The East Jordan Electric Light and Power Company are installing new "Ideal" Compound Condensing Engine to be used for auxiliary purposes.

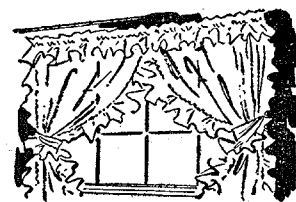

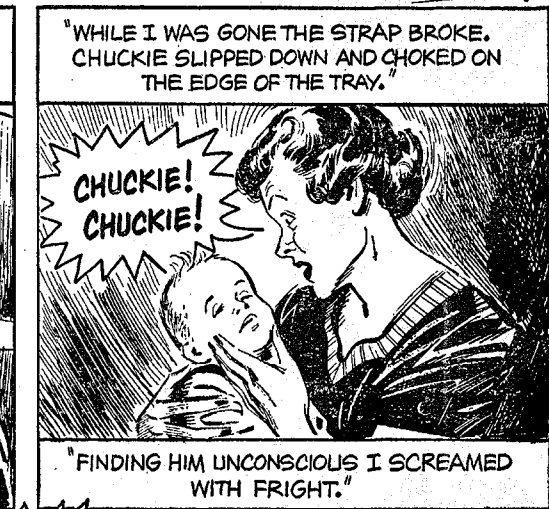

Hi Fellas:

Whoeee — talk about rain — the Heavens opened and down it came. Everything was overflowing — the streets — the ditches — the river — and the woods; Just like the rainy season in Japan. With some of this moisture had split up and got here a week or two ago.

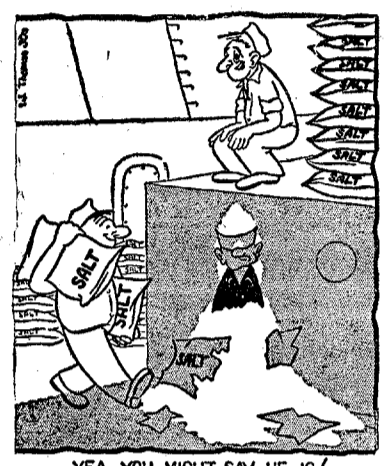
