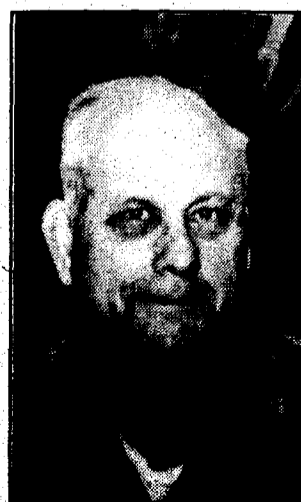
Future plans might include a deck overlooking the water to the rear of the bar. For now, Weidinger says, "remember, the snowmobile trail ends at the Rainbow Bar."

Editor Bob Cullen visited the East Jordan Senior Center to get reactions to a possible national health care system, such as President Clinton has been talking about.

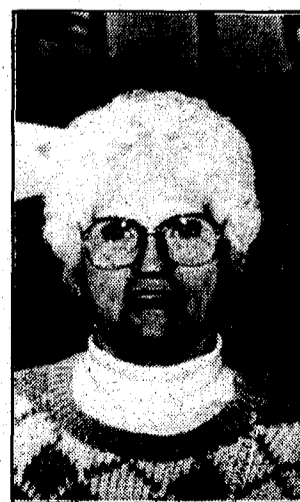
He encountered varying opinions in the interviews. Some persons felt it is a good idea, others, think it would not be good. Some said the Canadian system is successful, others said it was not. Their was consensus however, that something must be done about the cost of health care and prescriptions, because so many people are now forced to go without.

Capsule interviews follow.



Harry Watson of East Jordan, "I am retired, but still functional and have health insurance and medicare, but I feel that a national health care system is a bad idea. We will never reduce the cost of health care until everyone pays for their own care. Under our current system, everyone goes to the doctor right away

because insurance pays for it. I believe 75 percent of those who go for tests and exams really don't need them. Besides, every time the government runs a program we end up on the short end of the stick."



Edna Nielsen 77, of East Jordan, "Something has to be done because the price of health care is out of control. I am very happy to have Blue Cross - Blue Shield coverage but I am worried because the cost keeps increasing. My cost every three months in 1992 was \$349, this year it is

\$423. I do not think the government should run a health care program. They have taken too much from social security as is."

EAST JORDAN CITY COUNCIL NEWS

City of E.J. will maintain engine

The City of East Jordan will resume responsibility for the maintenance of the Memorial Park engine exhibit. In a letter read by Mayor Peck at the February 2, council meeting, the Portside Historical Society made the transfer official.

The Society made the restoration possible by raising the necessary funds and over-seeing the project.

The Jordan Valley Freedom Festival's list of requests was approved by the council. The requests are associated with activities of the Independence Weekend.

The city council had a request of its own. Anita Chew asked that the parade route be expanded to include Main Street north to Division so that more shaded seating will be available.

The parade route is presently undecided. A change from the past may be required because the state has begun denying use of state highways for local parades.

City council will be considering the vacating of alleys in the Mill Street area, but tabled discussion on the intent because of Superintendent Bob Johnson's absence.

The zoning committee is in the annual process of review, and when the review is complete, recommendations for change within the zoning codes will be reported to the council.

The Parks and Recreation committee reported some changes of East Jordan Tourist Park rules. The seventh day free camping is to be eliminated. The cost of renting the log building will be increased to \$50 and include a \$30 refundable cleaning deposit.

Another change for the Tourist Park will be the designation of Cummins Street as a one-way street. The park staff recommended this as a way

to improve traffic flow.

The committee also discussed improvements to the dock area. These will include removal of the sand island and increasing dockage space. A commitment was made to provide budgeting for the improvements.

According to the East Jordan Public Safety Committee, a discussion was held concerning a complaint by one of the townships. East Jordan firemen were alleged to have responded to alarms while impaired by alcohol.

The committee discussed the fact that East Jordan Fire Department has always had a good professional image throughout the area. They were surprised by the allegations, but agreed that they are a concern and must be responded to.

The fire department is presently dealing internally with the situation. The city council is in the process of developing a policy relative to alcohol use.

The committee reiterated their support and appreciation for the great work of the East Jordan Fire Department.



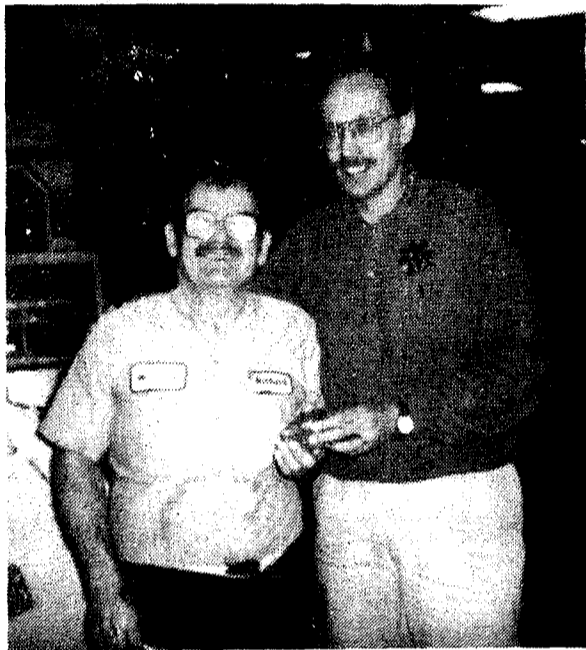

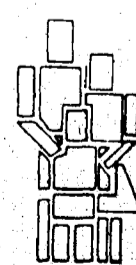

Free tax guide is available

A guide to assist Michigan taxpayers with their 1992 returns is available free of charge from the Lansing office of state Rep. Allen Lowe, R-Grayling.

