



OUR WEATHER

East Jordan schools now at financial risk

As a new school year begins this week in East

"We epitomize the Engler platform and we're the ones getting the shaft." Superintendent Chip Hansen "We epitomize the Engler platform and we're the ones getting the shaft," said Hansen. East Jordan Schools recently received accreditation by the North Central Association.

Jordan, a dark cloud hangs over the district.

The specter is Headlee and the recent tax assessment increases that have put East Jordan out-offormula for the first time. This means the district loses \$600,000 in state aid.

"From our perspective, we can place the blame in Lansing," said district superintendent Chip Hansen. According to Hansen, several factors have led to the disaster.

State aid based on student enrollment was frozen at 1991 levels, causing high-growth districts to lose – for East Jordan, it cost nearly \$200,000.

Secondly, the 1992 tax freeze and subsequent jump in assessments caused a 22.9 percent SEV increase in the district. This average figure was due to the large amount of lakefront property where assessments increased as much as 40 percent.

The Headlee Amendment was designed to limit revenue increases to the rate of inflation, approximately three percent per year. Headlee forces East Jordan's millage, which has remained at 37.5 mills for several years, to be rolled back to 32.2191 mills, more than a five-mill reduction.

As a result of the rollback, East Jordan loses \$500 in state guarantees per student.

Therefore "local millage effort" is less than the established criteria to keep the district in-formula. This Catch-22 results in the \$600,000 loss of state aid.

The state also will penalize out-of-formula districts' "prosperity" by expecting the school system to absorb employee social security payments this year. An override of the Headlee Amendment will be East Jordan's only chance to prevent fiscal collapse. The proposal to waive Headlee will be on the ballot Sept. 13 in a special election.

The intimidating language of the proposal can be confusing and misleading. The legislature requires that the Headlee waiver read as an additional 5+ millage, even though this is not the actual case. This is millage already supported and voted for by the community.

The Headlee override will simply reinstate last year's 37.5 millage with the new assessments.

"We have to get the Headlee override," emphasized Hansen.

He is particularly frustrated by the lack of state support for East Jordan.

The district follows state directives at every turn, embracing outcomes-based education, keeping costs down with teacher salaries significantly below state average, meeting all quality standards and making the effort to cut \$90,000 from this year's budget already.

What will happen to the district if the Headlee override is not approved by voters?

"The board is committed to running the first nine weeks at full steam," said Hansen, in either case. With no override, the district will be forced to approach voters for increased millage in late October.


If that attempt to increase revenues fails, radical cutbacks will begin.

"The list is devastating," said Hansen, "transportation, athletics and much more would have to be considered. The program would be unrecognizable after the cutbacks."

On the positive side, Hansen noted, the crisis will only last for this year. School districts throughout the state are hoping the legislature will come through with a positive change.

In the meantime, Hansen is confident East Jordan voters will support another year of quality education.

"A no vote on election day isn't going to hurt the state, it's going to hurt the kids," Hansen concluded.



Blood drives consolidated

Ellsworth and Central Lake blood drives have been consolidated so all donors will be eligible for all drives occurring in north Antrim County for 1992-1993.

Blood donors from the May 14 drive at Central Lake will be eligible for the North Antrim County Blood Drive Sept. 14 at the Ellsworth Community Building.

Use of blood to save lives increases dramatically during the summer due to the increased summer population. There's too little blood being donated to meet northern Michigan's medical needs to maintain an adequate supply of blood for the community.

The American Red Cross is asking both new and experienced blood donors to volunteer to help others by donating blood at the Ellsworth Community Building on Tuesday from 2 to 6:45 p.m.

Those who are at least 17 years of age, weigh 110 pounds or more and are in good general health may donate every 56 days. Seniors may continue to donate beyond 70 years of age.



Lucy Genevieve (Sanford) Engelhard

Lucy Genevieve Sanford was born June 16, 1899 the oldest of four children, to Eugene and Rachel Sanford of Alanson, Mich., she being the last survivor of her immediate family. She grew up on a large, general farm in the Alanson area. She attended Alanson High School into the 10th grade, when she quit school to go to St. Louis, Missouri for three years' treatment of a birth defect.

On Dec. 21, 1925, Lucy was married to Louis Fredrick Engelhard of HiWood, Minn. Three children were born to this union: Mrs. Raymond T. Jackel, a registered nurse, of San Antonio, Texas; Elder James H. Engelhard of Battle Creek; and Elsie Coit of Rochester, N.Y.

