a year-long program where students are taught to creatively seek, attack, and solve problems related to projections into the future. More than 14,000 Michigan students worked on three problems during the 1994-95 school year—Cities, Homelessness, and Kids and Violence—which were critiqued by trained evaluators. Five teams from EJMS participated in the program on a voluntary basis.

What made this group special was the intensity with which they attacked their problems.

"They worked very hard," said Holley. "They put a lot of extra hours into it."

The four friends started out together in September on the original topic of City Problems. Using the booklet structure provided through the program, they brainstormed possible problems and solu-

tions. From all the problems they listed, the group had to determine the most extensive, or underlying problem, and develop 20 solutions.

The solutions ranged from logical and practical to creative and just plain silly. The group then developed criteria from which to judge their solutions, rating them according to effectiveness.

Finally, they had to support their choices

with research.

Cities served as a rehearsal, as did the next issue, homelessness. The group did some reorganizing, losing Jenny to another team in the process.

"But we worked really well together, so we decided to get back together again," explained Dustin. For the final problem, Kids and Violence, the group really jumped into overdrive, spending hours on research

and vocabulary study.

Of course, Holley also spent extra hours in the process, helping to arrange special speakers such as Charlevoix County Sheriff George Lasater and probate officer David Bitler, and providing materials for the students' research.

"But they were very independent," said Holley. "They worked at finding out and

## East Jordan schools ... after the defeat

Facing defeat of the recent 2.25 mill bond levy for the construction of a new middle school, East Jordan School Board members were disappointed but not discouraged.

A feeling that the slim margin of defeat (64 votes in a voter turnout of 1,218) proved strong community support, was the prevailing attitude at the March 21 meeting.

"The community didn't vote no to schools," said board president Mary Jason. "They voted no to more taxes."

Jason said the board will reconvene the Facility Review Committee. The FRC, composed of a cross-section of the East Jordan community, met over the past eight months to research the problem of overcrowding in the district. It was the FRC's plan the board presented to voters in the form of the bond issue.

"We'll get a consensus of the committee's perception of why this failed," said Jason. "They may present a new plan or recommend the same plan."

District superintendent Chip Hansen said the board will move fast, bringing the FRC together within the next few weeks.

"We remain committed to the community process of the facility review," said Hansen. "But there's no question we will approach voters again in the near future."

## Playground problems may come to an end

Problems of drainage and accessibility that have plagued the East Jordan Elementary School playground for years may come to an end if a grant campaign is successful.

Chris Curtin, representing the Academic Boosters, presented the plans for applying for the grant at the March 21 meeting of the East Jordan School Board. Curtin has spent the past year working with elementary principal Chuck Hershberger, former curriculum director Anne Dingman, interim city superintendent William Hughes, and members of the East Jordan Rotary to prepare the application to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

Curtin said she has been advised the best grant opportunity is through the Land and Water Conservation Act, although the grant requires a 50 percent match from the applicant. Curtin said the group is actively pursuing funding and has received pledges

from several organizations, including a \$2,500 pledge from the East Jordan Parent Teacher Organization.

The playground has the interest of the city and local service organizations because it qualifies as a community playground, with a history of remaining open to public use. The city's recent adoption of a recreation master plan is one of the requirements of the grant.

