

Orchard Notes . . .

Now is an excellent time to haul that manure out in the orchard. Spread this fall if possible or very early in the spring for best results on the 1955 growing season.

The way soil is managed today weeds, grass or cover crops will prevent soil washing next spring when the snow melts.

Sweet cherries respond to manure better than any other fertilizer. Montmorency run a close second. More stock farms are selling their manure today than formerly.

Too heavy a coat of manure spread late in the season may cause the trees to grow too late. Especially where cultivated late. Many orchards have considerable black heart from growing too late in the season. That occasional low temperature during November or December comes along every few years.

Cherries are a short season crop. Four months to be exact. April, May, June and July. So do all you can during April and as little as possible after July 1st—except spraying and harvesting.

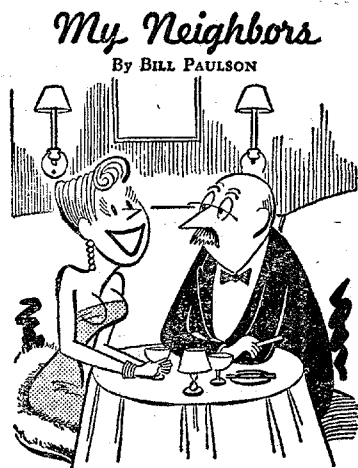
Unto A Good Land—Moerg—A story of Swedish immigrants to Minnesota in 1850.

"Keep Five Alive" Is Police Slogan For Safety Day

"Keep Five Alive" is the slogan of the Michigan State Police in connection with S-D Day—Safe Driving Day—which is to be observed nationally December 15, according to Sergeant Oscar M. Anderson, commanding officer of the Gaylord post.

S-D Day, sponsored by the President's Action Committee for Traffic Safety, has been set up as a challenge to motorists and pedestrians alike to go 24 hours without accidents.

"The significance of 'Keep

Five Alive' lies in the fact that last year there was an average of five traffic deaths each day in Michigan," said Sergeant Anderson. "We're calling on drivers and pedestrians to show that we can save these five lives by having a death free day through careful driving and walking."

"We're asking them not to be involved in one of the more than 500 accidents that occur in our state each day and to avoid being one of the 160 persons in-

jured in them or to cause the injury of anyone. This may sound like a large order, but it can be done if everyone faithfully observes courtesy to the driver and pedestrian and gives full attention to what he is doing."

The sergeant pointed out that President Eisenhower himself has appealed for observance of the day and that Michigan, as the automobile state, has a special responsibility to cooperate fully and "Keep Five Alive."

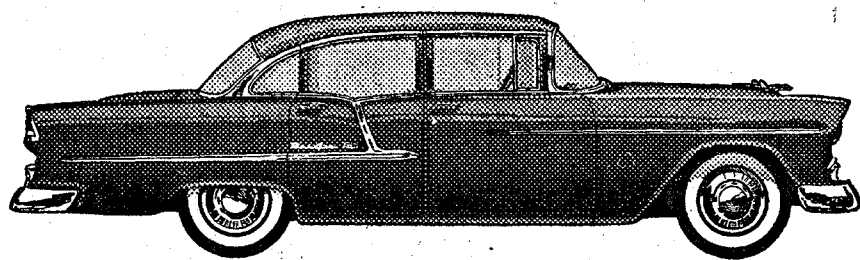