In 1935, the Engelhard family moved to an 80acre farm near Ellsworth. The couple retired from the farm in 1966 and moved to Boyne City, where Louis died in 1971 at the age of 79. Lucy lived alone for 10 years, under the watchful and loving eyes of her brothers and sisters of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, of which she had been a member since her early 20s. In 1981, after recovering from a fractured leg due to a fall, Lucy Engelhard traveled by plane to San Antonio to live with her daughter Doris and family. She passed on, a "Graduation to Glory," on Friday afternoon, July 30, 1993, at the age of 94 years. Survivors include her three children, seven grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren and a host of friends.

Watch for animals while driving



The Department of 29. Natural Resources announced that 165 Michigan residents have been Jon randomly selected to participate in the state's September elk hunts. Fiftyfive licenses will be issued for each of the three elk hunts: Sept. 8-12; som Sept. 15-20; and Sept. 23-

29. Selected from this area was Steven Sloop of East Jordan. His permit allows Sloop to target only antlerless elk.

The successful applicants were computer drawn from 25,128 persons who applied for the September licenses. Cer-

tified letters have been mailed to all successful applicants.

Of the 165 hunters, 123 will be allowed to take only antierless elk, while 42 will have the choice of taking an antiered or antierless elk.

This year's elk hunting area includes parts of Emmet, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Otsego, Montmorency, and Presque Isle counties. The September elk hunts will be held in areas with mostly private land where hunting access has traditionally been difficult to secure during December.

Streets of Laredo By Larry McMurty

Although a sequel to the Pulitzer prize winning Lonesome Dove, the reading of that novel is by no means a prerequisite to the enjoyment of this book.

Capt. Woodrow Call is now a bounty hunter, his reputation and success intact. But Woodrow is an old man and many of his compatriots of the Hat Creek trail drive from Texas to Montana are dead

... Augustus, Newt, Deets, Jake. Call has been hired by the railroad to track and kill a youthful, but cruel and clever Mexican bandit, Joey Garza, who has robbed and murdered dozens of passengers. At the same time, psychopathic, inhuman Mox Mox, whose repugnant trademark is burning his victims alive, is spreading terror into the vast and lonely territory of the Texas Panhandle and northern Mexico.

Call takes with him an incompetent but likable eastern railway accountant and his old corporal from the Texas Rangers, Pea Eye Parker. Pea Eye is now happily married to Lorena, ex-whore of Lonesome Dove, now a school teacher and mother of five.

In Mexico. Call meets Maria, Joey's widowed mother, who s living in a poor village, struggling to care for and protect her retarded son and small, blind daughter. She cannot understand how Joey has become the acme of evil, nor why he had come to detest her and his siblings, but she must try to save him from Call and from himself.

Real life characters such as the killer John Wesly Hardin, Judge Roy Bean and the famous cattleman, Charles Goodnight, are introduced along the journey. This story represents not only the battle between Call and Joey, but between decency and barbarism. Lorena goes into the barren lands in midwinter to bring her husband back to his family. Maria rides along into Crow Town, a filthy village populated by casual killers,

to warn her son. Brave and gallant women, indeed.

The final conflict is full of both irony and hope for the triumph of civilized values. This book is available in your Central Lake Township Library. By Marcia Pepke




big hit, with township Reg Bird said.





"It's vital that motorists be aware of the law concerning school buses because children are not always looking out for themselves," announced Betty J. Mercer, executive director of the Michigan State Police, Office of Highway Safety Planning.

The Pupil Transportation Act of 1990 requires all vehicles to come to a complete stop at least 20 feet from a school bus with overhead red lights flashing. Vehicles may proceed only when the overhead red flashing lights have been turned off.

Upon approaching a school bus with overhead yellow flashing lights, use caution and prepare to stop.

Drivers do not need to stop when a school bus has its overhead red lights flashing on the opposite side of a street divided into two separate roadways.

When only yellow hazard lights are flashing, vehicles may proceed with caution past the bus.

Parents should also be sure their children take extra caution ne. r school buses. At special risk are younger children. In 1990, national statistics showed that 36 percent of bus fatalities involved children aged 5-9.

Safety points for student bus riders to remember include:


