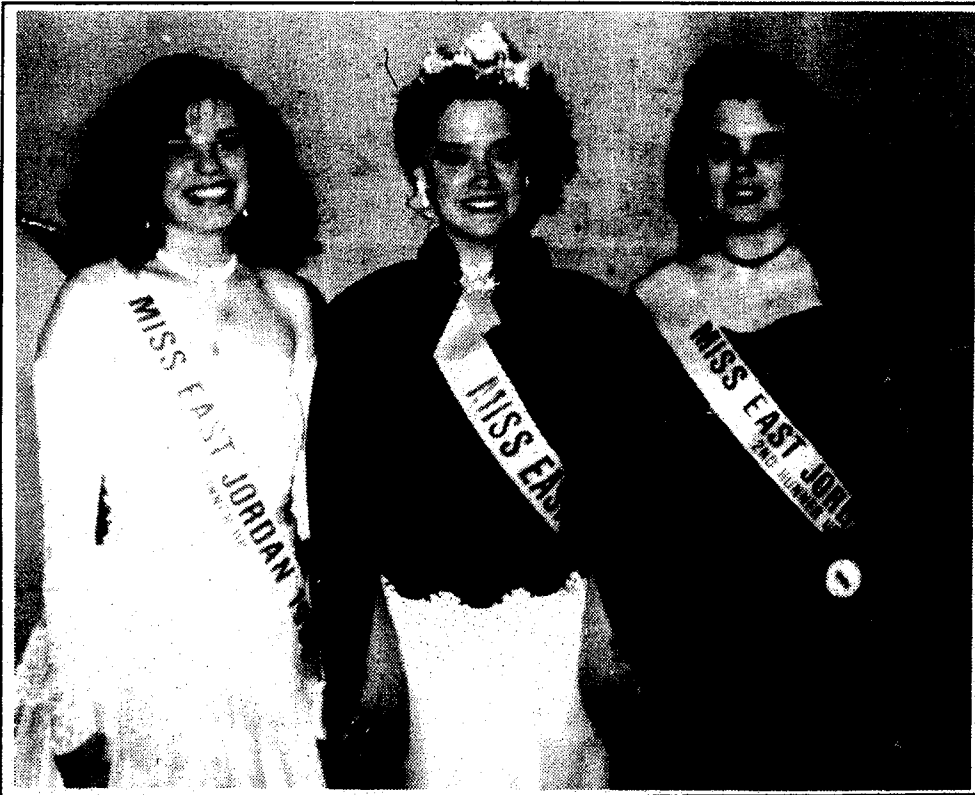

Surrounded by a stunning backdrop and four other lovely ladies, Amy Mickey was named Miss East Jordan 1993.

