She revealed there are 40,878 members in the state, 22 per cent of which are new members of less than two years standing. Seven per cent are members of 20 years or more.

Make a date to see these carrot-topped lassies strut their stuff when they tangle with East Jordan's men's team April 26, 8 p.m. at the high school gym.


City Warns Against **Grass Fires**