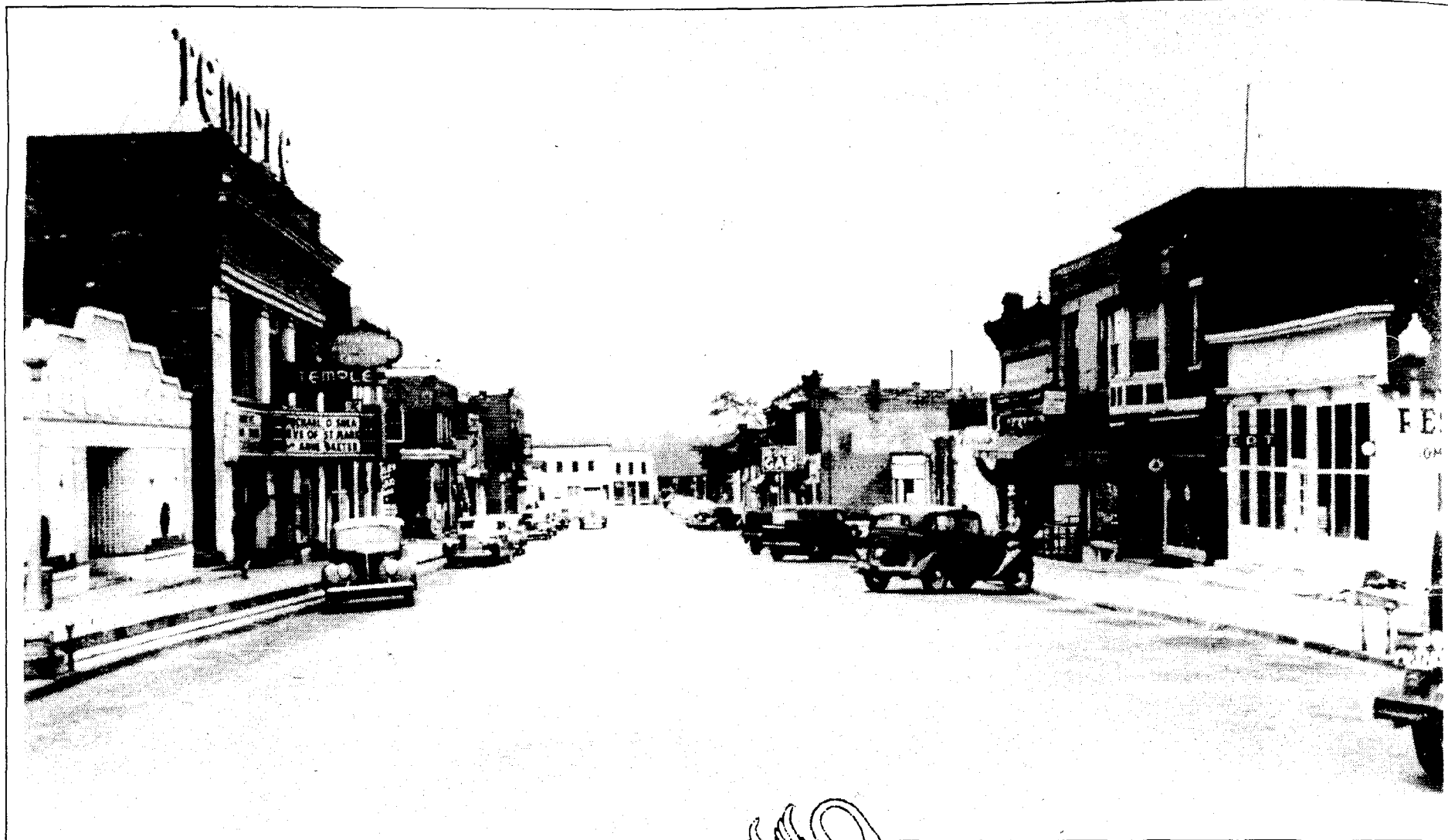
With its approval of the application, the school board fulfilled another grant requirement.

Documentation has been collected showing the problem as ongoing over at least the past 10 years. Along with drainage resolution, the site needs to be updated for compliance to the American Disabilities Act. Curtin estimated the complete cost at \$300,000.

"But we will only request as much as we think we can match," she told the board. She said the major goal is to rectify the

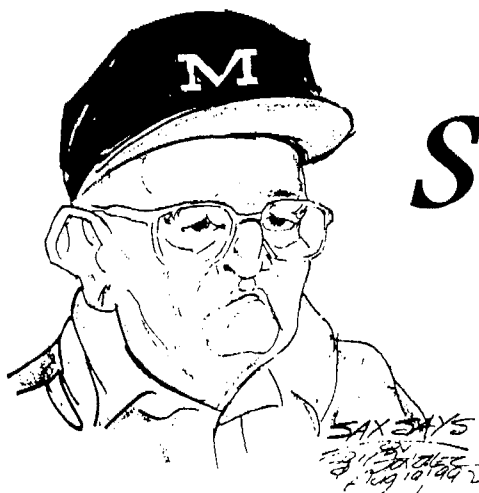

## Sax says ...

Several times recently I have been asked the question, "When did you start writing the junk you write every week?" They then usually mumble, "It looks like you started yesterday." Now that's gratitude for you, just when I began to think that I was somewhat of a literary genius.

Actually I started down the road to the "literary notoriety" better than a half century ago when I began writing softball games for the now defunct *Charlevoix County Herald*.

