




A really useful engine in her day

Old Number Six on the East Jordan and Southern railroad line is ready to roll. At least she looks that way, thanks to the attention of the Portside Arts and Historical Society.

Actually the engine, in her new shelter, was rededicated on July 3, 1992, 31 years after her final run.

In the early days of EJ&S the line was an integral part of the Northern Michigan logging industry. They carried timber of the north woods on the short line from Bellaire to the East Jordan mill. Tall-masted schooners then carried the finished lumber out to the Big Lake via Lake Charlevoix.

East Jordan was still a small milltown, but the population was rapidly expanding. Folks needed transport too, so the small logging line was incorporated as a common carrier in 1901. in time, EJ&S was operating four locomotives, three passenger cars, seven flats, two service cars and 112 log buggies. Number Six made her last run in August 1961, when the line shut down. EJ&S General Manager and son of founder W.P. Porter, Howard Porter was reluctant to scrap the magnificent machine. He donated it to the city of East Jordan and it was interred in a place of honor at Memorial Park.

As the years passed, old Number Six sat neglected, her charm deteriorating. The decay was most evident in the cowcatcher, held in place

by huge, now rotting oak beams. By 1990, she was an embarrassing eyesore with an uncertain future.

The city seriously considered either scrapping the engine or selling her to interested train buffs. The projected cost of restoration made that option unlikely.

Alarmed at the prospect of losing a unique reminder of the past, the Portside Society approached city council with a rehabilitation plan. The cost was estimated to be \$8000, but finished closer to \$10,000. Ironi-

Four more recall petitions rejected

Four petitions filed with the county clerk to recall the Central Lake Township supervisor, treasurer and two trustees were rejected by the Antrim County Election Commission Feb. 26 on grounds each petition included complaints on actions taken prior to the current term of office.

Meeting for the second time in a week, the commission, Probate Judge John Unger, County Clerk Laura Sexton and County Treasurer Beverly Edgington, reviewed the clarity of wording on petitions to recall supervisor Paul Vernon, treasurer Cheryl Shooks and trustees William Murray and William Gadwau. On Feb. 22 the commission rejected the wording on a petition to recall clerk Marilyn Lucas.

County Prosecutor Charles Koop, asked by the commission for his opinion, noted his research into court cases cast doubt on each petition be-

cause each one cited an alleged violation of the Open Meetings Act on Nov. 5, 1992, prior to the Nov. 20, 1992 start of the current term of office.

"Only matters occurring during the current term of office are subject to recall, the reason probably being because the voters recently spoke in the election," Koop stated.

Since the commission acts solely on the clarity of petitions, each one must be read as a whole, he said. However, it is important to separate material cited before and after current terms began.

"It is my opinion that anything that happened prior to Nov. 20, 1992 is not a proper subject for recall," Koop said, adding that nothing in his research allows the commission to strike any language. They must rule on the petition as a whole.

Other wording on the petitions also caused the commission to vote unanimously for rejection. Unger noted one item that should have cited the


ordinance that was allegedly violated. Sexton pointed out the petitions should be specific about township names as well as office titles. Koop said names on petitions should match the names as they appeared on the ballot.

Following the vote to reject the four petitions, Koop said it should be understood that though a person is officially recalled from the office currently held, that person could run for and be elected to another office within the same township.

"You could wind up just reshuffling the chairs on the deck of the Titanic," he said. "I would hope the petition proponents will rethink this whole thing." Besides that, Koop added, all costs of recall elections will be the township's responsibility.

By Friday afternoon, new petitons were filed with the county clerk on the same four people, Vernon, Shooks, Murray and Gadwau, and a clarity hearing on them was set for March 16.



Cain Derenzy went to the top of the charts with a 13-point scoring binge for Central Lake, Jamie Evans scored nine and Chad Pletcher six.

The jayvee Trojans were victorious 60-50 with Stuart Hickman scoring 12 and Tom Ernst, Brad Klooster and Ryan Newton all adding to the win.

Friday at Alanson, the home team had its way from the first moment and never stopped as the Vikings went onward to the 76-59 win over Central Lake. The combined efforts of Pletcher, Eldrington, Aenis and Ager weren't enough to slow down Alanson's Sam Hargreaves from getting 31 points and remaining the top scoring threat in the conference.

Central Lake is the host school for the Class D District that includes Alba, Bellaire, Ellsworth, Mancelona and the Trojans, starting March 8.







They moved to East Jordan in 1965 and were active in the East Jordan Senior Citizens and Senior Citizen's Travel Club.


