"The friendliness of the people." (A life-long area resident, Charles went to school and later taught in East Jordan.)

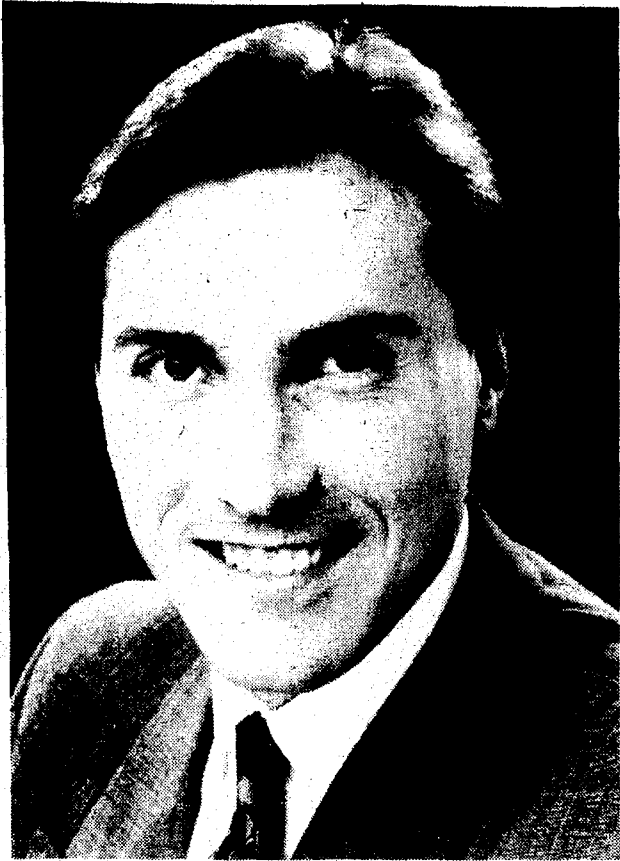

As Noon and Weekend Meteorologist for Iowa's KGAN-TV, Allen authored a viewer-oriented weather newsletter and developed the "Hometown Weather Watchers." He also worked in radio, broadcasting agricultural-oriented forecasts and farm market news.

Allen received his Bachelor of Science degree in Meteorology from Northern Illinois University. In college, he took part in "tornado chasing" experiments, where scientists try to get as close as possible to tornados to collect information. Once, in 1988, the tables turned and Allen was chased by a tornado! The car he was in was hit with mud and debris as he and a colleague successfully raced to get ahead of the funnel cloud.

Allen is a member of the American Meteorological Society and the National Weather Association.

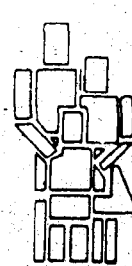

During the deployment, the ship steamed 45,000 miles, spent 140 days at sea, launched over 300 sorties of its two SH-60 Seahawk helicopters and was named "Top Gun" of the USS Saratoga, battle group.

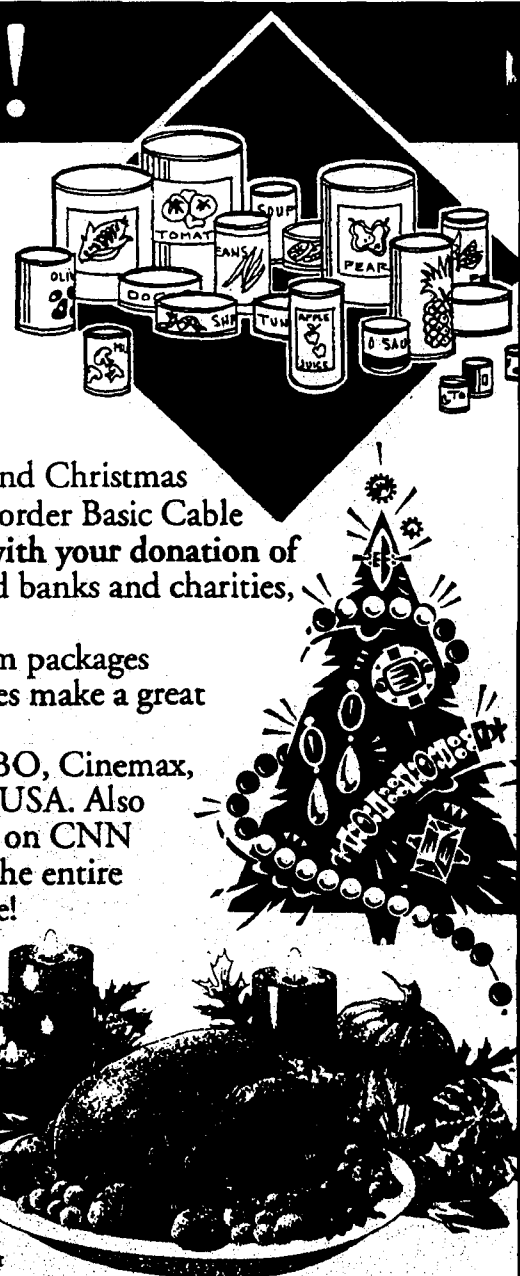

Thursday with Alanson, the Alanson team went on a second quarter 15-5 binge to take a lead at the half of 19-10.

Central Lake finished 13-7, 9-5 in Ski Valley play. The Lady Trojans took on host Ellsworth in district play Monday, the winner to play Alba Wednesday at 8:30 in Ellsworth. The district final is set for Friday at 7 p.m.

