## MSC Offers Traveling Short Course

Michigan State College is offering a short course which allows students to see successful farm operations first hand, Ed Rehman, Charlevoix county agricultural agent announced this week.

Agricultural Economist L. H. (Hi) Brown will conduct the class on the bus trip to outstanding Michigan farms. Dates are August 15-26.

The traveling short course starts at the MSC campus. Beginning with farms in southern Michigan, the class will travel through much of the lower peninsula, according to Rehman.

Farms elected for the course are those making the greatest use of modern ideas and methods, where records have been kept for several years. After each farm visit, an evening class session will be held to discuss the business in detail.

Those interested in enrolling for the course can obtain details at the county extension office at Boyne City or by writing the Short Course Department, Michigan State College, East Lansing.

Roger Stokes was born in Flint and went to school there until the third grade when his family moved to a farm south of East Jordan.

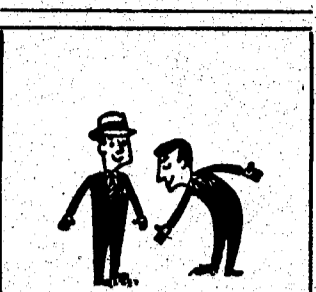
He has participated in 4-H, winning various honors. In high school his favorite subjects were science and math. Next fall Roger plans to enter Sault Tech. College.

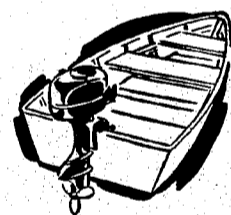
