Administrator's position offered to Californian

The commission wants her, but will she want the job?

That's the question the City of East Jordan will ask Carolyn Sutter, of Laguna Niguel, Calif., the leading candidate for the position of city administrator. Sutter is a consultant with a variety of experiences in municipal management.

The commission made the decision to hire Sutter at the July 5 regular meeting, after interviewing several potential administrators over a two-week period. The final interviews were conducted just hours before the commission met.

Mayor Russ Peck pressed for a decision, stating that the position should be filled in fairness to the city and in the best interest of the community.

Commissioner Ruth Gee objected to making what she called a hasty decision. She noted that Sutter has never been a city administrator, and has not been a municipal official since 1987. There were also some problems contacting Sutter's former employers for references.

"It's not fair to the city to hire someone in haste," she said.

During the discussion that followed, commissioners Dan McKinnon and Brian Sweet made positive statements indicating their support for hiring Sutter.

We're down to the last few days before the July 14 deadline, so submit your work for the East Jordan Journal special reader issue! "Although she was never a city manager," said Sweet, "she has handled a budget much larger than ours."

"Wouldn't people just be willing to wait until we check her references?" asked Gee. Commissioner Lyle Etcher said he had been able to reach some of the candidate's former employers and colleagues, and had received glowing reports of her abilities.

Sweet said he was ready to offer the position and begin the negotiation process (for a salary and benefits package) with Sutter. The commission voted without dissent to make the offer.

Gee said her reluctance to make the decision was because of past experiences hiring candidates without thoroughly checking references.

"I think we should be much more careful this time," said Gee. She said she thinks Sutter is a very good candidate, but she would have liked more certainty about Sutter's abilities.

The commission will schedule a special meeting to discuss Sutter's response as soon as possible.

Sewer main repair holding

A contract for permanent repair of the damaged sewer main that crosses the Jordan River at Bridge Street has been accepted by the city.

Riba Marine of Cheboygan will repair the main for an estimated \$95,000. City clerk Kathy O'Rear said that price includes the use of a second barge – Riba has anticipated that two repair barges will be needed. If the second barge is not necessary, the price will drop to \$90,000.

The project will begin in the next few weeks. Some funds for the project (up to \$90,000) will come from a grant from the continued on back

School board approves new language materials

Students in kindergarten through fifth grades will discover a new set of language materials in their classrooms this fall.

The East Jordan School Board approved the purchase of the Harcourt Brace language arts system for approximately \$32,000 at a June 28 special meeting. The curriculum support materials include textbooks, and assessment materials.

A search committee which included elementary principal Charles Hershberger, middle school principal Shirley Bishop, and kindergarten teacher Nancy Trumble, met with three different companies while researching materials. Hershberger said they used a target list of district needs to narrow the choices. Some of those needs included:

- A literature-based program with an anthology text incorporating children's literature written by recognized children's authors
- Materials that present the entire spec-

trum of language arts – writing, reading, listening and speaking

• A phonetically-based system

• Materials aligned with MEAP testing After reviewing the possibilities, the committee contacted several reference school systems to get reactions of teachers who have already been using the materials. The committee referred two systems to the elementary faculty, who also reviewed and tested the materials.

"They overwhelmingly recommended the Harcourt Brace materials," said Hershberger.

The literature anthologies include a variety of reading materials, with about one-third fiction, one-third non-fiction, and one-third poetry, plays and other literature. Authors represented include many Caldicott, Newberry, and National Library Association award winners, as well as literature of different ethnic and cultural origins.

Another feature of the literature curriculum involves use of portfolios as an assessment tool. Hershberger said the school will be relying more on portfolios as another way to monitor individual progress.

Hershberger noted the company will inservice teachers on the new materials. He called the teacher editions of the texts very well organized.

"It's a teacher-friendly series."

High school principal Gus Bishop said the series is well-aligned with East Jordan's elementary curriculum, as well as the state core curriculum.

"The series will be an excellent addition to the curriculum," district superintendent Chip Hansen told the board, adding that the scope and sequence organizational plan of the series fits well with the district strategic plan for the elementary curriculum.

Insurance costs force changes

After researching the issue, the school board approved the addition of a deductible to district insurance coverage for students at a meeting June 19.

In the past, the school insurance policy

did not require parents of students injured on school property or during school functions to pay a deductible. The board had been discussing the possibility of the addition for several months and had tabled a decision at the regular May meeting.

"Rate increases are inescapable, as are accidents," said superintendent Chip Hansen. "Combined, they create premiums going up and up and up."

Hansen said insurance costs and premium options are reviewed annually, and the district is getting the best available plan. Without a deductible, this year's cost to the district will be \$18,198.

Hansen emphasized that this insurance is meant as supplemental to parents' coverage. He asked for input on what level deductible should be added to the policy.

After more discussion, a \$100 deductible was approved. The cost of the premiums will be reduced by about \$2,000.

Board members were concerned about families not able to afford the \$100, and



Telephone scam alert

The Charlevoix County Sheriff's office is alerting citizens of Charlevoix County of the following telephone scam presently being worked in our area.