I can remember vividly taking my life-long savings and purchasing a L.C. Smith typewriter for the outrageous sum of \$5. Incidentally that typewriter was the best spelling machine I ever owned.

Although I never learned to type, except by the "hunt and peck" method, by the time I was in high school I had advanced somewhat and was writing for the old *Grand Rapids Herald* and the *Petoskey Northern Michigan Review* at 10 cents a column inch.

The first big assignment I ever received was writing the account of the 1933 Charlevoix County Fair, quite an assignment for a brash youngster, who was having difficulty getting through Miss Leatha Perkin's sophomore English class. Bless her soul, as I look back now, she was the best teacher I ever had, although I had a hard time accepting the criticism she had with my writing. I'm not about to send her any of my recent writings for fear that she will say that she hasn't seen any improve-

ment over the years.

Later I worked a couple of years as a writer for the *Alma College Almanian*, though my marks in journalism didn't improve with my expectations.

My readers got a reprieve during World War II for four years while I was in the US Army. With my return to *Alma College* in 1946, I again came back to writing with the *Almanian* as well as the college yearbook. Incidentally neither the school newspaper or yearbook took any scholastic journalism honors, though I thought that they should because of my literary competence.

From 1948 to 1950, I wrote an occasional sports story for the *Carson City Gazette*. For a decade, 1951-1960, I was back at East Jordan, where I again went back to writing for the local weekly, the *East Jordan News-Herald* and its editor, Marshall Sayles.

I have written articles for the *Houghton Lake Resorter* since 1960 and it wasn't until 22 years later that I started my column, "Sax Says". And to think that there are those who question my ability as a writer. Try writing someday. Who knows, you might like it.

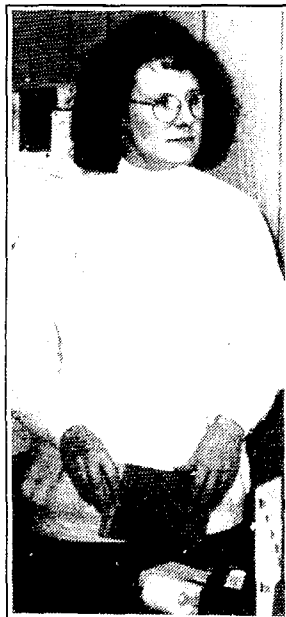
## RSVP awarded 'exemplary' title

Charlevoix and Emmet Counties Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) was recently awarded the title of "exemplary senior corps project" by the Federal Corporation for National Service (CNS).

"Dedication and commitment by our senior volunteer members and the community has allowed our project to obtain this recognition," said RSVP director Becky Mosser. "This makes our program one of the top in the nation."

RSVP was specifically cited for having a proven impact on the community and using volunteers in original and/or creative ways. Over a four year period, the Charlevoix-Emmet program has seen an active membership growth of 31 percent, an increase of volunteer hours served of 30 percent, and an increase of nonprofit agencies served of 49 percent.

Bonnie Graham, Senior Service Corps Program Specialist for the State of Michigan's Office of Services to the Aging (OSA), affirms the federal proclamation.

The time is near for us to clean our lawns and yards.

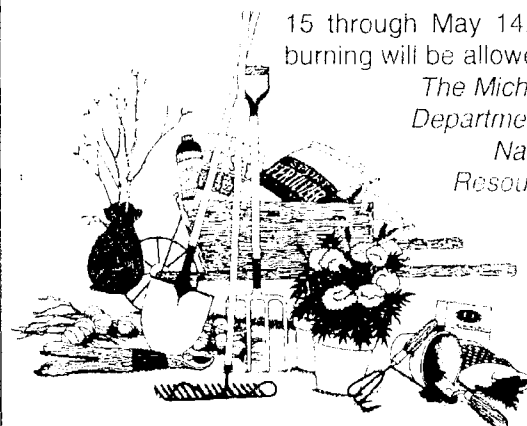
If you are going to do any burning of grass, leaves or brush you must first obtain a burning permit. In Charlevoix County call 547-0086; in Antrim County call 533-8341.

wrote a note because the neighbors had stopped speaking to us. (Makes it easier for the creditor to salve his guilt for he pretends you are at fault.)

Would you believe I was taken to court and fined \$150 plus court costs because displaying a person's debt on a postcard that the public can read was considered slander.