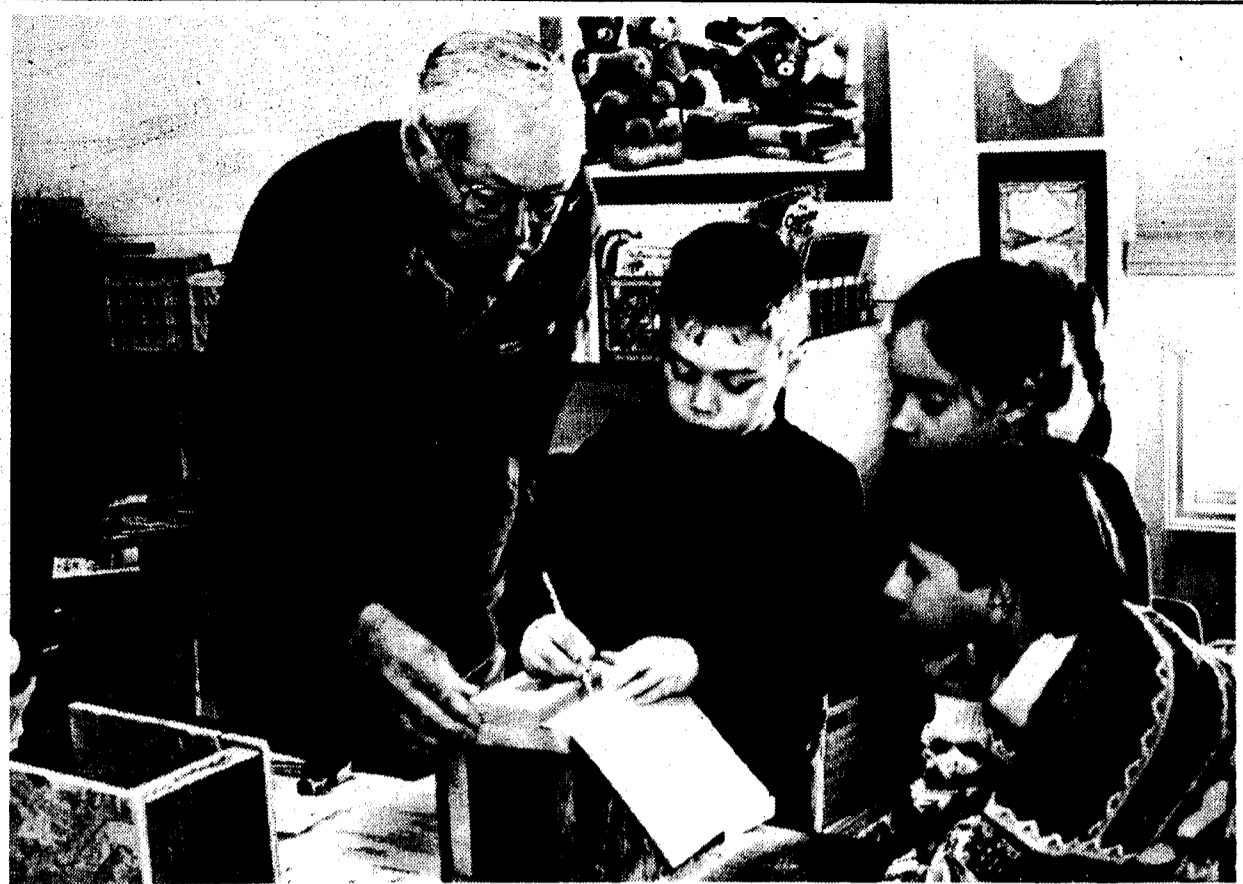

## Working together to bring back the bluebird

The Eastern bluebird, among America's most colorful and cherished birds, has disappeared in many of the areas it once brightened.

But thanks to the efforts of two Central Lake Elementary School teachers, a group of local seniors and dozens of eager third-graders, that unhappy fact is being reversed in this area.

Why? Because construction of specially tailored bird-houses has become an annual project for local school children.

"We've had wonderful success," said teacher and project innovator Nancy Ewald. "The chil-

dren are so excited and proud of building their very own bird house, and the parents have been wonderful about putting them up."

It all started back in 1990, when Ewald attended a DNR workshop titled "Bring Back the Bluebird." Excited by the possibility of getting students involved in the project, she soon made contact with two men who have been instrumental in helping her vision succeed.

"So much credit goes to Ed Pepke and Jerry Simowski," she said. "They got other volunteers, purchased lumber, made special jigs and templates and donated their time to help with the actual building project."

Helping out this year were Bob Rarey, Walt Trendle and John Litwaitis.

This is the third year her students have constructed the bluebird boxes, Ewald said. Kari Groll's third-grade class also participated in the project, which is timed for the return of the migrating birds.

Essential to the box design is a small hole that permits bluebirds but keeps out the starlings that frequently displace them, Ewald noted.

The box also features a removable side, important because "Bluebirds are not very good house-keepers," she said.

"This means that the students' responsibilities don't end with putting up the boxes," Ewald added. "They know they must be cleaned out each fall, or the bluebirds won't come back the next spring."

Her plans for the rough-sawn cedar boxes will be cheerfully shared with interested readers, she said.

April 28, 1955

■ Due to Mrs. William Godshall having undergone surgery, the Torch Crest Grocery and cabins court will not open for business until May 10.

■ Former Central Lake resident Rex Dunlop spent his 65th birthday in Big Rapids Community Hospital. Dunlop lost control of his car a mile north of Big Rapids, while attempting to pass another car, went through a guard rail and ended face up in a creek with his car on top of him. He was saved from being crushed as the car straddled the creek, although the rear fender of the car rested on him. He was treated for severe face cuts and bruises.

■ The April meeting of the Antrim County Farm Bureau board of directors met at the home of Gerrit George Drenth. Ward Cooper explained the Farmers Petroleum Cooperative Program, whereby farmers can have gas and oil delivered direct from refineries to the farm at a very worthwhile savings. Farmers must have supply facilities for a 60-day period.

Art lovers also had an opportunity to view her work during the Jordan River Arts Council exhibition of Native American Works in 1992.

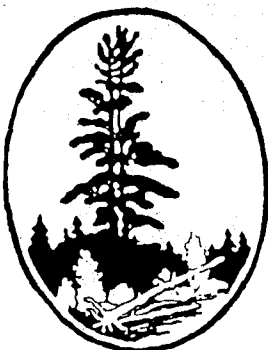
The current exhibition, titled Voices of Mackinac, is open from noon to 4 p.m. daily. The Arts Center is located at 301 Main Street.

