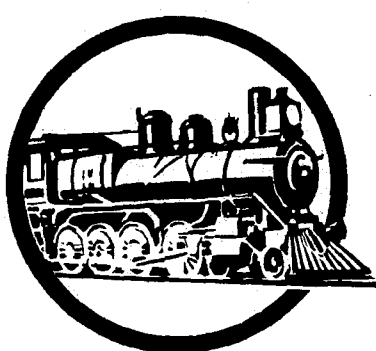

Kitson resigns from East Jordan City Council

"With regrets," the East Jordan City Council accepted the resignation of 2nd Ward Councilman Ralph Kitson. Mayor Russ Peck read Kitson's letter at the Aug. 3 meeting.

Kitson was reportedly upset about the decision to retain William "Butch" Breakey as DPW foreman. At the July 22 hearing held to discuss Breakey's job performance, Kitson voted with four other council members to retain Breakey.

Although he was actually against Breakey continuing as DPW foreman, Kitson wanted to support the DPW committee, whose members were in favor of Breakey's retention.

Kitson has served eight months of a one-year term that ends in November.

The winner of this week's primary election, Jerald Cihak, will fill the vacated post until November, as an appointee of the mayor. November's election will determine whether Cihak retains the seat.

In other business, Tom Breakey, Sr. inquired whether any action has been taken on the city drug policy. Breakey read a letter at the July 6 council meeting expressing his concern about the strict requirements of the policy.

Breakey was informed that the public safety com-

mittee, charged with reviewing the situation, has not met this month because of member vacations.

Sewers will be installed in a platted subdivision on the north side of the city. The area is in the preliminary stages of development. Only one house is actually under construction as yet.

The city sewer fund will pay for initial construction,

with each hook-up being installed at a cost of \$2,300. If the houses aren't built by 1998, an extra \$500 will be added to the charge.

There are presently five houses planned for the plat, but according to city superintendent Bob Johnson, the sewage capacity will be large enough to handle several more.

Portside show attracts the best

With the sunshine sparkling on the waves of Lake Charlevoix the East Jordan area once again enjoyed the activities of the annual Portside Arts Fair last weekend.

Two returning artists were awarded coveted purchase prizes.

This year's \$500 Purchase prize for two-dimensional artwork went to Bruce Holwerda of Hemlock, for his watercolor portrait of the sculptor Rodin.

A full-time illustrator for a communications and advertising firm, Holwerda won honorable mention at Portside last year. East Jordan is one of only three or four shows he does in a year.

A background in metalworking gave him the idea to use features that appear to be metallic, but are actually styrofoam, he said.

The choice for the \$300 Purchase Prize in three-dimensional artwork was a porcelain vessel splashed with swirls of color that are echoed in the swirl of the handles.

The artist, Shannon Sprague of Rockford, is also

a veteran of the portside show.

"I was shocked, but it is really neat and thrilling to be chosen" said Sprague. The award-winning piece was one she had been saving for several years and submitted almost on a whim, she stated.

Both Purchase Prizes will be exhibited at the Cygred Riley Gallery of the Portside Art and Historical Museum at Elm Pointe. Prizes from past shows are also on display at the gallery, open daily through August.

Organizers were pleased with the turn out. "This is the best crowd we've ever had," said committee member Patti Hodge.

The Arts Fair committee plays many roles: advocate and aid for the artists; monitoring the quality of the exhibits; assisting the judge, greeting the public and the media; the list goes on and on for these energetic volunteers.

Of several hundred that apply to the juried show annually, only 100 are chosen. Committee member Anne Dingman said that space will allow no more.

Foundation awards grants

The Charlevoix County Community Foundation has announced grants totaling nearly \$10,000 to seven non-profit organizations in the area. The grants are the first awarded by the Foundation since its beginning nearly a year ago.

Raven Hill Discovery Center, a hands-on science and learning center for children and adults, was awarded \$3,010 for development of exhibits and expansion of the facility. The funds will help Raven Hill qualify for a matching grant from the Frey Foundation.

Habitat for Humanity, an organization that engages volunteers and prospective homeowners in the construction and renovation of homes for low income families, was awarded \$1,500. Funds will be used to help build a home in Charlevoix County.

Big Brothers/Big Sisters, matches volunteers with children who could benefit from a one-to-one friendship with a caring adult. The agency, which is based on Traverse City, was given \$2,000 to help fund a professional caseworker who will serve families in Charlevoix and Emmet counties.

CENTRAL LAKE - Jerry Simowski and three members of the Central Lake Township Library Board told Central Lake School Board members Aug. 9 they need more space.

Noting the present library downtown is very crowded, Simowski asked if any property near the school might be conducive to building a library facility.

Also mentioned were the library board's plans to look for ways to fund a new facility.

