





Lutheran Church to get new sanctuary



A SPECIAL SERVICE on March 14, at 6 p.m. will mark the last time the Evangelical Lutherans of East Jordan will worship in this church on Nichols Street.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of East Jordan, an affiliate of The Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, will soon have a new home.

The congregation that has been worshipping in the sanctuary on Nichols Street since 1910, will hold their first service in the new church on Sun. March 21. The new facility is on Rogers Road just south of East Jordan and East of M-66.

The last service in the old sanctuary will be on Sunday March 14 at 6 p.m. following a potluck dinner at 4:30 p.m. It will be a candlelight service with special music and a passing of the Light to the new congregation. The Harvest Barn Church has purchased the old church and will begin holding services immediately.

The candlelight service will be jointly officiated by recently retired pastor Robert Herndon and new pastor Richard Vonesh.

The first service in the new church will be Sunday March 21 at 11 a.m. Special music is being planned, with church members, guests, youth and adult choirs singing Lift High the Cross during the processional.

Choir director Bonnie Deschamps, promises to raise the roof with joint choirs, trumpets and soloists joining together for the song Let There be Praise.

Formerly known as the Norwegian Lutheran Church, it was established in 1905 and became the Evangelical Lutheran Church in 1952. They are now widely known as the Singing Congregation.


Runner sets sights for "down-under" journey

EJ city budget proposed

Juggling budget considerations has been the prime work of the East Jordan City Council and department committees for the past weeks. The completed 1993-94 proposed budget was presented at the March 2 council meeting by treasurer Glendora Gettel.

Each city department had to revise their original budget proposals because of a \$32,000 projected shortfall.

Police chief John Imeson reported that the police department is able to reduce costs in several areas. The purchase of a new patrol car will be handled over two years. The new cruiser will help reduce vehicle maintenance costs for the year. If needed, part-time labor payroll will be reduced.

Council gave permission for the new vehicle to be ordered immediately, rather than waiting for the full city budget approval. Delivery is expected to take eight to ten weeks.

Other department committees generally agreed that there should be no reduction of present services. Raising tax mills is not considered to be an option. Therefore all departments will need to assess employment costs. Provisions for maintaining adequate services must be considered before eliminating any positions.

A three-and-a-half percent salary increase to all department heads was included in the new budget. Full-time hourly non-union employees of the city also receive the same wage increase.

The proposed budget will be reviewed by council members. A hearing for public review is set for March 16, 6:45 at the city building.

In other business, superintendent Bob Johnson reported some changes to the zoning code. Currently in areas zoned residential, single family homes, including mobile homes, are allowed to be 20'x20'. New rules will require a 24'x24' minimum width. All residential dwellings will also be required to have a perimeter foundation. No specifications on the materials or type of foundation are being made.

The council approved use of safety department personnel for the regional basketball tournament at East Jordan High School. The event March 16, 17 and 19, will require police and ambulance service. There will be no charge by the police department, while East Jordan schools will pay fees incurred by the city ambulance service.

A discussion about city involvement in the county 911 project ended with councilman Lyle Etcher volunteering to represent East Jordan. Etcher has attended most of the organizational meetings and hopes to give East Jordan a stronger voice in the proceed-

The county has approached East Jordan to sponsor a full-time animal control employee. While the council agrees that this is a high priority need, the city is not interested in financing the venture further. Members of the council cited lack of city input over animal control activities and a strained budget as the reasons.

Board doesn't show responsibility

DO YOU REMEMBER that old song, Oh Boy, That's Where My Money Goes? Maybe it's time the residents of Central Lake Township learned the words

Let's start with the so-called "Central Lake Township Monthly Newsletter" of February 1993. "Socalled" because it rarely, if ever, seems to have any input from other board members besides Mr. Vernon. It is also an unbudgeted item, as stated in the newsletter itself.

Wonder how much it costs to have it printed and mailed? The postage per month runs between \$107 to \$120 per month, depending on whether the "snowbirds" have returned. The cost of printing the November issue was \$122.93 at Kwik Print on 8th Street in Traverse City. You'll notice that no local firm was used although they "contribute" to township funds. Using \$107 as the postal rate, it comes to \$2,759.16 per year. This is after the township purchased a copy machine for this purpose, among others.

Notice that nothing was said about the increases in our assessments. Now, that is something about which I would liked to have seen something written!

Mr. Vernon reported in the February issue that four board meetings had been held since the last newsletter. That comes to \$440. Trustees are paid \$55 per meeting - any meeting. That means another \$55 for every meeting of the budget review committee that Mr. Gadwau attended.

Check the budget approved by the board last April for this year's operating expenses. Prior to that time, the trustees were paid \$150 per month. As a comparison. Kearney Township trustees are paid \$50 per month. Figuring a minimum of four meetings per month, that means or trustees will have been paid \$5,280 by March 31 as compared to \$1,200 for Kearney Township. A newsletter item was about a special session at which attendance of the Michigan Township Association (MTA) "Educational Conference" in Detroit was discussed. Mr. Vernonestimated that with all board members attending, as he wished, the cost would be \$1,850. Since the board only had \$1,500 allocated for education in its budget, the balance would have to be transferred (taken) from another fund.

The Lake Access Sites item was a re-enactment of

the executive session of the Nov. 5 special meeting. If the Open Meetings Act law had been followed, this meeting would not have been necessary. That's another \$110.