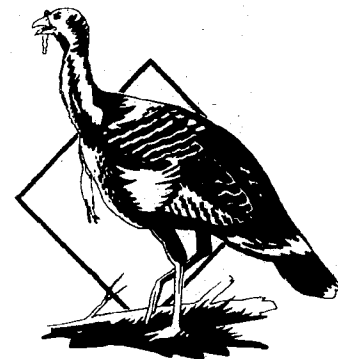

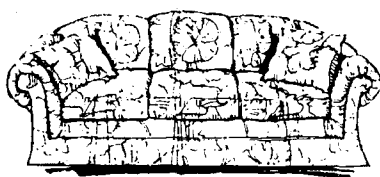

Clark was taken to the Charlevoix Area Hospital by Life Link Ambulance Service. As of Monday, Clark was not listed as a patient at Charlevoix.



The following ordinance is published to remind residents of certain practices which:

- A. Interfere with plowing of county roads;
- C. Create serious hazards to the traveling public; and
- D. Expose violators to substantial penalties as well as personal liability in the event of accidents caused by such activities.

SECTION 1. No person shall park or abandon any vehicle or other objects or occupy the right-of-way of a public road in any manner which interferes with snow removal or maintenance on any public highway, street or alley.

SECTION 2. No person shall park or abandon any vehicle or other objects or occupy the right-of-way of a public road in any manner which encumbers, obstructs or endangers the use of any public highway, street or alley.

SECTION 3. No person shall deposit on any public highway, street or alley or the right-of-way thereof, snow or ice which has been removed from private driveways or private property.

SECTION 4. The County Clerk is hereby directed to cause this ORDINANCE to be published as soon as possible in all newspapers of general circulation in the County. This ORDINANCE shall take effect sixty (60) days after its adoption by the Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 5. Any person who shall be convicted of a violation of this ORDINANCE shall be subject to a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or imprisonment in the County Jail for ninety (90) days or both.

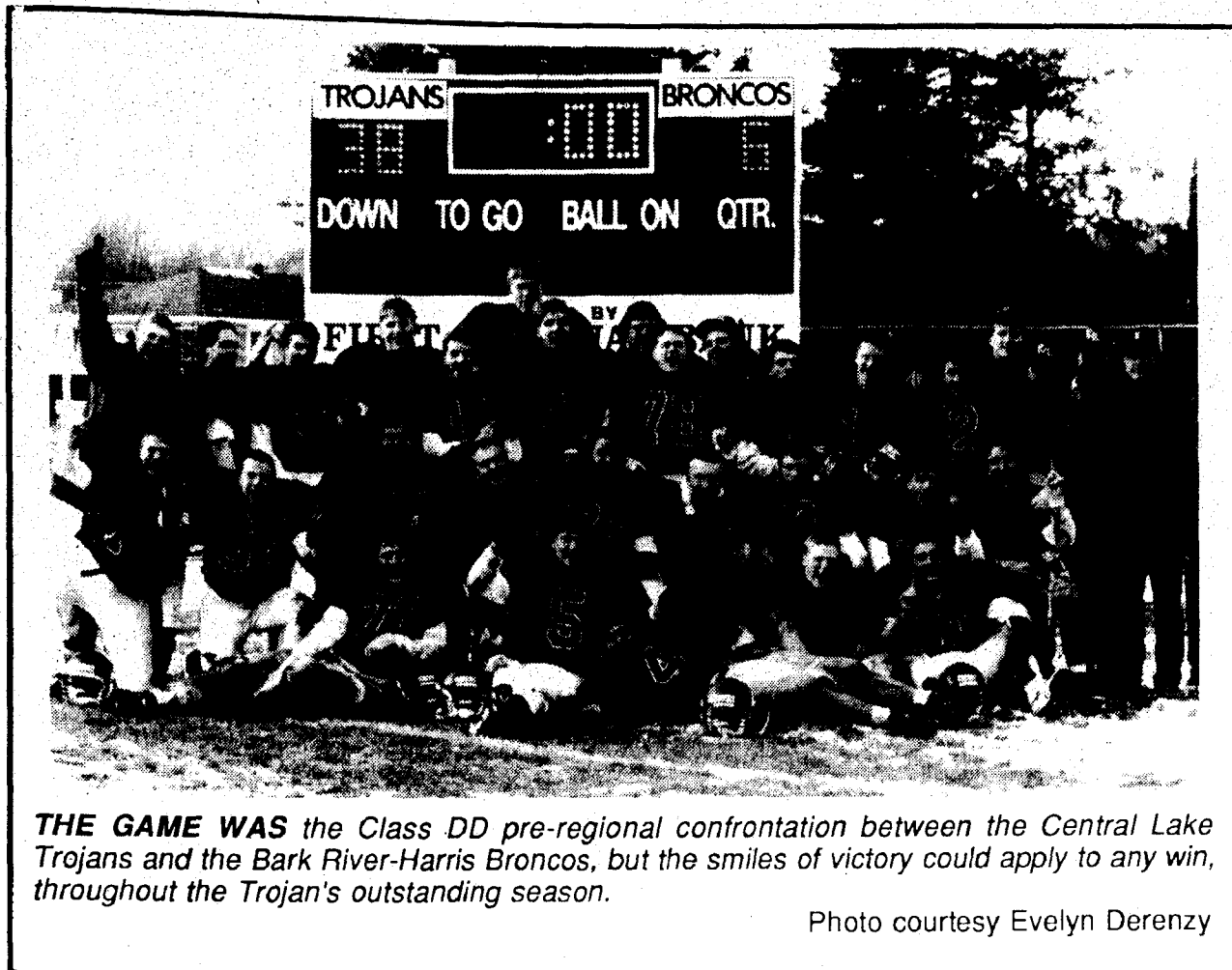
The theme was Canada's National Parks, narrated by Ed Lark, who was a good speaker, clear and loud.