School superintendent Lary Blamer, while thanking Simowski and the library board members for attending the meeting, said he and the school board will discuss the matter further.

Bids from Northern Dairy of Kalkaska for milk and from Ovenfresh of Gaylord for bread delivery were accepted by the board.

Lunch prices for students and teachers as well as athletic ticket prices were set at the same rate as last school year.

Blamer was authorized to seek bids to sell one of the school buses.

Council accepts resignation

CENTRAL LAKE - The Central Lake Village Council accepted the resignation of Dennis Richardson at the regular meeting Monday night.

In a letter addressed to the village president, Richardson explained that because he has moved out of the village limits, he is unable to fulfill the remainder of his term of office.

The council then unanimously voted to appoint John Young to fill the vacancy on the village council until the next village election.

Village president Don Seifried explained that the village has received notification from the Antrim County Board of Commissioners that the county has accepted the emergency 911 program. Seifried explained that the village needs to make sure all homes in the village are part of the numbering plan with

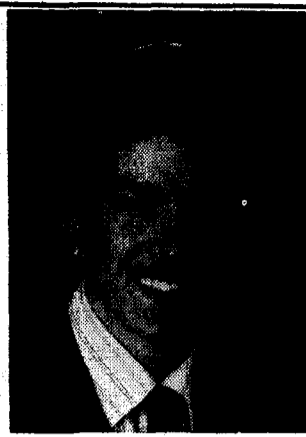
East Jordan grads receive scholarships

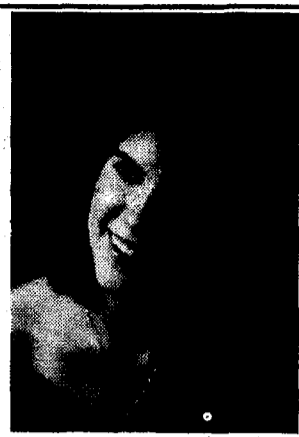

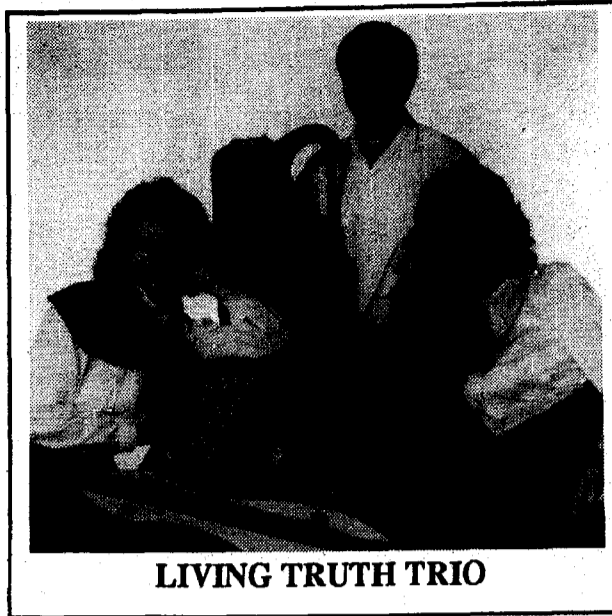
Music trio to perform in Ellsworth

You could walk down the south side of East State Street? Appearing after the present Central Foods, would be the Adventist Church, followed by Cary's Shoe Repair. I remember that cobbler shop and the smell of leather, oil and the sewing machine. I am not sure if the barber shop (Mr. Meyers) was next or some other building before the meat market (Knowles). Then, the home where Mr. and Mrs. D. Lavanway now live, was occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Mathers. They had Pekinese dogs. The dogs always came up to the fence just a barking, with their little flat faces. Behind this house is the jail building, where the bars are still on some windows.

Authority directs ambulances

Most people do not understand how the Medical Control Authority works in a given area, said Charlevoix Area Hospital Emergency Department Supervisor Josie Young, R.N.

Just suppose you were having a heart attack. Have you thought a bout which hospital you would want the ambulance to take you to? Well, most people do have a preference, but, in the end, they may have no say as to where they go.

"Hospital emergency personnel are often put in the position of explaining to patients why they have been brought here. Even though the patient's wishes are always considered and granted, if circumstances permit, the fact is that ambulances are regulated by the state and controlled by the Medical Control Authority," Young explained. "The patient doesn't have anything to say, and neither does the ambulance crew because of the state laws the Medical Control is obligated to follow."

The Charlevoix County Medical Control Authority is located at Charlevoix Area Hospital.

Each county has a designated Medical Control Authority, always a hospital emergency department. The ambulance crew must radio and report on every patient. There are specific actions or procedures for all medical emergencies.

For chest pain the report includes the patient's condition, injuries, plain level (on a scale of 1-10), and health history. Medical Control then decides on the next step and how to proceed. Based on the condition of the patient and the location of the ambulance, the Medical Control Authority directs the ambulance as to what action they should take and where to take the patient.