The Citizens' Budget Review Committee was supposed to have been an all-volunteer group, but now the board has approved paying two members of that committee \$25 per hour each for an estimated 72 hours to complete that review of the current budget. That comes to \$1,800, who knows from which pocket of the township.

The board also voted at this meeting to again hire the same auditor used last year at \$85 per hour (approx. \$4,500-\$5,000). He will be doing the same job as the Budget Review Committee. The final cost might be more if he also has to correct the work done by this committee.

Four members of the board refused a request from clerk Marilyn Lucas in October for a mid-term audit because of "lack of funds." She was instructed to find out and report to the board the cost of having the computer programming updated. At the November meeting she reported that the cost would be \$700. Her request was refused for "lack of funds."

The latest meeting I attended was on February 25. It was a special meeting so unless you saw the notice on the township hall door, you were probably not aware of it. (There doesn't seem to be anywhere else in town that the board considers appropriate for posting such notices.)

At this meeting Mr. Vernon wanted all the computer codes listed in numerical order and codes assigned to other or new funds. This was a job the clerk or treasurer could have done in a matter of minutes, if requested. It cost you at least another \$110.

All the facts and figures quoted herein are a matter of public record and available at the township offices under the Freedom of Information Act of the State of Michigan.


My taxes go to help pay township expenses for essential services. If this is any indication of the fiscal responsibility of the township board, I don't want you anywhere near my checkbook!





The MSU Extension Service will sponsor its annual educational program for northern Michigan Christmas tree growers on Tues., March 16. The intent of this year's program is to help growers better cope with the changing tree industry by addressing both production and marketing

The meeting will be held at the Holiday Inn in Grayling, which is located on the south end of the I-75 Business Loop, Registration begins at 8:30 a.m. and the program will run from 9:30 a.m. to about 3:30 p.m. The cost to attend (for lunch, coffee, rolls and facility use) will be \$12.50 per person, payable at the door.

This year's program will address such topics as: the 1992 market season in review; the changing American consumer market; an update on federal wage and labor laws; an introduction to the new worker safety and pesticide applicator protection law; and an overview of the pine shoot beetle and other insect pests and their impact on growers.

In addition to the educational program, several equipment and chemical supply dealers have been invited to be on-hand to exhibit their products to growers in attendance.







Jeremy DeYoung scored 19, with Scott Essenberg and Tim Heneveld each adding 12 and Scott Heeres five.


John McKaig led Bellaire with 13 points, Scott Goodwin with nine and Brandon





94 FISCAL YEAR
WHEREAS, state law requires the
publication of salaries of all elected township
officials prior to adoption of a new fiscal year
budget, and

whereas, the duties and responsibilities of the Supervisor, Treasurer, Clerk and Trustees are prescribed by state statute, and

WHEREAS, those statutory duties have become more complex and time consuming as the result of state intervention in local government, and

WHEREAS, the time required to perform those statutory duties and other duties necessary for effective management of the affairs of the township has increased substantially, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that these elected officials are deserving of salary increases to compensate for those growing demands, and

WHEREAS, the financial condition of the township will not accommodate any merit increases at this time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the salaries of the Treasurer and Clerk be adjusted to include only the cost of living increase (Consumer Price Index) which was approximately 3% for the 1992 calendar year and that the Supervisor's salary be increased to a level equal to the Treasurer and Clerk with the salaries of the Trustees remaining unchanged, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that effective April 1, 1993 the salary schedule for the elected officials of Central Lake Township be as follows:

Supervisor \$7,000 annually
Treasurer \$7,000 annually
Clerk \$7,000 annually
Trustees \$55.00 for each Board meeting attended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Treasurer be paid an additional \$3,200 annually for summer tax collection through a contractual agreement with the Central Lake and Ellsworth School Districts.

Murriel Derenzy celebrates 97th birthday

As a little girl Murriel lived with her family south of County Road 624 about a quartermile on South Beal Creek Road. With her brothers and sisters, she attended the Echo School in Pleasent Valley.

Murriel was married to William Derenzy in Traverse City July 3, 1914. They were blessed with nine children; Ann (Jeffery), Dora (Edson), Greta (Whiteford), Glenda (Sweet), Garold, Clifford, William, Archie, and Orville. They have 33 grandchildren, 79 great-grandchildren and three great-greatgrandchildren.

Murriel and Bill's first home was at logging camp 21 where son Garold was born. They then moved to Kearney Township on County Road 620, where Ann was born. Murriel tells about carrying water every day from Stafford Crossing up a large hill. When the children were toddlers they almost lost them to a fire that destroyed the home and everything else.

Following the fire, they lived in a log cabin on 160 acres at the top of Hogs-Back Hill in Echo Township. Bill worked in the logging camps and farmed, while Murriel was the mainstay of the family,

growing a garden, making soap, churning butter, baking bread, washing clothes over a washboard. She also worked hard to harvest food and store it for a year and tended the livestock.

The children were bathed in a wash tub in front of the wood cook stove, using rain water that was collected for that and washing clothes. Drinking water had to be carried from the creek for several years before a well was drilled.

The family traveled by foot, horse and sleigh in the winter and horse and buggy or wagon in the summer until they bought their first automobile in 1925. The prized vehicle was a 1916 Model T Ford. Bill taught himself to drive in the barnyard scaring



himself and the kids in the process.

Murriel recalls winters when snow would blow through the chinking and she would stuff pieces of cloth in the cracks to keep out

the snow and cold. She had to keep the breakfast plates warm on the stove or the food would freeze before it was served. In 1928, the family moved across the road into a fine farmhouse.