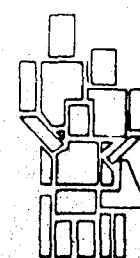

# New business caters to card collectors

Although he's retired from teaching, Ward Cary has never lost his affection for young people.

The way his new Central Lake business is taking off, it's a darn good thing he didn't.

"There's somebody in here every night," he noted from his desk at Cary's Trading Card Shop last week. "I'm really enjoying the opportunity to work with young people again."

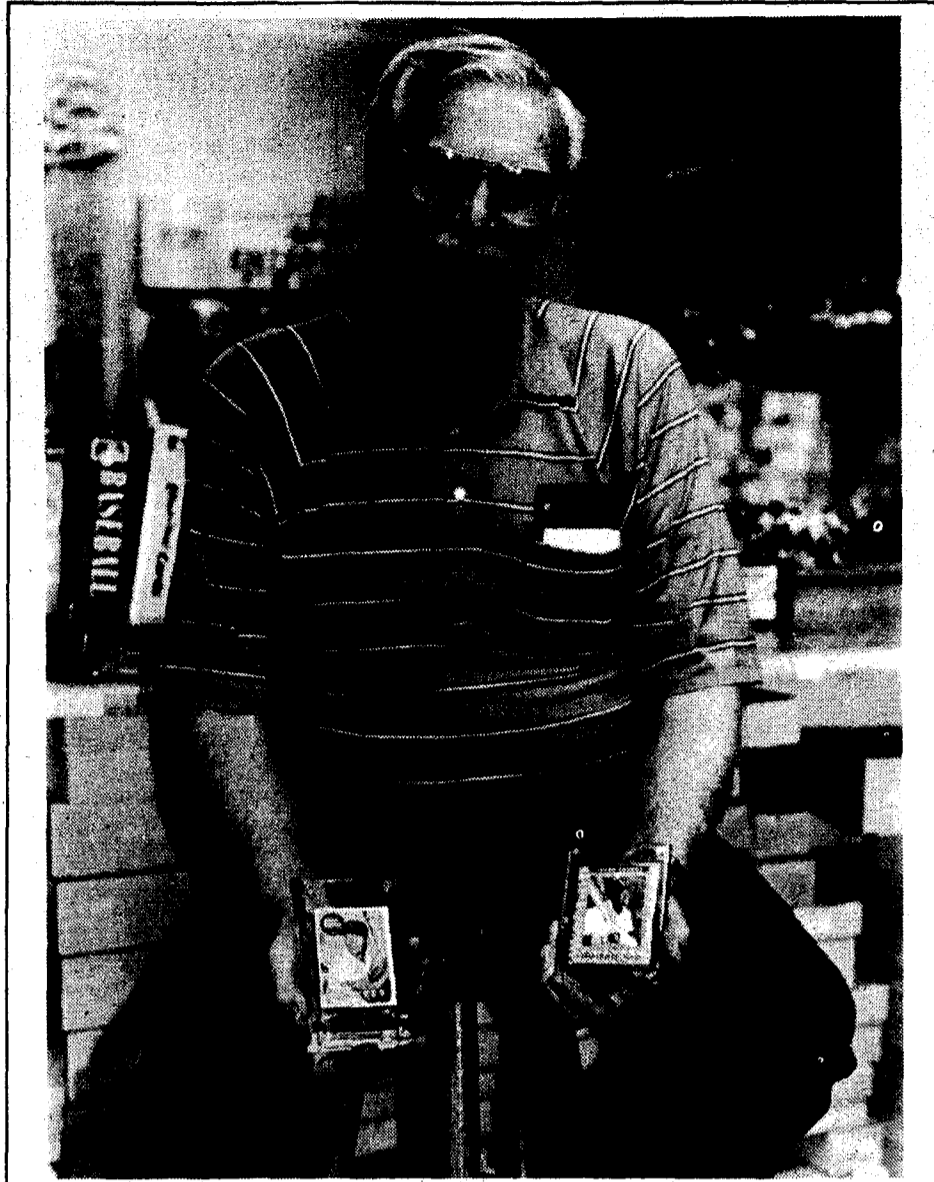
That opportunity was multiplied during Grand Opening weekends on April 3 and 4, and April 10 and 11. About 200 entries were submitted for prizes up to \$110 in value, with Roger Simon, John Kingma Jr., Donovan Eggleston and Nick Corey drawn as winners.

