The first plant visited was the East Jordan Foundry which makes special hydrants for East Detroit and Chicago, manhole covers and castings needed by all municipalities. The plant has

ations. Five brothers operate this Crossing the river upon enterhuge foundry.

The Cooperative Dairy makes an impressive appearance along the banks of the Jordan and employs approximately 30 people in the plant besides having 17 trucks to transport the milk used for processing. The dairy produces butter, dried milk and dried buttermilk.

East Jordan's Business Men's Association has been instrumental in bringing the Mt. Clemens Metals Products company to their village. This plant stamps out plates which are used in the operation of windows in cars. Before leaving East Jordan we were informed that this company expects to enlarge their plant. They employ at the present time expanded constantly until now it approximately 150 men and women.

and it appears that expansion of the box factory will be needed in the near future. Some of the cedar used for boxes was obtained from Blanev Park area. The East Jordan Cooperative

has grown enormously since its inception. It provides feed and farm machinery for the surrounding farm area.

A seasonal factory operating at East Jordan was the canning factory. At peak times it employs about 200 workers. It cans asparagus and cherries which are raised on its own property. The Mayor was fortunate in arriving as they finished canning asparagus and was the recipient of a case. John Porter heads this organization, formerly with the lumber industry and is well acquainted with a host of lumber men in and around Newberry, a territory which he covered in the

early days of lumbering. Mayor and Mrs. Jackson visi-

ted with the Sedgemans, formerly of Newberry, and they wished to be remembered to their many friends here.

In the evening Mayor and Mrs. Jackson were the guests of the municipal officers and the Business Men's Club, at a banquet held at the Jordan Inn. The Business Men's Club and the councilmen presented both the Mayor and Mrs. Jackson with gifts commemorating their visit.

Mayor Jackson said: "We were most impressed with the spirit of cooperation exhibited by all citizens of East Jordan and the interest they displayed in each other's work and enterprises, seemingly placing the goal of East Jordan above personal gain and profit. Their hospitality was graciously extended and we hope as graciously received."

A new Charlevoix county livestock marketing service, sponsored by the county Farm Bureau will start operations when the first truck load of livestock goes to St. Louis, Michigan, June 13th.

Livestock will be offered for sale there at the farmer-owned sale operated by Michigan Livestock Exchange.

Ear tags will be used on each animal at the farm and a receipt issued by trucker Lyle Smith, of East Jordan. He will make a weekly run to the St. Louis market each Monday.

According to Charlevoix County Farm Bureau officials, insurance for crippling or death of livestock in transit will be carried.

The new marketing service, it is said, is the result of a united effort to bring better opportunities for marketing livestock to Charlevoix county and is another Farm Bureau Service.

It doesn't seem to matter what has been invented; sooner or later the Russians get around to claiming credit for it. Now the bearers of the Red Banner have added phototypesetting to a somewhat impressive and ever-increasing list.

A Soviet pamphlet reports that about 60 years ago one V. A. Gassyev invented the first filmsetting machine. He paid license fees for his patent for several years, but it seems nothing was heard from him between 1909 and 1950. In the latter year, a Soviet printing in-dustry paper, Poligrafitcheskoye Proisvodstvo (how come we aren't on its exchange list?), got around to printing an article on the invention. Mr. Gassyev was discovered still teaching physics in a small town in the Caucasus region.

Gassyev's machine, which, incidentally, the above-named PP says is still in his possession, is about the size of an ordinary typewriter. The keyboard is electrically motivated and shift keys turn a disc with 120 letters and signs in 30 rows toward a photo objective to expose any character the operator selected.

The Soviets also are supposed to have conducted other experiments in film typesetting. Who knows? Who can prove it? Maybe the claim invalid; maybe it isn't. The Russians won't lift the Iron Curtain long enough to photograph an ampersand, much less the whole alphabet.







we want their competition to keep us on our toes.







Marlene Brown Marries Sgt. **McGinnis Here**