If the Medical Control Authority decides the patient is critical, state regulations require that the patient be taken to the closest hospital. If the patient requests otherwise, the request may be honored, but only after the ambulance has stopped at the closest hospital and the patient is stabilized.

In addition, it is up to the attending emergency physician and whether or not another hospital is willing to accept the patient. If a patient needs

special care not available at the first hospital, they will be transferred to another hospital for that care.

While Charlevoix Area Hospital is the Medical Control Authority for northern Antrim and Charlevoix counties, Munson Medical Center and Northern Michigan Hospitals serve as the Medical Control Authority for their service areas.

Medical Control Authorities were established about three years ago. Originally they were set up along county lines. However, where there is no hospital in the county, the county may be divided between two or more Authorities.

They require physician leadership and each one must establish protocols, standards and rules of care for ambulance crews.

The Authority is responsible for evaluating ambulance performance, even if the company is privately owned, and they assist in education.

"At Charlevoix Area Hospital, the key is time," Young said. "Where will the patient be treated the fastest in case of a life-threatening problem?"

The laws are established because patients are not in a position to assess their own medical problems in an emergency. This must be done by a professional according to a standard of care for the particular problem.

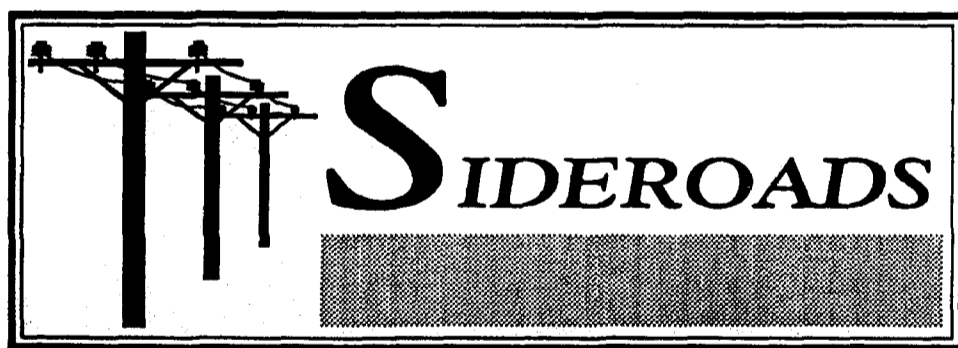
The Medical Control Authority is obligated to follow the laws of the state in order to minimize the amount of time necessary to get the patient to appropriate care.

Health care issues a
priority for agriculture

Legislation to allow the self-employed full deductibility of health premiums on federal income tax returns is high priority of Farm Bureau.

"Such a deduction is the bare minimum of change needed," said Jack Laurie, president of the Michigan Farm Bureau. "A better approach is a tax credit against federal income taxes owed for all individuals equal to 15-25 percent of the premium cost of the health premiums."

"Creation of medical savings accounts that would also qualify for the tax credit would allow individuals to set aside money in anticipation of future health care needs, and to pay for small health care bills directly out-of-pocket," said Laurie. "Individuals could then

choose the right mix of insurance and out-of-pocket payments based on their current and expected future economic needs rather than on tax policy incentives."

Also needed are increased efforts by medical schools to train physicians who will practice in rural areas, economic inducements at state and local levels to encourage doctors to practice in rural areas, restoration of equitable Medicare payments to rural hospitals/physicians and the adoption of telecommunication

technology to better serve rural areas, according to Laurie.

Farm Bureau also supports greater use of non-physician providers such as physicians' assistants, nurse practitioners and midwives to help improve distribution of health care in rural areas.

- (3) Unilateral decisions to purchase furniture, equipment and supplies in excess of established limits with no report of such purchases to the township board which is in violation of Section 15, Purchases as defined in Board Rules of Procedure.

Justification of conduct in Office:

- (1) Mastercard was used with approval of the township board in December, 1992, for attendance of classes. I paid the bill personally after harassment from the treasurer.
- (2) The Board was supplied with information at my disposal whenever requested. Fund balances are the treasurer's responsibility by law. Supplying accurate figures is difficult when the books haven't been balanced since 1990-91, according to the auditor. I was appointed clerk unanimously effective April 1, 1992. The budget was approved in March, 1992, with the auditor still trying to balance the previous clerk's books. He finished in June, 1992. He sent a report of the state of two funds being illegally over budget. He also stated that the computer hasn't the safeguards to prevent accumulating errors. Accurate figures cannot be provided without accurate figures to begin with, which hasn't been possible since the computer program was installed.
- (3) All purchases are approved at regular board meetings by motion, so all purchases were known. I did not go over my budget for 1992-93, nor has the auditor found any funds missing from my accounts.