A nine-year Central Lake educator, Cary quit teaching in 1970 to pursue a career in real estate.

Was it a lifelong interest in trading cards that sparked his diversion into a new business venture?

Well, not really. "I never saved a baseball card in my life," he confessed.

It wasn't until a candy supplier suggested that trading cards were the coming thing back in 1989 that Cary became aware of the popular

pastime's potential. Growing knowledge of the fascination of card collecting eventually led to a decision to devote more than a few racks to the hobby, he said.

"Kids show a fantastic interest," Cary stated. "Dads and sons collect together. Moms, sisters and girlfriends either collect for themselves or buy them as gifts. I've already had customers come from East Jordan,

Mancelona - last week, there was a boy in from Milford, Michigan, who was visiting up here."

The outstanding investment value of card collecting became doubly apparent when plans to open Cary's Cards were delayed for over a year. Virtually every card had to be remarked because the value had increased in the intervening months, Cary recalled, "some as much as five to 10 dol-

lars." That potential isn't lost on the young people who make up the bulk of his business, he noted.

"I'll tell you what - they're real little business people. They know what's hot, and they know what they want. They'll bargain and trade with the best

of them. Where else can a kid go nowadays and for as little as a dollar investment have a chance at a card worth hundreds?"

Hundreds? That's right. In fact, Cary himself discovered a \$250 card in a 99-cent box. And even if the cards don't have an immediate value, many skyrocket in price, depending on a host of variables.

"Right now, Shaquille O'Neal, a seven-foot, one-inch, 300-pound rookie, is the hottest thing on the market. Another is Michael Jordan," Cary said.

With his new business already attracting so much interest, Cary said he's fortunate to have the assistance of Central Laker Derick Graczyk.

With summer visitors on the way (many with

youngsters already hooked on card collecting) the owner of the best-equipped card shop between here and Traverse City may need all the help he can get.

# Disputed alley to remain open

The East Jordan City Council will rescind Resolution 109/1993 to vacate alleys in the Mill Street area. The decision came in the midst of contention between involved residents at the April 20 meeting.

Although several alleys are listed in the resolution, only one has been contested. The alley runs east-west and is bounded by Maple, Esterly, Bowen and Mill streets.

The council made the determination because a majority of residents in the area wanted the alley left open.

At the same time, council acknowledged the need to address problems caused by the alley's presence.

Bill and Gladys Archer and daughter Gladys Johnson had requested the closure because of noise and dust. The city will survey the alley with the intent to blacktop, somewhat alleviating the problem.

Johnson was unhappy with the decision. She felt it had been unfair to close the other end of the

alley (in 1985) while leaving the end adjacent to her property open.

The resolution will be redrafted excluding the disputed alley. Council will then readopt the resolution.

### Charter revision process initiated

The City of East Jordan is operating on a charter which, with only a few amendments, was adopted in 1911 when the city was incorporated.

Council adopted a resolution to set the process of revision in motion.

In November, voters will decide if they want the charter revised. If affirmative, a charter commission will be elected on the same ballot. The commission will draft the revision, then present it to voters for a final judgment.

In discussion of the issue, council will not recommend a change in the present form of city government. They agreed that charter commission member are to be paid.

Authorization was given to Beatty and City Clerk Kathy O'Rear for hiring a consultant as needed in handling charter revision efforts.

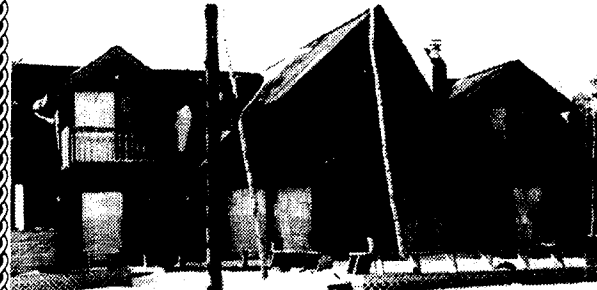

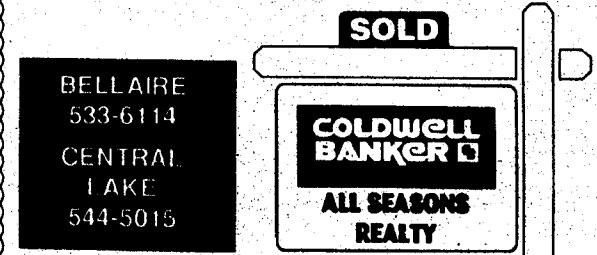
