




Student attends school in New Zealand

Have you ever been thousands of miles from home in a foreign land, living with strangers for a year? That was the real-life 1991 experience of Dave Bavers an East Jordan High School

Bavers was there as an exchange student sponsored by the local Rotary club in conjunction with the Rotary in New Plymouth, New Zealand. New Plymouth is a community of 45,000 population located on the North Island of New Zealand.

While there, Bavers attended the New Plymouth Boys High School. Yes! An all boys school. However, he did finish the entire school year, the first exchange student to so persevere. It seems his predecessors transfered to the coeducational public school after one term.

He had to make a more serious adjustment when he discovered students had to wear uniforms. He swallowed hard and wore the drill shorts, dress shirt, wool sweater (regardless of temperature) wool knit socks and dress shoes. (See picture)

Daily life at school was somewhat different than in East Jordan. There were five class sessions instead of seven, and as he confessed with a smile, "The curriculum was more difficult." It seems the basic math class included: geometry, trigonometry and even calculus. In addition the class rotation was the same on Monday but changed daily for the remainder of the week.

The sports were; Rugby - soccer - and cricket. Bavers did play on a club rugby team and enjoyed it immensely.

Since school did not start for a month, boredom was one of the biggest difficulties he experienced. He survived by working out in a local gym and swimming.

Bavers actually had three different host families, none of whom, had teens at home. One of his hosts, Max Barker, is the President of the New Zealand Fire Service.

Meals were taken at the same time as in America - breakfast, lunch and dinner. However he never did get used to all the mutton. But then, what can you expect in a country of three million people and 67 million

Bavers did enjoy the scenery. Despite travel being somewhat restricted - the Rotary had to know his whereabouts at all times and he could not leave the district (county) without permission - he managed to vist the national capitol Wellington, Auckland and South Island. The island trip was a two week tour with 18 exchange students from other countries was highlight of the year.

Attending an all-boys school is not conducive to a well rounded social life but Dave

did have some dates. In fact, one of his most enjoyable times was with a female exchange student from Rio De Janiero, who taught him how to do the "Lambatta" a native Brazilian

Life was not all fun and games. He did well in classes such as, math, biology, history, English and chemistry. He also learned a lot about the country and the people.

The teens were openly warm and friendly and deluged him with questions about America. On the other hand, he found the adults not very. outgoing - "They were friendly on the surface how to manage money and live on his own. but hard to get close to." He discovered that most of the people are well - travelled, many having been to America more than once.

Currently New Zealand, is experiencing high unemployment but most people live comfortably. "I did not see any slums or extremely poor areas however, no extremely rich areas either."

Bavers learned that the country does have resident natives called Maori. They are mostly integrated throughout the country but, according to Dave - "Generally discriminated against in daily life."

He credits the experience with teaching him tolerance, diplomacy, and most importantly,

Bavers readily admits to developing a fondness for New Zealand and hopes to return some day.

Mortensen tutors in literacy program

campleted a semester of tutoring through the Gratiot County Reading Affair of Central Lake, a junior at Alma College, has Gratiot County Reading/Michigan Method Literacy Program.

Part of Alma's W.K. Kellogg Foundationfunded Service Learning Program, the tutoring program involves volunteers working one-onone with students in area school districts as well as with adults in the community who need assistance improving reading and basic literacy

The tutoring program enables Alma students to learn valuable lessons outside of the classroom. "The tutors learned a whole lot about teaching and about themselves. They also learned about the larger issue of illiteracy," said

CENTRAL LAKE - Stephanie Mortensen Dr. John Ottenhoff, associate professor of English at Alma College and faculty advisor of the tutoring program.

> An English major who is also seeking teacher certification at the secondary level, Mortensen participated in the program to gain applicable experience. "I thought that through working with illiterate students I could get a grip on how to handle those types of problems," she said.

> Being involved with the program has had a positive influence on Mortensen. "I learned a lot from it ... It was a good experience, and I'm going to try and do it again next term. I would recommend it to anyone," she said.

Mortensen, a 1990 graduate of Central Lake High School, is the daughter of Gary and Susan Mortensen of Central Lake.

Nursery offers pre-school programs

East Jordan's co-op nursery is a cooperative venture by teachers and parents.

The nursery is in the Presbyterian Church annex. The teacher is Barb Wolf. Classes are every morning Monday through Friday. The younger children attend on Tuesdays and Thursdays and the older children attend on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Friday is a more in depth instructional day.

The Co-op has had very good results. After nursery the children are socially and emotionally ready for school. They are able to follow directions, sit still and know their letters when they complete nursery school.

The Co-op Nursery has two fund raising events a year. The largest is a sub-sandwich sale just before Thanksgiving. This year they sold 4200 sandwiches. The children sell the sandwiches and the money goes toward expenses for the nursery. The second sale is around Easter and is a candy sale.

The nursery is fun learning experience. Everything is created by the children.

The school is full at this time but they are always taking applications. A child should be 3 by December 1st to enter.

The nursery has been able to improve the church annex through their fund-raising efforts. The church only charges them nominal rent so they like to add something every year to make the building more attractive.

In East Jordan there are other programs for pre-schoolers. The school offers a young 5 program, and a prep-program. Char-Em offers a B-4 program. These classes include testing to determine the child's readiness to enter school.

Inclusion

Inclusion, the mainstreaming of special needs students, can be achieved in several ways. The team of teachers at East Jordan have found that their method has very beneficial results.

All special needs students are grouped together in the same way as sixth, seventh and eighth grades. They change classes among their team of teachers, are members of a group and take part in school activities along with all other students at the school.

Previously, students were part of the regular class groups, but went to special remedial classes at various times during the day. The effect was to emphasize the special needs students' difference in a negative way.

Student and parental response to the inclusion team has been very positive.

Shadowing Program

Academic Advisor Lynne Zimmer has introduced a Shadowing Program to East Jordan Middle School students. Shadowing is an opportunity for the students to observe professionals.

The cooperating adult goes about his or her daily routine while the student "shadows," in other words, follows the adult around.

Middle school age is the time to begin thinking of future career choices. The student shadowing a school principal, sheriff or beautician starts the process to making the decision on a career that seems attractive.

The student may also discover he or she doesn't care to choose a certain profession after all. This discovery can be just as important.

Zimmer will present a workshop outlining the shadowing program. She will include such details as recruiting professionals and student transportation.

Students are chosen for the program according to behavior rather than academic achievement.

Math Program Teresa Noirot and Bill Chase will conduct a workshop on a new program they have implemented at East Jordan.