The debt was never paid, the neighbor filed bankruptcy, and the family moved to another state leaving us without recourse.

Remember, the best time to get out of trouble is before it happens. Use caution and thought and as it says in Matthew, "be wise as serpents and harmless as doves."

# Special students solving future problems

getting a wide view of the problems."

With four such dynamic and creative young people working so intensely, there were bound to be disagreements, but the students all said it never really caused a problem.

"We argued a lot," said Beth. "But it wasn't personal, so nobody really got mad."

After all the research and study, each team was shut into a classroom alone, without their notes, to produce the final booklet documenting their problem. They had just two hours.

With astuteness far be-

yond their years, the group identified the underlying problem of the issue as, "How would we ensure the safety of students?" in the violence-ridden fictional school, Millennium High. Their best answer was to send troubled students to a rehabilitation center, although they probably got more of a smile from judges reading one of their "creative" answers - to put the trouble kids in a submarine and sink them in the Atlantic Ocean!

All the kids agree the program is a lot of work, but worth it, and fun too - especially when they found out they were invited to partici-

pate in the state bowl with 139 other teams representing the top 30 percent of Michigan teams.

At Ann Arbor, the group will once again have two hours to complete their booklet. But this time they also have to produce a skit "selling" the audience and judges on their best solution.

Fortunately, they have had several weeks to prepare the topic, Prejudice. They did not confine their research to just the most obvious manifestations of the issue.

"They spent two days in the (Char-Em ISD) Severely Impaired program," said Holley, "Gaining an understanding about the prejudices disabled people face." Holley said the group has been researching the effects of social and economic prejudices as well.

For other preparation, the group spent many hours together the Saturday before, plus all week before the big weekend, rehearsing and studying.

"Getting together in advance was really helpful," Jenny explained. "I think that's why we did so well on Kids and Violence. We were really ready."

The group may be among the four teams selected at Ann Arbor to advance to international competition in Rhode Island. Whether or not the group continues, there is no question about the positive influence the program has had on their lives. Beyond what the stu-

dents themselves said about the benefits - satisfaction of completing a big problem; looks good in portfolios; gaining knowledge on important topics - their advanced thinking abilities are reflected in their considerable communications skills and through the regard of

their teacher.

The program obviously creates an atmosphere for students to learn, but perhaps best of all, the kids coming out of the program are thinking caring individuals - ready to work on solutions for the problems of the future.

drainage situation, a problem which is expected to cost about \$30,000.

"We have 10 years of documentation of people trying to take care of this problem," Curtin told the board. "We've put our heart and soul into finally making it happen."

## District purchases new bus

In other action, the board approved a bid of \$63,918 from Blue Bird, Inc., for a 78-passenger school bus. Transportation director Tim Drenth said the larger size will accommodate more luggage and students, making it possible to transport a majority of student trips and athletic teams without sending extra vehicles to carry equipment. According to Drenth, that adds up to cheaper and safer trips.

"The cost is higher than we're used to," said district superintendent Chip Hansen. He noted that costs are higher on normal-sized buses as well, as manufacturers pass on the costs of recent stricter safety regulations imposed by the federal government.

Delivery of the new bus is expected by September.

Hansen also reported the Char-Em Intermediate School District is retrofitting a two-year-old East Jordan bus with a wheelchair lift at no cost to the district. East Jordan is currently transporting wheelchair-bound students on a rented Char-Em van, separate from the rest of their classmates.

## Briefs

■ The board approved a June 12 election for the renewal of the 18-mill non-homestead operating tax. If approved, the millage will be extended for 20 years.

"This is for non-homestead only," noted Hansen. "Residents will not be affected by this tax, which by the way, is 19.5 points lower than taxpayers were paying less than two years ago."

Two board seats will also be up for election - those of Herb Griffin and John Kempton. Kempton will seek reelection, while Griffin is undecided as yet.

The deadline for filing for election is Mon., April 10. Petitions are available at the office of district business manager Ruby Dipzinski, located in East Jordan Middle School.

■ The board approved second year tenure resolutions for the following teachers: Cindy Boss, Margo Brandell, Jim Brown, Matt Inman, Alice McPherson, Sharon Moeke, Laura Reid, and John Twichel.

Third year tenure resolutions were approved for Caroline Buesching and Cathy Meyer.

Under the Tenure Act, a four-year probation is required for new teachers and a three-year probation is required for teachers hired from other schools.