A person calling from American Adventure Sweepstakes claims you have won \$50,000 and in order for them to deposit the money in your checking account you must give them a check number and your checking account number. Already a citizen had \$299.50 removed from his account, apparently electronically. The department is not sure how many citizens have been defrauded, but the 800-number for the

company is now disconnected. This complaint has been turned over to the FBI because the company is located in Macon, Ga.

The sheriff's office recommends you do not give out any account numbers on the telephone. If anyone has been taken in by this scam please contact the sheriff so the information can be shared with the FBI.
















Beaver Island celebrates Museum Week





Parvovirus

alert

Parvovirus is a deadly, merciless disease, the mention of which strikes terror in the heart of any knowledgeable dog owner, and sends shivers of dread through the animal health professionals who try to treat it.

dration and usually swift but agonizing death.

The incubation period for parvo is roughly 7-10 days, but may be less. Initially, an infected dog may show no easily identifiable symptoms, but may be "shedding" the virus through saliva, urine and feces, helping it to spread before you even know your pet may be contagious. Within days your seemingly healthy dog may become violently ill then comatose - death follows.

The northern Michigan area is currently experiencing a rapidly spreading outbreak, as it does almost every summer because dogs are more active. The virus can live in the environment for up to a year, and is not affected by heat or cold. It is spread by the most casual of canine contact - for example, sniffing the grass where an infected dog has urinated, defecated or vomited.

Dogs with parvovirus can shed up to 30 billion virus particles per ounce of stool. Flies, as well as people, can therefore act as indirect sources of infection. Too often, adequate decontamination procedures are not taken by owners whose dogs have had the virus.

Most dogs who are presented to the veterinarian are already beyond help.

There is no magic cure for parvo. Treatment consists primarily of intensive supportive therapy – intravenous or subcutaneous fluids, and medications to help control vomiting (which contributes to dehydration) and to relieve the gastrointestinal inflammation. Many tedious

discussed incorporating a policy for appeal. That policy may become more important in future years, because the district expects to gradually increase the size of the deductible.

But for now, the cost to parents in the event of treatment needed for a school injury will be \$100.

"That's most suitable for most of our parents," said district business manager Ruby Dipzynski. "Any higher and it would be too big of a pill to swallow."

Re-writing it

Although former kindergarten teacher Adeline Bowerman taught many, many students in her 23 years at East Jordan Elementary, she did not have all of East Jordan's kindergartners in her classes, as was stated in a June 28 article. She informed the Journal there were usually at least two other kindergarten classes at the school every year during her tenure.

Parvovirus is a highly contagious, rapidly spreading "hot" virus which infects canines (members of the dog family,) causing severe gastrointestinal distress, dehy-

Veterinary Assistant hours are spent cleaning up after the hospitalized dog and decontaminating everything and everyone that come

into contact with the patient. Fighting off the virus is largely up to the dog's own immune system. Most immune systems are unable to respond quickly enough to defeat the virus and succumb. A small percentage survive.

The immune systems of puppies are particularly vulnerable due to a complicated progression of decreasing maternal antibodies (assuming the mother was vaccinated) and the slowly developing immune system of the pup as it grows. Older dogs, or those who have undergone recent stress or trauma, or who suffer from other diseases, are also at high risk because their immune systems may be compromised.

Parvo is bad news for all involved—the dog, the family and the veterinary staff.

Parvo is preventable

The good news is that parvo is **preventable.** A series of vaccinations, given at regular intervals, enable your dog's immune system to respond quickly and strongly to overcome the invading virus.

Every day we receive calls from the owners of young pups who have received misinformation from various non-veterinarian sources about recommended vaccination schedules. The minimal schedule is for the pup to receive vaccinations for parvovirus (usually combined with vaccine to prevent four or five other deadly dogviruses) at the ages of 6 weeks, 8 weeks, 12 weeks, 16 weeks and annually thereafter.

Each and every one of these shots is important. Often we hear a new pup owner proclaim that "the breeder said the pup had all of its shots." Rarely is this an accurate statement!! Very few breeders know what an adequate vaccination schedule is, and many choose not to vaccinate adequately because the cost for the whole litter may be prohibitive.

Some breeders order vaccine through mail order catalogs or from a farm supply store. This vaccine may be short-dated or not handled and stored properly, which can decrease its effectiveness. Most pups are placed in their new homes between 6 and 10 weeks of age. There is no way they can have received all their shots!

Your veterinarian is not "just trying to make money"

by recommending frequent vaccination boosters. He or she is following the advice of the vaccine manufacturers who have spent time and money testing the vaccine, and know what it will and will not

By recommending a series of vaccinations admin-


istered by a veterinarian, he or she is only trying to avoid the unnecessary death of your four-legged family member. If you cannot afford the vaccinations, don't get the dog! Without that commitment, it is certain you cannot afford the treatment to try to save your infected pet.

AKC registration or the amount of money paid for the dog mean nothing when it comes to quality or health.

Parvovirus is a heart-breaker for all involved. Don't take chances. If you love your dog, contact your veterinarian to be sure your pet is adequately protected.
