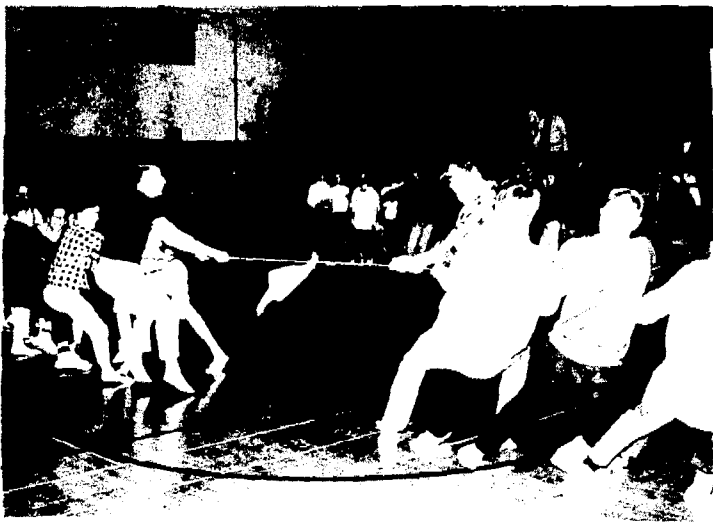

Services were held 2 p.m. Tuesday at Watson Funeral Home for Joseph Paliske, 89, who died at Grandvue Hospital, October 31st. Rev. Marcus Krake of the United Missionary Church officiated at the services and burial was in Sunset Hill cemetery.

Mr. Paliske was born July 8, 1876 in Grand Rapids where he spent many years employed in the furniture industry. He was a cabinet maker and a furniture carver.

Mr. Paliske retired in 1938, moving to East Jordan where he resided in Cherryvale off the Deer Lake Road.

He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. George Fanelli, of Chicago.

Helen Campeau will be installed as Martha at the regular meeting November 10.

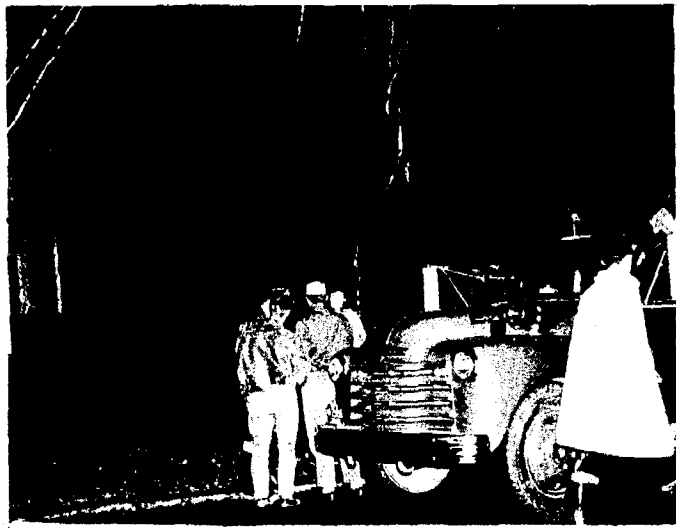

A great deal of enjoyment and a real opportunity "to learn by doing" is possible for those students who participate. Thousands of entries are sent in from every state.

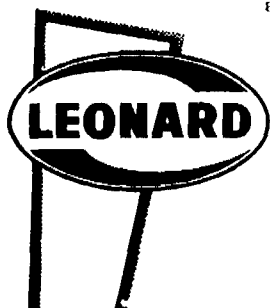