The 105th District lawmaker said the publication also is available at area post offices and county courthouses. The district includes Alcona, Antrim, Crawford, Kalkaska, Montmorency, Oscoda and Otsego counties.

The 45-page guide has material on topics such as property taxes, homestead property tax credits, farmland and open-space tax relief, energy tax credits, Single Business Tax and home-heating credit program. Also included are tax forms and a list of phone numbers for assistance.

"The booklet does not provide line-by-line for completing income tax forms," Lowe added. "That information is in the Department of Treasury's income tax instruction books included with the tax forms. This guide, however, may ease the burden of filling out state tax forms and could even help families save money."

Alzheimer's respite funds awarded in northern Michigan

The Michigan Department of Mental Health recently received a federal grant in the amount of \$619,368. The grant money is intended to provide new or additional respite and community-based support services for caregivers of persons afflicted with Alzheimer's disease or other conditions that result in dementia.

The Northern Michigan Community Mental Health Board, which covers Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Emmet and Otsego counties, was one of eight Community Mental Health Boards in the state selected to receive an equal share of the funds.

The grant to Northern Michigan CMH was \$62,000 of federal money. The grant required \$20,666 of local match that will be raised primarily through in-kind services from a variety of sources. The Charlevoix County Commission On Aging is one of the five recipients of funds. The funds will be used for in-home respite, and adult day care.

Recognizing the seriousness of the problem, as much money as possible will be directed into services that will have an immediate impact for care providers.

It is hoped that providing a variety of support services to caregivers will help them be successful in their efforts to maintain their loved ones at home and in the community without endangering their own health and well-being in the process.

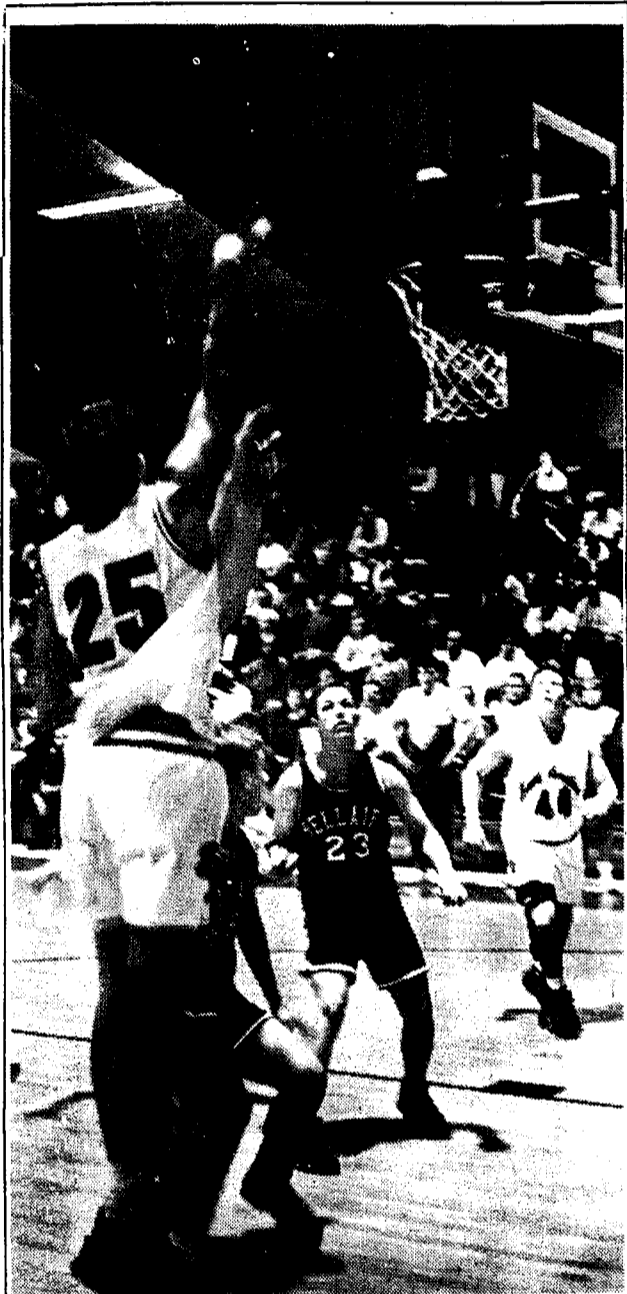
