Improvement At Airport To Include 3,600 Foot Runway

Ann 800-foot runway extension is being added to the city airport under supervision of Robert Strehl and Harry Watson, City airport commissioners for the city council.

The east-west runway will measure 3,600 feet overall when present improvement is finished.

The men are working with monies provided by the city about two years ago. The funds are matched by the state and the commissioners have some \$4,000 for current improvements. The engineering work needed for airport improvement has been furnished by the state at no cost to the city.

It is the hope of the commissioners to improve the field to the point where they will be able to receive matching state as well as federal funds for in the development of a highly useful city airport.

Present work at the field is being done by Lilak and Moore and Tuesday the progress was checked by officials of the Michigan Department of Aeronautics.

Strehl said Tuesday that department of aeronautics requirements for matching funds calls for many restrictions at the field and surrounding area. It is hope that these requirements will be met to the satisfaction of the department.

Services were held in Lansing Monday for former East Jordan Red Devil coach Abe Cohn, 62, who was stricken with a heart attack while officiating at a Haslett football game Friday night. Cohn guided the destinies of the East Jordan Red Devils from the fall of 1928 until 1942 when he entered service. He was well known among players and officials of the northern Michigan Class C conference. He was a member of the East Jordan Masonic Lodge and attended the Presbyterian church here. In the spring of 1963 Mr. Cohn's name was entered in the state's hall of fame for veteran Michigan coaches in recognition of his more than quarter century in the sports field. In recent years he was a member of the faculty at Lansing Eastern high school and made his residences with his wife in Mason. Recently Cohn remarked "Northern Michigan was real good to me in the 30's, both as a coach and as an official of football and basketball."

Mr. Hegerberg joined the old East Jordan Light and Power Company in 1919. Later he was employed by the Michigan Public Service Company and then Consumers Power Company, for whom he worked at the time of his death.

On October 10, 1933 Mr. Hegerberg was united in marriage to Agnes Kenny, at Spring Lake. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church, a charter member and past president of the East Jordan Rotary Club and for many years was a member of the East Jordan Volunteer Fire Department.

Surviving in addition to his wife are four sisters and three brothers: Mrs. Carl Bush and Mrs. Gordan Higgins, of Onaway; Mrs. Alex Robinson, of Detroit and Mrs. John Sarnowski, of Dearborn. Brothers surviving are Emil, of Bath; Arnie, of Boyne City and Peter of Jackson. Several neices and nephews also survive.

Bearers were Greg Boswell, Lysle Johnston, W. W. Rogers, Sr., Robert Campbell, Charles Landers and Howard Porter.

At least one large business organization cannot find proper space in which to locate within our city. The national chain has indicated several times that it would like to expand here, but so far has not been able to do so.

This poses a question about any other firms that might want to move into East Jordan.

If a firm that does not seek financial help cannot now find space to locate, how can the community expect to encourage any other new business to make East Jordan its home?

Somehow we must protect ourselves from the feeling that East Jordan is a difficult place in which to locate a new business.

For that feeling is beginning to spread.

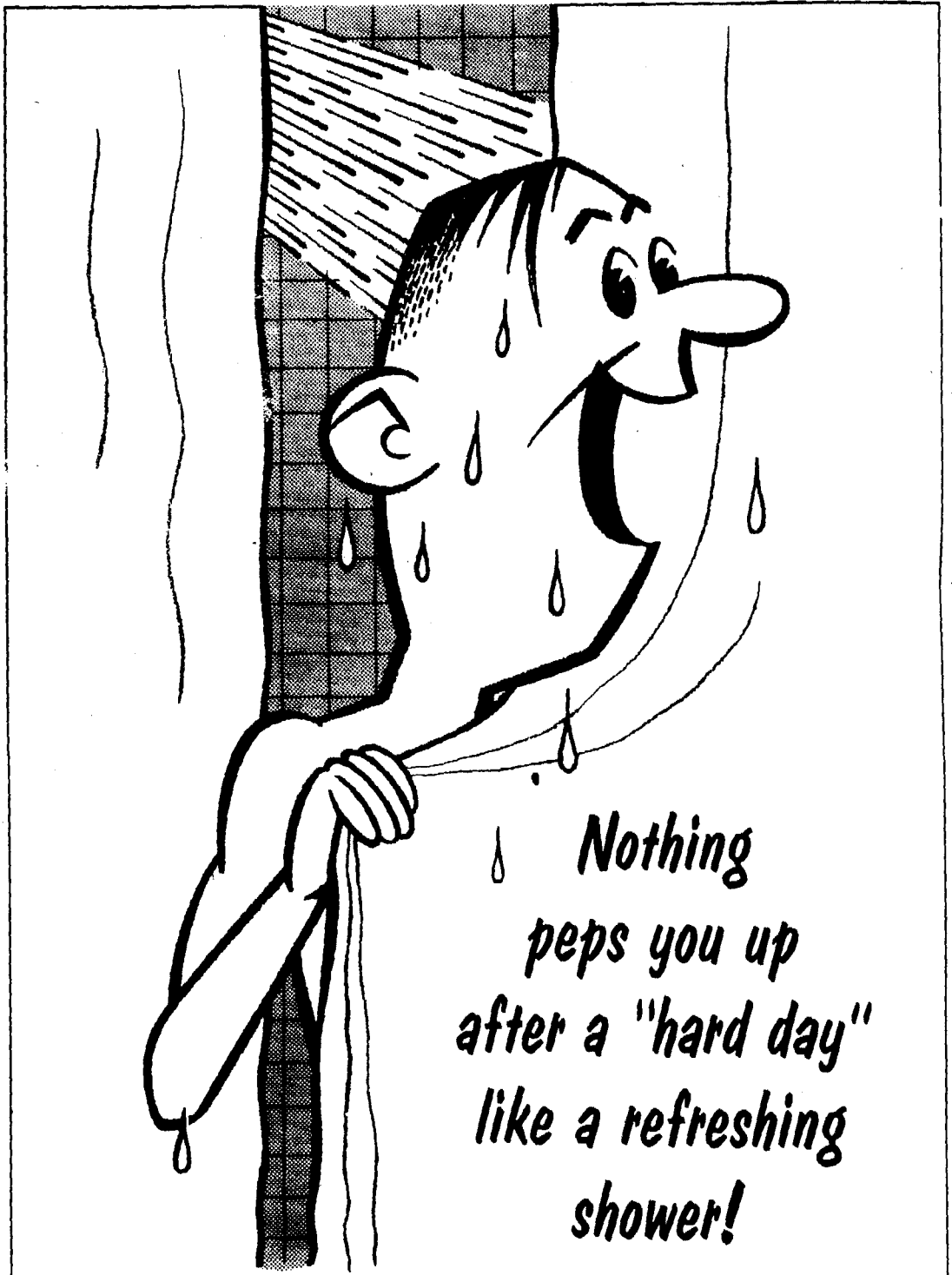

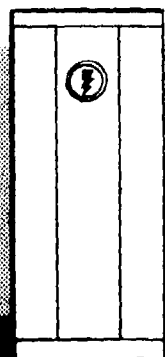

At Harbor Springs the Devils will have to contain a man named Kilborn whose weight and speed has earned the rams a 2-1-1 record and third place in the current standings.

Although East Jordan swamped Mancelona in the rushing department (129 yards to the Ironmen's minus 10), the Harbor game calls for improved Red Devil blocking, no fumbles and a continuation of the passing work seen at Mancelona Friday night.

Ted Sherman added his own extra point following his four yard run into pay dirt at Mancelona and opened Devil scoring in the first period on the Ironmen field.

It was Steve Bell scoring for the locals in the second quarter when he displayed almost professional side stepping and ball carrying as he struck through left end in a beautiful sweep that covered 40 yards. He ran his own conversion to give the Devils a comfortable 14-0 lead at half-time.

In the closing moments of the game Don Gee scored from the one and then heaved to Daugherty for the extra point.

The Red Devils picked up a total of 37 yards via the accurate arm of Gee who hit on four out of seven tries.

Wayne Wilson took the Ironmen out of a scoring possibility when he recovered a Mancelona fumble and later he moved in to block a punt.

It is hoped that the long awaited break through may come in the Harbor game for speedster Steve Bell who is a great threat to any team when he is still on his feet beyond the line of scrimmage.

East Jordan will take a winning combination to Harborland Friday night, but it must include the means of holding Kilborn to low yardage if the locals are to move up in the standings with this one.

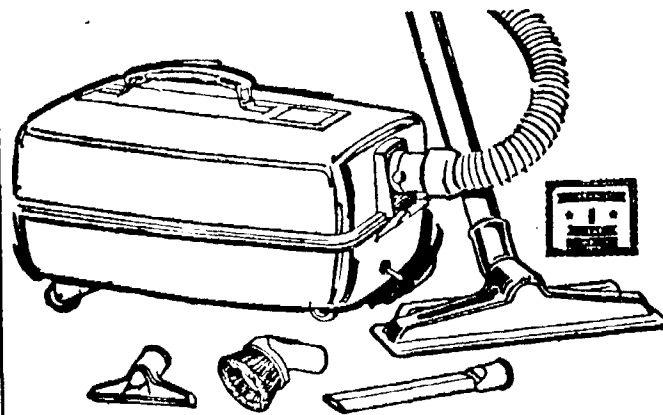
AROUND EAST JORDAN
